FROM THE CEO

Mr Bob Tregear

Everyone involved in junior football, from Club and League officials to players and their parents have experienced the annual confusion in getting the season underway. With cricket and other summer sports not finishing until late March and the start of term 1 school holidays in early April, many junior football clubs remain uncertain of their final team numbers until late April. The desire to grade teams at appropriate levels adds to the complexity. Since clubs submitted their original nominations for 193 junior teams in mid-March, 16 teams have been withdrawn from the Sunday Junior divisions due to lack of numbers. While the remaining 177 teams represent an increase over the previous year, it is known that a few clubs are still in doubt about their ability to continue with some teams.

The innovation of single-year age groups this year provided an added challenge. Some clubs did not initially nominate teams in the Under 13 and Under 15 age groups, opting instead to enter the Under 14 and Under 16 divisions respectively. Big losing margins recorded in the first 2 rounds have led to those clubs requesting movement of teams to the lower age divisions. As if all that were not enough, the once-in-a-generation coincidence of school holidays, Easter and Anzac Day have created a virtual 3-week holiday break in April this year, making communication between clubs and their junior players even more difficult.

Given the disruption to fixtures caused by team withdrawals and requests for moves to lower age groups, the status of all junior competitions was reviewed by the WRFL Juniors Board last week. The key decision made by the Board was that the status of most of the 14 junior competition grades ranging from Under 11s to Under 16s was untenable and, as a result, fixture revisions would be necessary.

Key features of the revised fixtures are:

- The compositions of Under 9 and Under 10 grades remains unaltered. These non-competitive grades will continue with their Round 3 games on Sunday 1st May.
- The compositions of all other Sunday grades, with the exception of Under 15A and Under 11A, have been altered.
- The altered grades will reset their season starting dates, commencing with Round 1 on 1st May and concluding the home & away season at Round 13 on Sunday 31st July. Competition results, ladder positions and Best & Fairest voting from the 2 rounds already played will not be carried forward but will start from the new Round 1 on 1st May.
- The 2 unaltered grades (Under 15A and Under 11A) will carry forward their results and votes. Because no change has been made to the Under 15A and Under 11A grades, they will continue with Round 3 on 1st May, again concluding the home & away season on Sunday 31st July at Round 15.

A massive job remains to produce revised fixtures beyond the May 1 round. The new fixtures will be published on the WRFL website as early as possible next week. The WRFL Juniors Board is to be commended for its prompt and detailed response to the complex range of fixturing issues encountered this year. The Board will work with club officials and WRFL operations staff to identify strategies to reduce the confusion in future years. In the meantime, we wish all clubs and their players an enjoyable and successful season in WRFL football.

THE TIGERS CLUBHOUSE

Commits \$50,000 To Local Clubs

Securing sponsorship can be one of the toughest hurdles for local sporting clubs. Particularly in the current economic climate there always appears to be a shortage of companies that are willing to throw their weight behind local sporting teams – especially out in the west.

While there are the few lucky clubs who have a benefactor who regularly props up to the club's bank balance, the majority of local football clubs face the stark reality that at the beginning of every season there are fees to be paid, expenses to be met, and limited options to source funds to enable this to happen.

However for WRFL clubs based in the City of Wyndham, a new sponsorship scheme has seen several receive a sponsorship payment that can almost be compared to a lottery win.

Launched in 2010, the Werribee Football Club, in conjunction with The Tigers Clubhouse, announced a new community sponsorship program named Tigers Sports Assist. The program was open to all sporting clubs within the City of Wyndham with a total of \$50,000 available for distribution amongst clubs who registered to participate.

Following the conclusion of the 2010/11 promotion, several Wyndham based clubs received some excellent financial support, in particular the Wyndhamvale Falcons who received over \$23,000 from the Tigers Clubhouse.

Other recipients included the Werribee Bears Rugby League Club (\$15,700), Hoppers Crossing Gymnastics Club (\$6,700), Old Westbourne Football Club (\$2,300), Werribee Junior & Amateur Football Club (\$1,600) and even the Werribee Bushwalking Club (\$500).

Tigers Clubhouse General Manager, Julie Shelton, said she was excited the Clubhouse could contribute such significant amounts to local sporting groups and that the promotion would be expanded to include more local clubs in the future.

"The Tigers Clubhouse and The Werribee Football Club are very excited by the Tigers Sports Assist

Program which was an idea we derived from a similar successful incentive program ran by a sporting venue in Sale," said Shelton.

"As The Tigers Clubhouse is a community Club and the Social Venue of the Werribee Football Club we have always sponsored local sporting clubs for various sums of money over the previous years with the agreed understanding that these clubs would support us as their 'local' and preferred entertainment venue."

