COMMUNITY FOOTBALL

From The CEO

With junior finals now under way and the senior finals series almost upon us, it is a good time to recognise the enormous contribution made to the community fabric of the Western Region by WRFL football clubs, their members and supporters.

More than 20,000 players, officials and supporters attend every weekend at 110 home & away games. That adds up to well over 300,000 attendances across the home & away season alone. A further 25,000 plus attendances are expected over the combined junior and senior final series. Since our new website was launched in April this year, almost 58,000 "absolute unique visitors" have recorded 570,000 page views across the site.

The WRFL and its clubs contribute between \$5 million and \$ 10 million each year to the economic activity of Melbourne's west, not to mention the massive contributions to social cohesion and identity.

Unlike many other community football leagues, WRFL clubs do not charge admission fees to their home & away games. Our clubs pay their way through fund-raising, sponsorship and member fees. However, with direct costs of venue hire, security, umpires, awards etc totalling more than \$80,000 incurred across the junior and senior finals, the modest admission fees charged for entry to finals games are essential to meet those costs.

All admission fees raised from the finals series are directed to the payment of costs; and to reducing fees that would otherwise be charged to clubs by the League. We thank our loyal supporters for their involvement in

their respective clubs, and for their individual contributions through admission fees.

Community spirit and activity extends far wider than the games of football. Gatekeepers at all WRFL finals are unpaid volunteers who give their time and effort to raise funds for local service and sporting clubs. Gatekeepers this year include volunteers from Altona North Cricket Club, West Footscray and Hoppers Crossing Rotary Clubs, North Sunshine Football Club and Old Westbourne Football Club. Patrons are asked to extend cooperation and understanding to these volunteers who perform vital roles without personal reward.

Finals venue host clubs also perform essential catering and ground management roles, again through the unpaid efforts of volunteers. Our thanks to Old Westbourne, Laverton Magpies, Sunshine Heights, Altona and Yarraville Seddon Eagles Football Clubs for their efforts in hosting at various venues for the 2011 finals series.

Congratulation to all WRFL clubs, not only for a successful season of football in 2011 but also for the wider contributions to community development in the West. While we will honour the premiership teams and individual award winners with trophies and pennants, the contributions of every individual should be recognised and applauded.

PADDY'S PROFILES

Pele Manivong (Altona Juniors)

Pele Manivong grew up playing many sports but struggled to find one he was good at. He tried many and didn't enjoy any, until he started to play Auskick at the age of eight. From there he was hooked and his love of the game quickly evolved.

A current member of the Altona Vikings Under-16A side, Manivong recalls those early days as some of his favourite seasons as a footballer.

"Those first few years I had some really good times," Manivong explains.

"Like so many others my age I loved to kick goals, and I remember this one day in particular I kicked sixteen goals playing full-back and the coach thought I was a little hero so he gave me a challenge and put me on a really tight angle on the boundary line."

"I remember his exact words 'only champions can kick these goals'. Funnily enough I used to practice snap goals in my hallway everyday and when I put it right through the middle he didn't know where to look!"

Over the past few seasons Manivong has evolved from a good player to a great player and it was around Under-11 level where he started to emerge as one of the league's premier junior players.

"I wouldn't say I've always been a very strong player, but I started to develop at Under-11's when I won my first WRFL Best & Fairest Award," says Manivong.



From there Manivong has achieved many club & league accolades, and in 2009 was part of Altona's Under-14A Premiership side. It was his first flag, and after many had written-off his beloved Vikings they ended up sneaking home in the decider by a solitary point.

On top of his club successes is his three WRFL Best & Fairest Awards, and yet again this season Manivong has lit up the Under-16A competition. Living up to the reputation he has forged over the past six years, Manivong has no doubt secured votes in nearly all of the Vikings' matches, leading his side through an undefeated home & away season in the league's premier junior competition. And this year, like his early days, he also has no hesitation slotting goals from any angle! Manivong is both a humble and hardworking footballer, and explains that his family has been the main contributor to his success on the football field.

"My family has given me so much support in my life, in particular my parents for all the encouragement and sacrifices they've made driving me throughout the state sometimes at six in the morning," says Manivong.

"I really owe them so much. Especially my father who has given up so much time to go down to the local park over the years and help develop my strengths and work on my weaknesses. Sometimes we would spend hours on end doing the same drill. I used to hate it but as I got older I look back and love everything he did for me. He is a really great father and it shows that all he wants me to do is succeed."

