IT'S OUR GAME

Umpiring Is Everyone's Business

“What responsibility do we all have toward generating a positive match-day environment for all our participants; that is, players, coaches, team officials, umpires, parents and spectators?”

It is the coach who sets the tone for the environment on game day, whether positive or negative. The coach needs to be aware of his or her attitude and approach, especially in junior football. They must set an example that is required as part of their accreditation and code of conduct, regardless of circumstances.

So what is success? This is the important question. Your answer will influence your coaching, how you treat your players and how you conduct yourself. Winning and beating the opposition as the key to success is competitive thinking. By defining success as winning, you are placing your self-worth on the line each match. Achievement thinkers hold that whilst winning is a desirable outcome, it is not the only measure of success. They are gracious in defeat and victory because their self-respect is not on the line. They control what they can and are not frustrated by factors outside their control. They are far less likely to blame umpires or other factors for a defeat.

In short, the junior coach's code of conduct requires familiarisation with and abiding by the Laws of Australian Football, teaching players that rules of the game are mutual agreements, which no player should break, and that the players involved play for fun and enjoyment. This pertains to umpires also, and that winning is only part of it. It emphasises the importance of the learning and development of skills and positive attitudes, the development of team respect for the

ability of opponents and judgment of umpires and opposing coaches. When the coach's code of conduct is adhered to, the match-day environment is an enjoyable one. However, coaches will often get caught between the importance of processes and fun, and the desire to win.

The player's code of conduct promotes never arguing with an official or umpire. Regarding the parents and spectators of community football, if you disagree with an official or umpire, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning the umpire's judgment and honesty in public. The umpires give their time and effort for your involvement.

As the region grows, and participation rates in football increase, umpiring needs also grow. The difference between the number of umpires required and the number of umpires available is growing exponentially. In response the WRFL has established three umpiring academies within our region – at Mackillop College, Maribyrnong Sports College & at Caroline Springs. Despite currently boasting more than 250 umpires in our ranks, retention is the key, and for this to happen we all need to continue to support those who form an essential part of our game. Our great game wouldn't exist if we didn't have those willing to run around on a weekend officiating junior & senior fixtures, and hence umpiring is truly everyone's business.

THE FINAL CURTAIN

Juniors Prepare For Blockbuster Final

Six of the Western Region Football League's premier junior competitions culminate this weekend, with five 'A-Grade' Grand Finals from Under 16's to Under-12's taking place. For the boys in the Under-16A decider it will be the swansong of their junior careers, as some hang up the boots and the others move onto under-18 teams & competitions.

Especially for the boys down at the Snakepit it will be the last WRFL outing for many of the St Bernards boys and the current crop of players is almost on par with that now famous Under-16 batch back in 2008.

The then Western Regional Football League Under-16 premiers spawned four now AFL players – Tom Liberatore (Western Bulldogs), Mitch Wallis (Western Bulldogs), Luke Mitchell (Carlton) & Jordan Schroder (Geelong).

The group of players running around this Sunday share just as much talent, with the likes of Tom Madden, Sam Woods, Josh Wallis, Will Consadine & Tom Saundry all players that could go onto bigger things.

Add to that the size of players like Michael Caven & Benny Nathan, and the run of Tom Delzoppo, and it's understandable why this is potentially the best crop of juniors the club has seen since that 2008 team.

Standing in their way however will be another side littered with talent, a side that is so strong across the board that no one has managed to knock them off this year. The Vikings have been unstoppable this season, led by their two key playmakers Mitch Norton & Pele Manivong. Both continue to get better as the season progresses, and TAC Cup football is surely a certainty for both in the coming year.

However the boys at Altona will be all too familiar with stories of undefeated teams being overthrown in the Grand Final, themselves having done it to Werribee Districts in 2009 to claim the Under-14 premiership. On that day the Vikings got home by the smallest margin, and while they physically will have the edge this Sunday – mentally they will need to be at their best.

AFL legend Wayne Carey spoke about that very fact on Tuesday night when he dropped in to visit the side at training, and as well as speaking about his



time playing at an elite level. The King also recalled a number of his favourite footballing memories which to the surprise of many dated back to his junior days.

Down at the Snake Pit it was St Bernard's Old Boys Senior Captain Danny Byrne that spoke to the side, recalling the year his side overthrew Old Xaverians for the premiership.

"He spoke about how back in 2002 Old Xaverians had been the best side in the competition, had remained undefeated for the whole season, yet St Bernards still got up in the Grand Final by 31 points," said current Under-16 player Ben Nathan.

"It is the same scenario as Altona this weekend. They haven't lost all season so they'll be feeling the pressure while we really have nothing to lose."

Sam Woods - St Bernard's (U16A)

SAM WOODS is one of the most talented players on the St Bernard's under-sixteen list. He is a gifted footballer with a hopeful and bright future ahead in the game. Growing up and playing under 10's & under 12's at Altona Juniors, a move of the family home brought Woods to the Maribyrnong area and he is now in his fourth year with the Essendon-based side.

Woods is not only a good footballer; he excels in all areas on and off the field. He is smart in the classroom and smart on the field, using his intelligence on a Sunday afternoon down at the Snake Pit to create play and setup advanced structures. Teammates are even known to refer to him as the Joel Selwood of St Bernard's.

Woods was even skilled enough to be selected in the under 15's squad at the Western Jets, playing as a centre. Always the professional, Woods lined up on many of his teammates wearing Cannons colours and did not disappoint.

