BEST IN THE WEST

Local Juniors Impress At National Championships

Three local boys have just returned from Canberra after representing their state at the School Sport Australia 'National Football Championships'. Bailey Siwek, Harry Jennings & Lachlan Fogarty will all return to their local sides this weekend as they back up their state representative duties during week one of the Western Region Football League finals series.

The three were selected from over six-thousand juniors from across country & metropolitan Victoria, with the honour for Bailey Siwek another accolade in his short but already impressive career. A member of Werribee District's Under 12A side, Siwek first joined the club back in 2008 and in just his third season had already earned both club and league Best & Fairest honours.

Less than four years after first taking to the field, Bailey had already found his way onto the state team, with his Victorian Under-12 side finishing runners-up at the National Championships last month. Bailey was prolific for the side, kicking half a dozen goals for the state & consistently named amongst the best players.

In Victoria's opening game of the Championships the speedy on-baller was third best on ground, his two goals easily helping the side run out winners over Western Australia. Bailey explains that is it was a huge thrill to be playing at such an elite level and that the opening game of the Championships was one of the highlights of his short career.

"Wearing the Big V was a huge honour, and the standard was very high," says Bailey.

"I was confident that when I passed or received the ball, it would always be used effectively."

After also featuring on the scoresheet in Victoria's second match against the ACT, Bailey again found the sticks against the Northern Territory and New South Wales. However it was in the game against the eventual champions South Australia that Bailey truly made his mark on the national stage. Against the best footballers in the country Bailey was named best afield, a memory & experience that the youngster will no doubt build on for years to come.

"Anticipation was high in both teams having reached this final game undefeated and the game was played with the intensity of a Grand Final," Bailey explains.

"As a team, we all had the desire to perform well and contribute to the best of our ability."

"South Australia matched us in ability and size but seemed to outnumber us to the ball. Although it was

disappointing that we lost, it was an honour to be named best on ground for this final game especially amongst a group of such talented footballers selected from the whole of Victoria".

Fellow WRFL representative Harry Jennings was also in the best against South Australia, the Williamstown Junior boasting the rare combination of both height and speed. Also lining up in week one of the WRFL Junior Finals, Harry plays his club football at Williamstown and started back at the club in 2007.

Like most gifted footballers he has also achieved significant success at a state level in other sports, namely the Victorian Junior Life Saving Championships where he won the Under 12 Beach Sprint title. He was also a member of the Williamstown Primary Schools Zone Premiers in 2010.

To cap off a remarkable week for not only the boys but junior football in the west, Lachlan Fogarty matched his league counterparts with a best on ground performance against Western Australia. Making an instant impact on the Championships, the Spotswood footballer also slotted one goal in the sides' rout of Western Australia and had the Championships abuzz with his pace & skill.

His ability to play to his best against the best in the country is something that will no doubt be recognised down the track as his name is thrown around in league & development squad selections. Used to playing up an age-group, Fogarty has dropped back down to his correct age group this year and is one of the front-runners to claim the league Best & Fairest medal.

Similarly to the other boys the 12 year-old is also achieving success away from the football field, having won MVP honours for his local basketball side the Altona Gators for the past two seasons. His basketball will also take him to his second Australian Championships of 2011, when he competes in Brisbane in late September.

For the Western Region Football League to not only produce three footballers on the state team, but three boys that had such an impact on the Championships is a huge coup for football in the west. Western Region Football League CEO, Mr Bob Tregeair, said all three boys should be congratulated on representing both their club & state at the highest level possible.

“To be selected to participate at a National Championships truly puts these three in elite company, and we hope it is just the first of many representative opportunities that come their way,” said Tregeair.

“Over the years the league has had players go on from

this level, through to interleague programs, Western Jets squads and onto AFL lists, and based on their performances there is no reason why these boys can’t follow a similar pathway.”

Bailey explains he is keen on furthering his development as a footballer, and hopes his experiences in the Championships leads to other football opportunities down the track.