In the next few weeks Manivong aims to guide his Vikings to another Premiership, and then aims to progress through the ranks to eventually play in the AFL. And based on his form, training ethic and his natural ability – there is little doubt Manivong's already well on his way to making it at the highest level possible.

NATIONAL SUCCESS

Pele Manivong Makes His Mark

He's got a name made for football greatness. Possibly not with an oval shaped ball, but young Pele Manivong has long been aware that his given name resonates worldwide with footballing excellence. However rather than living in the shadow of his namesake, the Altona Juniors youngster is quickly starting to forge his own name in the football world, and following his selection on the Victorian side at the National Championships last month, the fifteen year-old may well also become a household name in the not to distant future.

One of five Maribyrnong Secondary College students to make the School Sport Victoria Metropolitan Football Squad, Manivong travelled to Canberra a fortnight ago to represent Victoria in the Under-15 competition. The Championships has been a great career launching pad for some of the AFL's best players such as Chris Judd, Luke Ball and Jobe Watson, and yet again a number of potential draftees were in action in the nation's capital.

All the successful players were originally nominated by their schools in April, and after a series of tryouts a preliminary squad of sixty was released before being culled to twenty-five over a series of practice games. The Championships involved state teams from all over Australia competing against each other in a round-robin format, while providing players the opportunity to showcase their abilities in front of AFL talent scouts.

Manivong contributes part of his selection on the team to his tutelage in the Maribyrnong Secondary College accelerated sports program, and explains that the school's elite AFL program has played a major part in his development as a footballer.

"My involvement with the Maribyrnong College program has assisted with my football in so many ways," Manivong explains.

"It has given me the skills that I've always wanted to develop, and the classes that we have there are highly rated in developing not only our physical side of the game but our mental state as well. Even the little things like thinking about what your thought process when taking a shot for goal, helps you so much on the field."

"I'll always be grateful to Maribyrnong for what they've done for me and I advise any kid who's willing to go that step further and wants to make it to the highest level of footy should go there."

The involvement of some elite current & former players at the school has also guided the youngster on his quest to play football at the highest level possible, and Manivong credits Mitch Hahn, Leon Harris, Andrew Komp & Brad Johnson as key mentors in his footballing journey.



As well as getting the opportunity to put himself on display to AFL talent scouts at the recently completed Championships, his participation has also helped Manivong develop as a footballer through invaluable gametime playing on the best junior footballers in the land.

"Playing at this high level of football has given me the opportunity to play with future draft prospects, and I absorbed everything I could during my time in Canberra," Manivong explains.

Now back in Melbourne, Manivong is back at training and is even more motivated to try to make it all the way to the top.

"Now that I'm back from the Championships I'm back doing the thing in my life which I love the most, which is playing football," says Manivong.

"I know it's going to be a long road but I'm prepared for every challenge along this exciting journey. I'm sure this experience will teach me a lot of what I have to be prepared for and will have to set some more goals to achieve my dream."

Glenorden's only finals side will start their campaign this weekend in one of the closest divisions across the junior finals series. Despite finishing two games clear on top the Hawks will definitely be given a good run today from a Vikings side that upset the second-placed Spotswood in last week's qualifying final.

Altona coach Noel Menadue, said it was a close contest where both sides played an attacking fast moving style of game.

"The game was played in a very good spirit with Jake Febey & Connor Scott prominent up forward for the Vikings," said Menadue."

"Jye Comeadow had a significant influence in attack and the Altona on-ballers gave the forwards plenty of opportunities. The Spotswood on-ballers were extremely dangerous out of the centre square kicking the ball long to their big marking forwards."

"Both sides improved defensively with man on man contested football after half time with Ben Fisher playing a superb quarter of football. Andrew Aquillina and Tyler Padgett got on top across the half back line repelling Spotswood and starting a number of attacking moves."

"Despite the margin blowing out to over 30 points, this certainly wasn't a reflection of the overall game which had been hard fought all day. A credit to both sides for the brand of football played."

Spotswood now face Flemington Juniors who kept their season alive with a 25 point win over Hoppers Crossing.

Flemington coach Greg Sutton said it was another outstanding team performance by Flemington, who had now won their last eleven games in a row.

