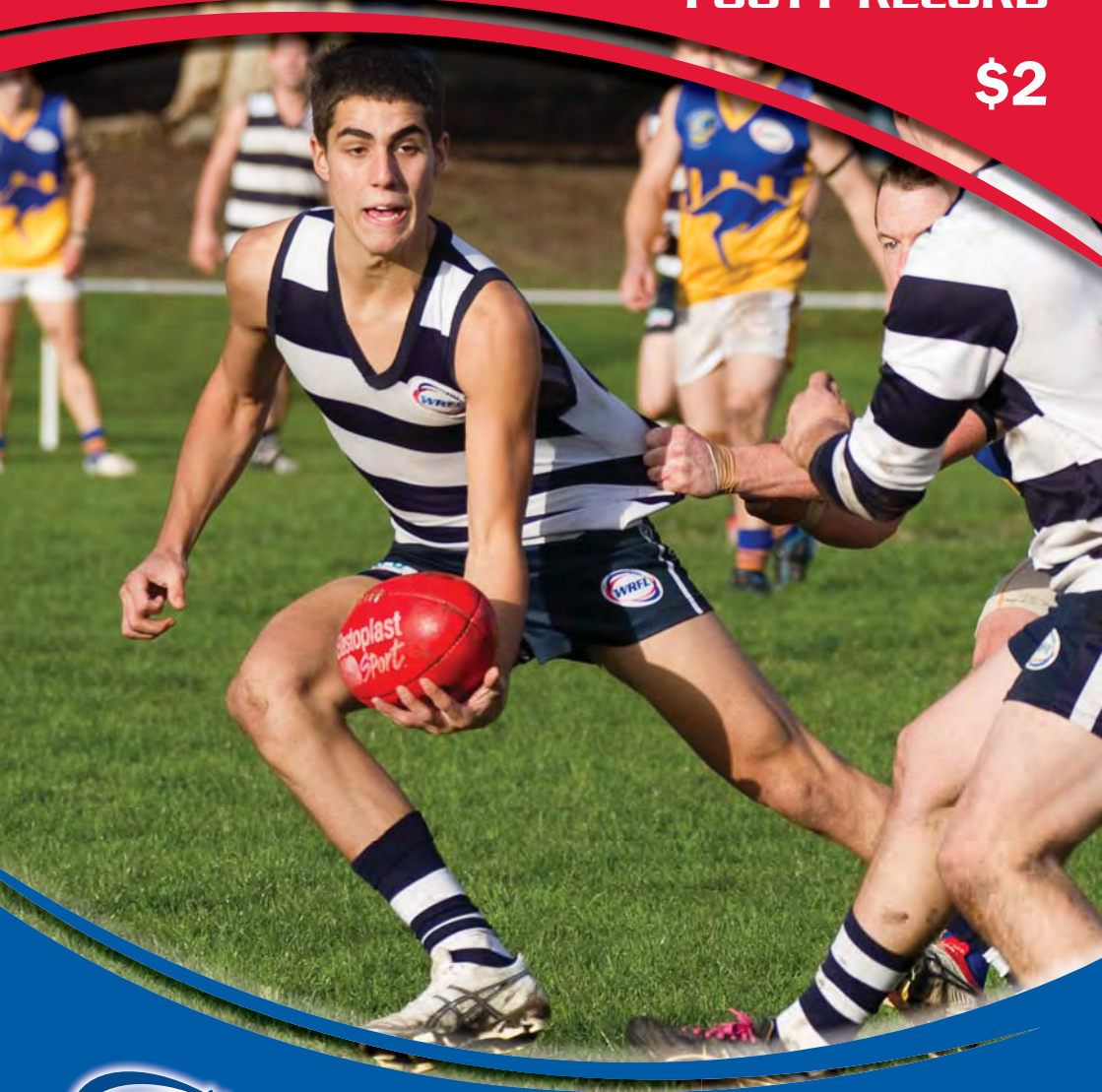

FALCONS AIM FOR FINALS BERTH

Hoping to build on a positive 2010 which saw the youth-dominated Wyndhamvale side narrowly miss the finals, Honour Avenue has been a hive of activity throughout the summer months with new signings & off-field events setting the foundation for a what looks to be a promising 2011.

Strong recruiting has seen a number of new faces join the ranks at Dennis Family Oval, and the emergence of several of the club's junior players will add plenty of depth to the playing outfit in 2011.

The Falcons have benefited from a large exodus from GDFL side Werribee Centrals, gaining the services of tall marking forward Dean Cachia, running defender Dale Evans, Midfielders Luke Aqualina & David Gamble, as well as key position Alex Hamilton.

The Falcons will be further boosted by the height and longer kicking of Nic Aldridge who joins the club after playing last year in the Queensland State League, while Steven Sotto joins the club from Sunshine Heights.

Youngster Jake Crabtree will get plenty of game-time in the seniors this season after winning the club's U18 Best & Fairest in 2010, while key defender Aiden Boland, who finished runner-

up in the club's Best & Fairest is likely to slot straight into the falcons defensive line.