“My next goal is to represent Victoria in the Under-15 squad in a few years time, and then one day hopefully play football at the highest level possible,” says Siwek.

And based on his natural skill, performances at the championships & commitment to training, there would be few who would argue that he won’t go on to again be amongst that nation’s best at a senior level one day.

He's fast, is great overhead and can hold his feet in a tackle, and will be the Vikings' talisman as they prepare their tilt at the 2011 flag. Add to that the likes of Jack Marlais & Leslie Butler up forward and you can start to see why many are thinking it is Altona and then daylight in the Under-16 competition.

However third placed St Bernards will be out to prove that there are other teams in the race for 2011 honours, with the Essendon-based side recovering from a slow start to the season to put their name up as genuine flag contenders. Two weekends ago they knocked off second-placed Werribee Districts in a killer game down at the Snake Pit, and if the likes of Tom Saundry, Josh Wallis, Zac O'Halloran, Tom Madden & Sam Woods all fire over the coming

weeks they may well have a tilt at breaking down the Altona juggernaut.

Today's First Semi Final against Hoppers Crossing will no doubt be fought right until the end, with the sides having drawn their previous encounter back in Round Eleven. Both teams would back themselves against Werribee Districts next weekend should the results fall that way, and therefore this afternoon's game will no doubt be a hard-fought slog right through to the final siren.

Albion will enter the 2011 finals series as slight favourites in one of the league's closest competitions which saw the minor premiers finish just two wins above fifth placed St Albans. Coach Ray Allister said he was proud with the side's achievements to date, and is confident that this side is prepared and ready for a tilt at the 2011 flag.

"After a solid preseason and a full list of players, we struck some injuries and some players being absent, which caused some indifferent form early in the season," said Allister.

"Since the half way mark we have regained a full list and slowly built momentum heading into the finals. We are really happy to be playing good footy at the right time of the season with everybody fit and in form. We are really looking forward to the finals and we have no excuses, if we don't perform to our best."

"Some of our top age players including Dylan Sloman, Matty Serafin, James Taylor, Tyler Havard and Jamie Day have had exceptional seasons. They have been complimented by the form of some bottom age boys including Cale Bethune, Mohamad Dibb, Adrian Sachua and Cameron Holdsworth. We have also been happy with the improvement of Josh Michetti, Aron Mifsud, Tim Mahoney and Matty Fisher."

Albion will meet the winner of today's Caroline Springs and Yarraville Seddon Qualifying Final, with both teams dropping just two games for the home & away season. Having comprehensively run over the top of the Eagles back in Round Six, the Lakers will go into today's game as favourites.

The other game will see Deer Park and St Albans go

head-to-head, and despite having won just half a dozen games for the season, both sides have shown glimpses of flag-winning form at times. For the Lions it was a three week period that saw them knock off second placed Caroline Springs, push Albion all the way to the final siren to fall short by nine points & a narrow two point loss against Yarraville. Three excellent results against the top three sides that will give them plenty of confidence going into the finals series. St Albans have gone one better, having knocked off minor premiers Albion earlier in the season, as well as recording a remarkable 70 point thrashing of second-placed Caroline Springs just a month ago. Both the Lions & Saints are teams that at their best are very dangerous, and whichever side progresses through to week two of the finals may well be the dark horse in what will no doubt be an entertaining finals series.

Bulldog Reveals Spotswood Past

Western Bulldogs youngster Easton Wood has revealed he is in fact a former Spotswood player, following a visit to McLean Reserve as part of Toyota's Good For Footy Program.

The speedy defender took Spotswood's under-16 team for a training session last week and revealed he played one game for the Green and Gold – but can't remember if it was in under-10s or under-12s.

Although Wood lived in Camperdown, his father lived in Williamstown and he would travel down every weekend as a youngster to spend time with his dad and run for the Williamstown Little Athletics Club.

On one weekend his dad organised for him to play a game for Spotswood, and as Wood recalls it, the side lost by about 100 points.