"The colts were off to great start, however not making

GIRLS COMPETITION KICKS-OFF

Junior Girls Enjoying Inaugural Season

The Western Region Football League's Under-12 Girls Competition is up and running, with over fifty juniors currently taking part in the league's first-ever 'girls only' competition.

Two rounds into a six round season, the league has four teams now in action with players representing Wyndhamvale, Altona Juniors, Deer Park & Melbourne University. 

RESPONSIBILITIES IN JUNIOR FOOTBALL

Paul Roos faces an investigation from AFL NSW after he ran onto the field as the coach of his son's junior football team to assist a young player who suffered a knock. The outcome of that hearing is for AFL NSW to decide so I don't want to delve deeper into that particular incident or even the fact Roos was involved. I am sure the investigation will be thorough and the outcome will be what it will be.

Taking aside Roos, if you can, given his profile, his experience as a coach and the calibre of person he is, the incident raises many issues for junior sport.

I have been involved in junior football continuously for over 10 years through both my son's playing and have acted in nearly every role there is, because that's what parents do at junior matches, they coach, team manage, act as the trainer, do the goal umpiring, escort umpires, etc. Without the parents involvement the game at junior level doesn't function.

Parental support comes in many forms, some parents are fully engaged and others are more passive, most are prone to yell encouragement a minority to yell at the umpires. The right of any parent to attend and be involved in their child's sporting pursuits is without question, but they also have an obligation to behave appropriately.

Unfortunately sometimes bad incidents happen in sport, if they do and they are deliberate acts of violence, then they can never be condoned and the perpetrators must be held accountable.

But there are rules in place which govern games and they must be adhered to otherwise you have chaos. Umpires are there to make decisions about whether it is a free kick or not, to report players or to send players off the field if there is a send off rule and they feel it is necessary. They have a huge responsibility and they are often one out. They should never be held accountable for the bad behaviour of players, coaches or spectators. In fact they should be supported in their role, because ultimately they can influence the tone of a match by the way in which they control it.

As much as it upsets a parent, whatever their role, when they see something on the field they don't like or see as being outside the rules, they must accept there are ways in which the game needs to control that.

As a parent I fully understand the need to protect your child and comfort them if they have been hurt, it is a natural action, but for the sake of the game, no matter how hard it may be at times, the rules need to be followed otherwise there is every chance of a situation escalating.

Of course there may be exceptional circumstances and a coach can decide that the safety of his players, who is entrusted to care for, need to be protected and the only option they have is to call the game off, but that sort of decision needs to be made in the best possible manner.

I am not saying junior football does not have issues with on-field violence or poor spectator behaviour, but I must defend junior football through personal experience. In my time I could count on one hand the times I have been disappointed in the behaviour of a coach, players or spectators and on one occasion when I was, I took the official channel to voice my concerns and the outcome was exactly how I had hoped.

My personal view is that the coach is the person who has the most influence on the tone and behaviour of the match. The players will play and behave in the way in which he instructs and rewards, consequentially parents are more likely to follow the coach's lead. That is why coaches are incredibly important at all levels, but never more so than in junior football and that is why they have an enormous responsibility to the game and their players. It is also why coach education is essential.

In this modern age where media surrounding AFL football is at an all-time high, junior coaches



and their players watch a lot of AFL football and both at times try to emulate what they see at that level. Generally they follow the good aspects of professional sport, but sometimes they copy those facets of professional we don't want them to.

For junior coaches there are inappropriate aspects they can pick up from the AFL such as applying a tag, instructing players to be over physical when they tackle or to attempt to apply a forward press. Coaches need to coach age appropriately.

Sometimes young players see their AFL heroes bumping and pushing their opponent off the ball or tackling excessively hard and driving opponents into the ground or sling tackling. You could argue AFL football doesn't need this, but junior football definitely doesn't.

The subsequent discussion that has flowed from the

incident involving Roos became an excuse for some to start labelling junior football around the country as violent and rife with poor spectator behaviour.

That is simply unfair and an injustice to all the great people who administer those competitions and to all the wonderful parents who are involved in their child's sporting endeavour. They should be applauded for what they do for the game and not grouped with the small minority who do the wrong thing.

It is also an injustice to the thousands upon thousands of young footballers who play the game every weekend in the right spirit.