"By implementing The Tigers Sports Assist Program we are able to recognise & reward the local Clubs that have supported us. We have had an excellent relationship with the Wyndhamvale Falcons Football Club over the past two years with a sponsorship deal of \$4000 per year so we are absolutely delighted to award them a cheque this year for \$23,000."

"Similarly The Werribee Bears Rugby Club who had a sponsorship deal with us for \$2000 and now will receive \$15,000 from their participation in the Tigers Sports Assist Program which was as simple as coming to the Club for a beer after their home matches."

Western Region Football League CEO, Mr Bob Tregear, said the sponsorship scheme would contribute some vital funds to several WRFL clubs based in the Wyndham region.

"For many clubs securing sponsors every season can be a tough task, so to have a local business offering to share such a significant amount of sponsorship amongst local clubs is fantastic," said Tregear.

"Wyndhamvale has benefited greatly from the promotion, and there is no reason why other clubs in the region can't do the same."

MAJAK'S MAGIC START

Ex-WRFL Junior Pushes For AFL Debut

When former Wyndhamvale Falcon Majak Daw made his way onto the Kangaroos' Rookie List, many suspected it was as much of a public relations stunt as it was an educated signing. The hype around the competition's first Sudanese-born player dominated the headlines for at least a week however the jury was still out regarding his credentials on the park.

Fast-forward twelve months, and Daw may well have just had his breakout game. Albeit in the VFL for the Kangaroos' affiliate Werribee, Daw was simply magic amassing 45 hit-outs, 19 touches and two goals including what many have already dubbed the 'Goal of the Year'.

It was a performance that should have everyone talking about the athletic big man once more, and surely should see his name in the mix for rookie elevation this year. Before the start of the season Daw narrowly missed out to former Box Hill utility Cameron Pederson for an upgrade onto the senior list, however that was before anyone had seen performances like last weekend.

Werribee coach Paul Satterley was impressed with what he saw on the weekend, and likened his athletic ability to that of West Coast's Nic Naitanui.

"He's got a terrific vertical jump and he's got the pace and acceleration, so I guess there are some similarities," said Satterley.

"He tackles and he does all the things you want from big blokes... it was his best performance by a mile... it's not my call, but if he keeps playing like that, I'm sure he'll be knocking on the door."

The performance is a far cry from his opening years as a footballer, when a then 15 year-old arrived at Honour Avenue as a very raw untapped talent. For close friend and former teammate Joe Halloran, who Daw credits as his biggest influence, his progression is all the more surreal given his arrival at a Wyndhamvale pre-season training session in 2006 with little more than just a curious interest in the game.



"Back then he was hopeless," said Halloran.

"He really struggled to grasp kicking or marking and his game sense was just terrible. Since then, he's literally come along in leaps and bounds. Each year he's kind of doubled as a player. It's been so rapid, it's unbelievable."

Project Co-ordinator for the AFL Multicultural Program, Nick Hatzoglou, said he had closely monitored and already used him as a community ambassador for the AFL's Inaugural Multicultural Camp for teenagers. He said Daw's emergence as a player would resonate with Melbourne's Sudanese, African and broader communities, because of his heritage and how quickly he had embraced Australian football.

"It's been an amazing five years of re-settling into a country," said Hatzoglou.

While some might be getting a little ahead of themselves, with one punter slapping \$150 on Daw to win the NAB Rising Star at 501/1, there is no doubt he is a player in waiting and one that may add some much needed spark to the Kangaroos line-up.

When you consider that Daw had never seen a football five years ago, and couldn't speak a word of English ten years ago, there is no doubt he is a quick learner and one you would be happy to back to evolve further as a player in the not so distant future.



Kicking Goals In The West

The Williamstown Seagulls continue to lead the way in developing inclusive football strategies in the west, with their Williamstown Seagulls FIDA team making their historic debut last weekend. The Football Integration Development Association (FIDA) provides a regular, competitive fixture of Australian Rules football for players with an intellectual disability and its main aim is to provide access to football for anyone in Victoria with an intellectual disability. In partnership with the Williamstown Seagulls, the Williamstown FIDA side recorded a resounding 112-point win over the under-manned Cranbourne Eagles. The long-term contribution to FIDA football by Corey Murphy and Dominic Favorito was honoured with them being named Inaugural Co-Captains, and with the toss won, the Seagulls elected to kick into a slight breeze.

In perfect weather for football, the Seagulls slammed on six goals in the first quarter to really put their mark on the game. The milestone first goal was kicked by Taz Toussaint, and a flurry of goals followed, including two to boom recruit Daniel Cesaria. The play of the day saw Ray Causon attack the ball hard from Centre Half Back and pump it long into the forward line to set up a major score.