Senior Coach Luke Dennerley said the mix of new & existing players meant exciting good times lay ahead for the club, and that finals football is a reality.

"We are excited by the development of our strong Under 18's group which continue to get opportunities at senior level," said Dennerley.

"We are pleased with the work of young prime movers Corey Mackey, Aaron Fleming and Jayden Wood, as well as the solid base put into key position players Nathan Reschke, Michael Lubke and the emerging Chris Klein-Bretelel."

"I would like to make special mention of the work that our list has done over the break, in particular guys like Cameron Evans, Nathan Davenport, David Drohomorecki, Nathan Evans, Shane Fletcher, Fox Cowlshaw, Nathan Van Hulst, Nathan Urquhart, Jerome Wattelet & Steggle Ingham, who are in the best shape of their football careers."

"Daniel Bunworth also returns full time after a pre-season with VFL club Northern Bullants, and he will certainly add some grunt to the midfield" Dennerley adds "Mark Elso, Craig Prior and the entire coaching group have also put in a power of work over the pre-season".

The off-season has been an eventful one for the group, with the club venturing to Lorne for a weekend in February for a tough but rewarding pre-season camp. More than 60 listed players, the full committee lead by President John Willaton & coaching staff committed to the weekend as the group completed a series of team building



challenges, the revered Mountain to Surf run, beach sessions, an intraclub match and a skills session led by Richmond Team of Century coach Tommy Hafey.

In off-field news the club continues to grow & evolve, and in 2011 the Wyndhamvale Football Club has officially united as one strong community based club with players from juniors through to the senior grade playing under one banner.

A new logo will recognize this change while a new strip will be implemented for the 2012 season thanks to majors sponsors KADS Plant Hire. The club is also eagerly awaiting the development a new \$4million facility on Black Forest Road, encompassing two new sports ovals with floodlights, four changerooms and a large social space for club events.

All eyes will be on Parsons Reserve this weekend as last year's grand finalists reacquaint with one-another. The Cats will unfurl their Premiership flag before Albion & Spotswood pick up from where they left of last year – which truly was on the most enthralling last quarters seen in a WRFL Grand Final in recent years.

It would seem unfair to predict anything at this stage other than a rematch in six months time so this weekend's game could be pivotal come the business end of the season.

Both teams will sport reasonably different line-ups to the ones who took to the field last September at Werribee, however there is little doubt the Cats and Woodsmen will be amongst the league leaders again in Season 2011.

Meanwhile early season indications have Albion's fierce rival Sunshine as this season's big improver.

The Kangaroos have put together a senior list dripping with talent – Danny Jacobs crossing over from St Kilda City and Simon Wiggins from the Northern Bullants, which should propel Sunshine deep into the finals.

They visit Port Colts who made a point of improving on their depth for the upcoming season; Kade and Rhett Wilsmore have joined from Mulgrave & James Turnbull from Lara, and will be definitely be aiming to go at least one better on last year as far as ladder position is concerned.

Altona and Hoppers also clash on the opening weekend in a game where both clubs have set high hopes on 2011.

The Vikings snuck into the five last year, but made no impression once the post-season commenced. The Warriors in comparison

missed the finals, one win less but with a better percentage.

It was hard to separate the teams in 2010, and 2011 may be no different even though both teams are set for bigger and better years.

The men from Civic Parade will be after a double chance, and whilst that seems a rather optimistic goal the list at this stage suggests it's definitely not out of the realms of possibility. Hoppers seem to be in the same boat, and while it didn't quite come together last year, 2011 should see a change in fortunes for the side. Therefore this weekend's fixture will be crucial for both sides as they try to get an early gauge early of how their respective pre-seasons have them placed.

Both teams want to be spoken about with the likes of Spotswood, Albion, Sunshine, and the winner can go some way to solidifying those ambitions while for the loser its back to the whiteboard.

Last year's Division Two premiers North Footscray will kick off their Division One experience against Glenorden, and whilst the jump up cannot be underestimated & many before them have struggled with the higher standard of football - the Red Devils will hope to get their promotion year off to a good start and set a standard for the rest of the year.

To round out the opening weekend St Albans host Sunshine Heights. The Saints look to have assembled a strong side for the new season, with fantastic off-season recruitment headlined by former Essendon utility Aaron Henneman. They'll be aiming to turn last year's top four finish into a top two spot this year and an early season win against Sunshine Heights is their chance to show the rest of the competition they'll be in the mix come seasons' end.

EX-BOMBER JOINS ST ALBANS

While most off the off-season talk was of Jason Cloke's signing to Spotswood, another ex-AFL player's move into the WRFL has slipped under the radar with Aaron Henneman signing with St Albans after three seasons at Devon Meadows.

Other off-season signings for the Saints include Chris Senserick, who will reunite with his brother & sister who are actively involved with the club.

"Once again it was not just a matter of signing for those reasons with Chris it was making sure we were doing the right things for the way he wanted to approach his football and at this stage he is very comfortable with his decision to leave his previous club where he had a long affiliation," said Senior Coach Ian Denny.

"Chris is a professional when it comes to his football and expects the same from his team mates so his influence around the club has been terrific in a short time."

