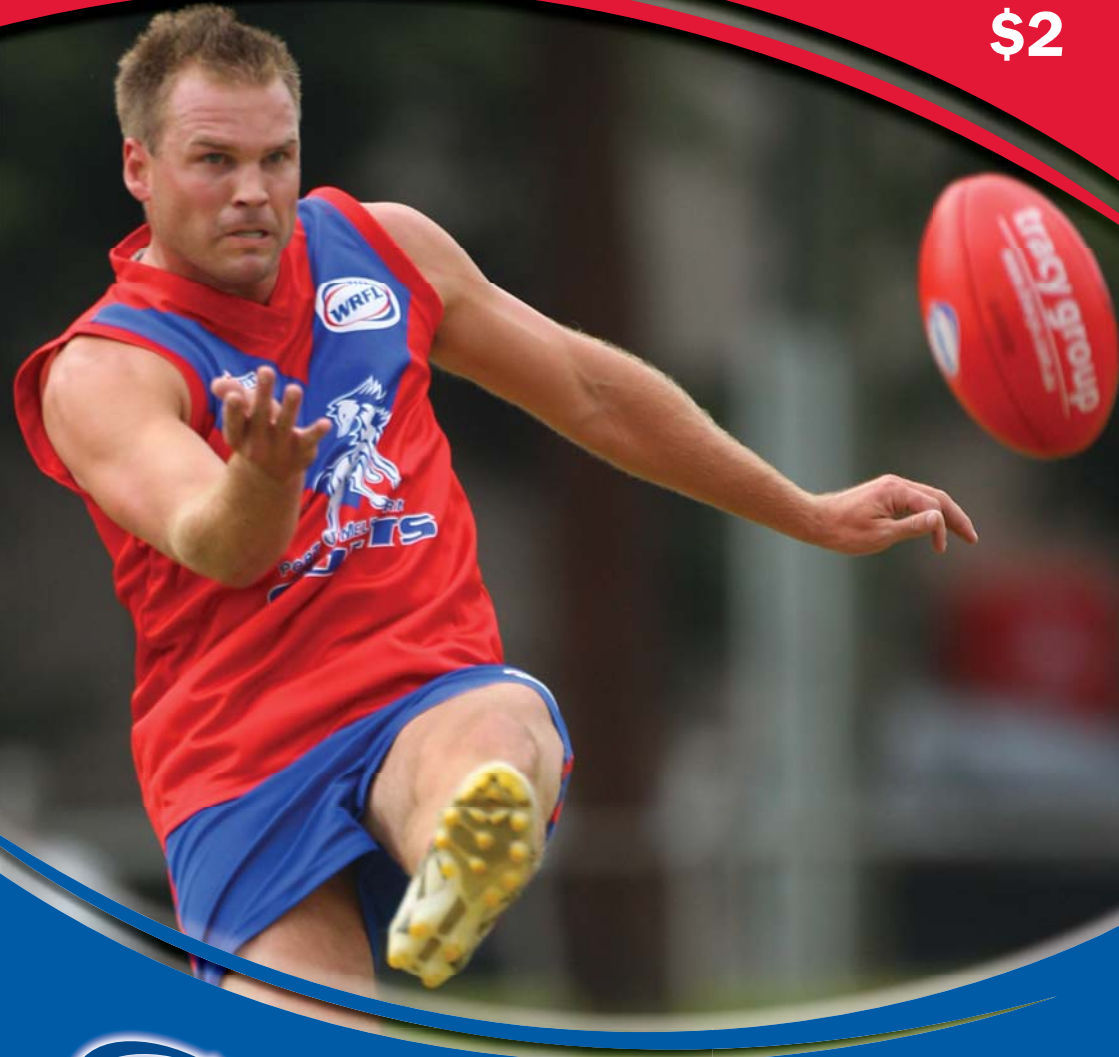

LAVERTON STRIVING FOR SUCCESS

Both On & Off The Field

The resurgence of the Laverton Magpies Football Club under Senior Coach Justin Moran has continued into the 2011 season, with a solid pre-season and some positive early results indicating the Magpies are definitely a team on the rise.

Early indications in the off-season were that 2011 was going to be a different sort of year for the Magpies, with swarms of players turning up to train way back in November with a renewed sense of enthusiasm about the club.

A new administration was installed, including newcomers Steve Bourke, Paul Spottiswood, Tim Cooper and Reece Luenig, while Matthew Pratt was elected as the club's new President & Monita Broughton as his deputy.

Off-field changes have been the key component of the club's re-emergence as a leading WRFL club, with a five-year plan "The Resurgence of the Magpies" providing guidance on all club related issues. The installation of a rule on 'zero tolerance' to anti-social behavior and the formation of the Laverton Ladies Club are part of this plan as the club strives to improve and build its relationships within Laverton and the wider community.