Winning a Best & Fairest award at St Bernard's last year, Woods has shown supporters of the club, scouts and his teammates that he is a reliable and successful player to give the ball to in a game. Personally I have also had the privilege in playing with Sam on many occasions at St Bernard's. I have seen him play his good games, his great games and his excellent games. Sam never has a bad day and if he creates a mistake, he is quick to make up for it with a great goal or play. Woods is an excellent sportsman on the field and a even better off the field.

Some say his greatest football moment was his hanger in the under-eleven Grand Final while he was playing for Altona Juniors. The



final was against his current team St Bernard's and he took it over Michael Di Paolo, one of his current-day friends. However Woods thinks his greatest moment was beating the powerhouse Werribee Juniors right on the siren to successfully put St Bernard's into the finals by percentage last year. Woods himself having a big role in that win.

"That win made all the effort last season worthwhile," said Woods.

Woods is a player that will have a bright future in the game. If the recent trend of AFL clubs drafting from the Snake Pit continues in the future, Woods might have a long and distinguished elite footballing career ahead of him if he chooses to pursue the game further.

Mitch Norton - Altona (U16A)

MITCHELL NORTON is one of those footballers that everyone looks up to. On and off the field he is a natural born leader – and his advice, motivation & leadership has a distinct impact on everyone he takes to the field with. His ball skills are amongst the best in the league. He is both dominant overhead and around the packs, has a powerful kick to match and really can dominate when playing in any part of the field.

Norton has been playing since under-nines, this being his seventh season and just over a week ago he also completed a short stint playing in the under-fifteens Western Jets side. He had been selected as a forward and played commendably throughout all his matches. When I personally watch Mitch play, I see confidence and belief and that's how he takes those amazing marks, each & every time. Well that, and his superb kicking accuracy.

Another factor in his success is his ability to gather great speed in very short distances. Playing as a permanent half-forward last year, he blitzed the opposition. I have had two seasons competing against Norton and I love competing against him. There is nothing more worrying than attempting to tag the big man and realizing he's having one of those days where he is just unstoppable. The quarters where I've been stuck running with him, all over the park, have been some of the longest twenty minutes of my life. He runs you to every corner of the ground, and then, when you're totally exhausted, you realize that he's only just warming up.

When my boys lost the Grand Final to Norton's Altona last year it was heart-breaking for me, but at the same time I watched on in



amazement as Norton just switched it up a gear in the biggest fixture of the season. He once again showed why he's got plenty of potential to do well out of our game, either through the TAC Cup program or through the higher grades of club football.

His name is one to remember and one that already gets referred to with plenty of admiration. No doubt because of his calibre as a player, but also in part because of his humility. The fact that he is an opponent of mine, yet someone who I hold a great respect for, shows that he's a true ambassador of the game & his club, and is someone who all around the league is acknowledged & appreciated as being a class above the rest.

The Western Region Football League's premier junior competition culminates this weekend as two staunch rivals battle it out for the Under-16 crown. While Altona cruised through to the Grand Final a week earlier, St Bernards caused a semi-upset last weekend against Werribee Districts. League reporter Patrick Comerford took in all the action of last weekend's preliminary final.

"The battle at Westbourne Grammar on the weekend brought together two rivals who have battled it out for years to either make finals or Grand Finals," said Comerford.

"The sides fought out four tough quarters for a chance to de-throne powerhouse Altona next weekend, and while St Bernard's were missing their heart and soul this week (captain Tom Saundry was out with concussion), he still managed to rev the boys up before the game."

"The first quarter saw both teams come out fighting, with brave contests in all parts of the ground. A low scoring quarter ensued as both teams were hesitant to give up space or possession. A temporarily lapse by St Bernard's in the second quarter gave Werribee the ascendancy – although they failed to kick straight and were still just a goal up at the main change."





North Footscray Kicks Goals With FIDA Team

Aussie Rules is a game which is accepting of everyone, no matter where you are from, or how good you may be at it.

People from all over Australia as far as the Tiwi Islands to Tasmania, men, women and children of all ages and even those who travel from overseas are welcome to play our game.

Yet football has also reached out to some other people who have a passion for the sport; those of the North Footscray Football Club's FIDA team.

The Football Integration Development Association (FIDA) was originally established in 1989 by the Boroondara City Council in conjunction with the Hawthorn Football Club to provide a skills clinic to those with an intellectual disability.

With growing interest in the clinics, the AFL Foundation provided a grant to the program and by 1991; FIDA was created and today is currently run by General Manager Peter Ryan.

Since its humble beginnings, FIDA now has over 400 players involved in the program across Victoria including teams from Gippsland, Broadmeadows, Templestowe, Cranbourne, Lara, North Ballarat, Albury/Wodonga, and Ringwood with Rupertswood planning to join in the near future.

FIDA's main aim is to provide access to football for anyone in Victoria with an intellectual

disability by providing a regular, competitive fixture of Australian Rules Football. The rules are quite similar to the traditional game; however FIDA has only 14 players on the field at one time as well as some other modifications to make it safer for the players.

The North Footscray Football Club has been involved with FIDA for the past three years after rescuing the Maryibronong Bulldogs FIDA team who were without a home base and no one to care for them.

Administrator for the NFFC, Raeleene Eldridge said that she thought the club would be sceptical of hosting a FIDA team, but was taken aback by how supportive the club's members were.

"Everyone loves having them as part of our club and it has only been positive," says Eldridge.

The North Footscray Devils FIDA team is made up of 12 players and they train every Thursday night before the seniors. The matches are played every second Sunday, with the Grand Final held in August.

"It is a fantastic way for the community to see that football is for everyone. It doesn't matter what type of diversity or what challenges you may have, you can play the game that you love and enjoy it."