Wood's journey from oft-overlooked junior to AFL footballer makes him an ideal role model for young and impressionable footballers who are deciding if they want to make the sacrifices necessary to play sport at their maximum level.

The 21-year-old Altona resident spoke to the Spotswood teens about his failure to make TAC Cup side Geelong Falcons' list, and how the Bulldogs picked him up after being impressed with his performances for school side Geelong Grammar.

"I was under the impression I was never going to play AFL, but I continued playing footy because I really enjoyed it, so that's the message – if you keep with it and you enjoy it, you play good footy."

Wood knows all about persistence. He's had to overcome a string of injuries in his four years at the Western Bulldogs, and is only just starting to play consistent footy.

Having recovered from snapping his ankle in round one and not missing a game since round nine, Wood is now being talked about like Callan



Ward was two years ago – as someone with loads of promise, a footballer with the goods to become one of the Bulldogs' most important players.

"My body's just starting to get a lot better. I started to struggle with my ankle earlier in the year and when I came back from that I felt like I had a new ankle, I had to learn how to play within its capabilities and certainly just started to get used to it," Wood said. "It's good just to play a few consistent games."

The Bulldogs' back-line woes have been well-documented this season, but Wood has been a beacon of consistency.

"It's been really difficult, we've had massive changes in personnel with blokes being injured, being in and out. It's hard to gel as a group with that, because the back line really is a team within a team," he said.

"Probably the last six or seven weeks we've had a much more consistent group."

Of his side's failure to meet expectations this season, Wood said no one's looking for excuses.

"A lot of time when things haven't been going well we've really concentrated on what we're doing wrong, there's not been finger pointing or a witch-hunt."

McKenzie Earns Rising Star Nomination

Former Williamstown Junior Trent McKenzie has earned the NAB AFL Rising Star nomination for Round 17, for his efforts in the Suns' win over Richmond last month.

McKenzie had 21 touches in a polished display, and is now one of four Gold Coast players in the running for the award.

Prior to his nomination the 19-year-old was already getting plaudits from the greater media for his perfectly-executed drop punt. His kicking has been widely praised throughout the football community, and some experts have already dubbed him the best kick in the game.

The 19-year-old is well aware his disposal by foot is his most valuable asset, but he's determined to further round out his game.

"I suppose it has come naturally. It has been one of my strengths in my junior career. I had to work on it as well, a lot of practice goes into my kicking," McKenzie told reporters last week. "I'm still working on my aerobic capacity, just running out games. I'm improving my fitness every week."

A modest footballer at the best of times, McKenzie said he was happy with his own performance but hadn't expected any extra accolades from the game.

"It wasn't my best game but it wasn't my worst game. I'm just happy with the win," he said.

"It's been good to get the opportunity, and to play 13 or 14 games of AFL is great. I'm happy where I am at the moment."

McKenzie is the second WRFL junior to be nominated for the NAB Rising Star award this year following former Flemington Juniors and now Port Adelaide player Jasper Pittard being awarded a nomination back in Round Four.

McKenzie played Under-16's & Under-18's at Williamstown Juniors before playing for the Western Jets and being drafted on to the Gold Coast Suns list as a 17-year-old.

In what has been a successful week for the Williamstown Juniors, another former protégé



in Ben Davies was last week awarded Life Membership at the Williamstown Football Club.

Playing his 119th game for the club last weekend, Davies also played 21 games for Werribee in 2008 while rookie listed with North Melbourne.

Davies has also represented Williamstown twice this year in the Foxtel Cup and this week will be his 100th senior game in the Williamstown colours which automatically qualifies him as a Life Member.

Davies played his junior football in the WRFL with the Williamstown Juniors before graduating to the Western Jets where he won the Barry Round Medal as Best & Fairest in 2004. Davies was rookie drafted at Pick Four in 2005 by the Collingwood Football Club before being upgraded onto their senior list at the end of the 2005 season.





The newly names Saltwater Reserve will border the new Saltwater Coast housing estate, and will provide the open space & facilities required for the area's young population.