On the field the club has benefited from the return of Michael Kennedy, Leigh Hartshorne & Matthew Zurek, and the

addition of quality former under-eighteens, including Troy McAskill, Ryan Murphy, Ash Murray, Jake Styles & Sean McCann has further boosted the playing roster.

Senior Coach Justin Moran said the addition of these players, as well as John & Michael Henry, will add some much needed hardness to the side, and that some tough pre-season work would reap rewards for the side later in the year.

"A number of our younger talented players put in some very solid pre-season training and have definitely stepped up their own standing within the club," said Moran.

"We are poised for a vastly improved season in 2010 and with over 60 players on our list and regularly training we intend to be pushing for a finals berth in both seniors and reserves."

As well as the usual grueling physical work that is associated with the pre-season, the club varied their routine with a triathlon at Port Melbourne, community initiatives (such as players donating blood one night), team DVD tasks set, a night out at Federation Square, a trip to the St Kilda Festival, & attending a "life coaching" information night held at the club.

This new-age coaching mentality has been well received by players, and Moran is a coach that is definitely switched on and able to extract the most from his chargers.



“The club is trying in every way to make our club the best it can be on and off the field and to make it a place where you want to spend more time around and ‘to give something back’,” said Moran.

A pool table at the club, a revamped social calendar and a facebook page for regular contact may seem like small steps, but they are a way of keeping players involved, in-touch and part of the club & community.

Moran is also a strong believer of instilling discipline & respect into his side, and over the Easter weekend Moran will continue this theme with a visit to the Shrine of Remembrance for the ANZAC Day Dawn Service.

For Moran breaking into the top four will be the side’s short term goal on the park, but longer term the now 29 year-old is helping rebuild and reform a club & playing roster that is definitely moving in the right direction for future years.

It was the premiership quarter that was the difference last weekend, when Spotswood sought redemption in the Grand Final rematch against Albion at Parsons Reserve. A four goal-to-one third term saw the Woodsman repel a late Albion charge to hang on by five points and get their season off to the most positive of starts.

Plenty has been made of Sunshine's off-season, but a big turn up from the Port Colts at Murphy Reserve saw the men from across the bridge get the four points. All this adds extra engrossment to Saturday's clash when Spotswood host Port Colts in one of the greater recent rivalries the league has to offer. The two clubs have won five flags between them since 2005, and have faced off against each other in three of those deciders. Hostilities will resume at McLean Reserve – Spotswood looking to regain the dominance of last season, Port Colts once again aiming to take down the green and gold.

For the Cats, a wonderful day for the club celebrating the fruits of last year turned sour with their loss, and they have the chance to get back on level pegging when they travel to Hogans Reserve. The hosts, Hoppers Crossing, received a football lesson from a rising Altona last weekend, and will be smarting to make amends with their opening home game for Season 2011. It's a big game for both sides with neither wanting to be stuck with the unenviable record of 0-2 going into the Easter break.

Altona took the Warriors to task last weekend, with a dominant display earning them an 89-point win.

Tremendous positivity has emerged from the Vikings in the pre-season and the effort paid off handsomely. They now have the tough task of backing up the standard they displayed with a trek to the Kinder Smith where a determined Sunshine will be looking for nothing more than to bounce back from their loss to the Colts. Can the Kangaroos justify the pre-season hype and get their first win of the year or will a rampaging Altona give them a surprising no wins from two to kick off the season that many predicted was theirs for the taking?

Sunshine wants to be amongst the league leaders this year, and with Port Colts signalling they might be back to the form of previous years and Altona on the rise, they'll need a notable early scalp or fear falling behind before they know it.

In the other two games of the round, one sees the Red Devils from Hansen Reserve continue to enjoy their promotion experience when they tackle Sunshine Heights at home. North Footscray accounted for Glenorden last week, and if they want to make a fist of their step up to Division One will need nothing less than the four points to continue their momentum.

It was St Albans who clobbered Sunny Heights last week, a more than comfortable 57-point win at home to kick off their season. They travel to Glenorden, and whilst the Hawks can be plucky to play at home, the Saints are planning a big 2011 and nothing less than a similar performance to last week will be accepted.

KICK-IN AFTER A BEHIND

In matches where WRFL Goal Umpires are officiating, a player is permitted to play on after a point once the goal umpire has signaled the score. In matches where no WRFL Goal Umpires are officiating, a player is not permitted to play on after a point until the umpire waves the flags.

CENTRE SQUARE INFRINGEMENTS:

If no WRFL Boundary Umpires are officiating the centre square infringement rule will not apply unless the field umpire deems there are more than 4 from a side in the square prior to walking in to bounce the ball.

"I learnt from the coaching team the importance the club places on the health and



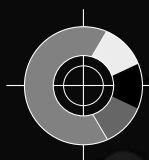
well-being of its players, in particular their mental health," said Menzel.