Aaron Ford and Peter Delinkowicz have also returned to the Saints after stints in the Northern Football League with Montmorency, while the club also welcomes midfielder Brent Taylor from EDFL side Doutta Stars and Daniel McKerracher from VFL club Werribee.

"Daniels pre season in particular has been phenomenal and his influence on others has been infectious," said Denny.

"The biggest challenge ahead for us is to manage our playing list as a spot in the seniors will be eagerly sought and hopefully this will reflect in our performances."

UMPIRES CORNER

The off-season has been busy for the WRFL Umpires Association with plenty of new faces signing on for Season 2011. With three umpiring academies now up and running, umpiring within the league has never been in a better position.

The Academy At Werribee (MacKillop College) is entering its third year and in 2011 there are more than 40 umpires training on a weekly basis. This academy is run by ex-AFL umpire Mark Westgarth, with the assistance of John Booker. Training is Mondays at 4.00pm.

The Academy at Maribyrnong (Maribyrnong College) has been established solely for students at the school and is linked in with the School's new sports program. This academy is run by current AFL umpire Troy Pannell with the assistance of Peter Dalgleish. Training is Tuesdays at 4.00pm.

The WRFL's third Academy was launched earlier this year at Caroline Springs and caters for all students in the area. This is expected to be the biggest of the league's academies and is run by ex AFL umpire Alf Galea with the assistance of Phil Henderson. Training at Caroline Springs is Tuesdays at 4.00pm.

In the off-season the league sadly lost one of our legends in Stan Mielczarek. Stan had been with the league for over thirty years, and is well known to second division clubs through his role as club umpires liaison. Stan passed away on Monday 14th February and



will be sadly missed by not just the umpires association but by all those involved with the Western Region Football League.

RULES OF THE GAME: SENDING OFF

A player or official who commits a reportable offence will be shown a yellow card and ordered from the field for 15 minutes. This player/official cannot be replaced. The player may also be reported at the umpire's discretion.

Should the player/official be ordered from the field for a second time during a match, they will be shown a red card and cannot return to the field for the remainder of the match.

A player ordered from the field for the first time, who then commits a second offence prior to leaving the ground, will be shown a red card.

A player/official that assaults an umpire will be immediately ordered from the ground for the rest of the match and cannot be replaced.

Timekeepers should be notified by the club's runner of a sending off, and will commence timing the 15 minute penalty. The 15 minutes will only start when the timekeepers are notified (not at the exact time of the offence.)

DIVISION ONE (U18)

Plenty of changes behind the scenes in the Under 18 competition this year, as a name change and alignment with senior fixtures will give the league's best juniors more exposure as they play in front of bigger crowds.

This season all clubs that have senior teams in Division One will play in the U18 Division One competition, and conversely all clubs that have teams in Division Two will play in the U18 Division Two competition.

There has been plenty of discussion surrounding the validity of the move, however Laverton Senior Coach Justin Moran was quick to jump to the defence of the league's decision.

Moran said that it is a vital move for the long term strengthening of the competition.

"The EDFL have done it from Under 18's through to Seniors for over 15 years and it has served the purpose... clubs simply must adhere to these rules and the drive to do all they can to get to Division One," said Moran.

"At the end of the day it is the strength of the Seniors that dictate where the Juniors are and not the other way around. An Under 18B and Reserves B Grade Premiership will not elevate your club."

"If you get your systems and culture right then you will have a strong club whereby your Seniors, Reserves and Under 18's are always in the top 4 or 5."

"The WRFL is a little unique in that there are clubs that have only juniors playing in it and the senior clubs elsewhere and that is their choice but for the good of the competition and the strength of the competition if each

and every club knows their place, rules are set and then properly governed, you as an individual club either work with these rules to better your club and either commit to taking your juniors elsewhere and follow the path of the seniors (be it in the VAFA, GDFL or other) or you align your seniors and juniors together in the WRFL which will only get stronger."

The issue will no doubt be hotly debated as the season kicks off this weekend, but as Moran argues, long term it is likely to point the League in the right direction.

On the park this weekend defending premiers Hoppers Crossing travel to Altona as they seek to kickstart their premiership defence. Both sides will have given plenty of players a run in Division Two last week, and if those results are anything to go by Hoppers still look to be a force to be reckoned with.

North Footscray's promotion to Division One in the seniors will see their eighteens run around in the top-flight competition as they host Sunshine. From all reports the visitors have had a solid pre-season and word from the club is they look in good shape for the coming year.

Albion and Spotswood will meet as the curtain-raiser to the Senior Division One Grand Final rematch, which will give the boys the opportunity to play in front of a well sized crowd at Parsons Reserve, while St Albans host Sunshine Heights in what will a great contest to kick off Season 2011.

With some club's fielding two Under Eighteen sides it will take a few weeks to get a good grasp playing rosters, line-ups and exactly where each club is at – although early indications still suggest Hoppers are the team to beat in 2011.

"If he needs anything, I will be there for him."

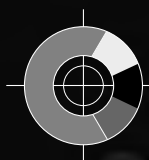