The second quarter was a carbon copy of the first, with the Seagulls piling on another six goals. The real features of this dominance were the team play, backing up, shepherding, precision kicking and handball that have been drilled at training.

The decision was made at half time to reduce the Seagulls on-ground numbers to twelve players, to give some exposure to more pressurised situations. This expanded the bench and made increased rotations possible – giving the side valuable experience for up & coming games.



Despite being outnumbered, the Seagulls kicked on in the Premiership quarter, and only some inaccuracy in front of goals prevented the score blowing out even further. To the Eagles' credit, they battled on, and were able to score their solitary goal in this period.

The final term presented an opportunity to give a number of players a chance to have a run in different positions, with forwards going to the backline, and backs going onto the ball which again bodes well for the future. Despite the big winning margin, it was great to see the Williamstown players' respect for their opponents at the conclusion of the match. On a day when everyone wore the Yellow and Blue proudly and in a common cause, the Best Players will be recorded for posterity as "Team Effort". In one of many firsts, the culmination of the afternoon for the Seniors was the opportunity to sing the Club Song in front of an appreciative crowd.

Unfortunately for the Reserves side, the drubbing that Cranbourne had received in the Senior game dulled their enthusiasm for a repeat in the Reserves, and the Eagles were unable to field another team. While pleased to receive

four points for the forfeit, the Reserves players wanted to show how much they have developed in the pre-season, so an intra-club scratch match was played. Coached by Football Williamstown cadets John Hearns and Matt Hughes, the nine-a-side game was a showcase for the development of the younger Seagulls. Kim Plummer showed that she will be a strong contributor during the season with some inspired football out of the centre, while Lewis Wardell's 60 meter run through the midfield was the highlight of the game. The large crowd were treated to polished performances from Dean Zavattiero and new recruit Michael Roach, along with solid efforts from Joe Dowling, Hassan Jamaleddine, Tristan Sheahan and Nathan "Axman" Axiak in their respective backlines. Theo Causon was manful in the ruck, and his brother Ben, playing his first game for several years, showed he hasn't lost his touch. Chantelle Gordon and Daryl Rimmer continued to get involved and the mercurial Thuan Ma kicked the goal of the match.

Fittingly, the two teams were so evenly matched that the final outcome was a draw, and all the players joined together in singing the Club Song for the second time in the day.



The development of this FIDA side is yet another example of local sporting clubs extending their involvement within the local community, with the Williamstown Seagulls at the forefront in pursuing community relations in the west. On the same day the Williamstown Youth Girls made their debut on the park, as part of Football Williamstown, an organisation growing by the day to service all levels of football in the Williamstown community.

UMPIRES CORNER

News From The Umpires Association

After almost a month of football now completed, things are beginning to settle down a little. After a handful of games, most clubs are now getting some idea of what their season may hold for them. Of course, it is still early days and there are many more teams to play before anyone can get a true picture of how things might pan out.

Lots of senior players have made their debut and have been promoted to a higher grade. Hundreds and hundreds of the junior players have had to take the big step of promotion to a higher age level. This is sometimes a very hard thing for some youngsters to do. Hopefully everyone, including officials, parents, family and friends, can give the relevant support whenever necessary.

It is the same within the umpiring fraternity. Some umpires have been promoted to a higher level than what they have umpired before. Most will be ready to take the big step but it will still be a nerve racking experience for some.

The umpires have quite a number of mentors specially assigned to assist junior field umpires be introduced to the game. In many junior games you will probably see a more experienced umpire be teamed with a newcomer. This system has worked very well in the past four or five seasons. Sometimes you may see a junior boundary umpire trailing along behind another while learning on the spot and finding out exactly where to go and what to do during a game. Even in the goals you may see the two umpire system being used especially in some under-eighteen 18 games. One experienced goalie will be helping a newcomer in their first few games.

It is hoped that after a period of assistance the new umpires will be able to take a more active role later in the season. Fingers crossed, it may be the start of a long rewarding career involved in the game that all of us love.

RULES OF THE WEEK

MELEE INVOLVING PLAYERS:

In the event of a melee the umpire in control should endeavour to keep play flowing and leave the second umpire to defuse the situation. Where necessary a free kick may be given to remove the play from the problem area. Should no players desire to contest the ball the game is to be abandoned.

MELEE INVOLVING SPECTATORS:

If any spectators enter the playing field during a melee the game is to be abandoned. Umpires are instructed to congregate together in the centre of the ground and leave the field together.




