# WOMEN IN THE WEST

*From Chylo Kurdas, AFL Victoria*

Female participation in Australian football is soaring both locally and nationally. Women and girls' participation in the game has been the fastest growing segment of our game for a number of years now, with over 90,000 female participants nationally in 2010. The AFL now has a national televised elite women's competition in its sights, with the inaugural female AFL equivalent set to be rolled out by 2020.

Underpinning this initiative are many State and local community developments all designed to increase female participation. AFL Victoria expects 1,300 teenage girls participate in sixty teams across eight Youth Girls competitions located in Melbourne's west, east, north and south east, as well as Geelong and Bendigo. New competitions will also be established in Warrnambool and Ballarat this year. Five of these competitions are managed by local community leagues, with female football now being fully integrated into the existing community football framework.

AFL Victoria's newest initiative, Junior Girls football, will generate excellent growth in the 9-12 year old age bracket. The WRFL, alongside another four Melbourne based leagues, have indicated their interest in being one of the first leagues in Victoria to run their own junior girls competition.

Female participation in umpiring is continuing to increase through league focussed initiatives, whilst AFL Victoria's Female Umpiring Academy is fast tracking our most promising female umpires towards an elite career.

Off field women and girls have always participated in football as spectators, team officials and volunteers, sometimes under the sufferance of an environment that wasn't conducive to their needs. Since 2008 AFL Victoria has been working with local leagues to implement Fair Game: Respect Matters, a pilot program designed to enhance local football clubs' culture so that it is safe, supportive and inclusive for women and girls. Fair Game is now reaping dividends, with greater awareness of the needs of women and girls and a subsequent increase in their participation in clubs' on and off field management.

Whilst community leagues and their clubs should congratulate themselves for their work to date in reshaping the football landscape to ensure that women and girls enjoy every element of our game we still have a way to go. What we do know however is that increased female participation only ever benefits our local clubs, which makes all the work well worth it.

# FEMALES IN FOOTBALL

## A WRFL Special Feature

*If you think Australian Football is a game played by boys and men – think again! Female participation in Australian Football has been on the rise for many years, with over 80,000 female participants playing the game Australia wide. There are over 35,000 female volunteers, 1,500 accredited female coaches, and thousands more girls & women fulfilling other roles on a Saturday or Sunday afternoon. On this Mothers Day Round, the WRFL Footy Record asked several prominent females within the Western Region Football League to detail their involvement & experiences with the game.*

### **THE BOARD MEMBER: Gina Smith**

I have been involved with the WRFL in two capacities, initially as a member of the WRFL Tribunal then more recently as a board member. My introduction to the WRFL was due to the, then, WRFL board who were seeking a new membership base for the Tribunal, specifically people with a sports administration. I was completing a Masters in Sport Business Management at Victoria University at the time, applied and was thrilled to be appointed to the Tribunal in 2006.

Having a strong personal belief in ensuring a safe and enjoyable sport environment, I fully supported the new direction of the Independent Tribunal and its role in improving the on & off field WRFL environment. I thoroughly enjoyed being part of that process. Additionally I found it interesting hearing cases without the benefit of video footage, particularly when some of those appearing before us providing such colourful versions of the events!

Although previously sitting on boards in other sports, I aspired to being part of a football league board, in part as my past experience has been in non-mainstream sports but also, as is often the case when volunteering, previous involvement meant I was often undertaking multiple roles at the same time. When positions came available on the board in 2009, I jumped at the chance to nominate. I was thrilled to be appointed and it has been exciting being a part of dramatic and important administrative changes. My only disappointment being that I could not continue sitting on the Tribunal.

The WRFL board has worked well together and I've enjoyed the different views and healthy debates and more importantly the opportunity to sit on a board that is supported by an administration which enables the WRFL board to concentrate on core business, unlike in some other sports where some boards are often too caught up in day-to-day matters.

The WRFL and its member clubs provide a welcoming and supportive environment for volunteers, irrespective of gender. However, I believe it is important to have women involved in various levels of community football. In the majority of football clubs, mothers, daughters and girlfriends, even if not directly involved in club specific or other official roles, all provide significant support behind the scenes each week. Your continued contribution in this area is to be commended but I would also encourage more of you take on new challenges and different roles within our clubs and the League - you can make a difference to the continuation of football in the West.

## THE UMPIRE: Amelia Beardmore

I have been involved with the Western Region Football League for five seasons. I started as a boundary umpire and then gradually built up to become a junior field umpire. I first became aware of the WRFL Umpires Association when my school started advertising for umpires. I'm also very fortunate to live around the corner from where the umpires train so I was able to quickly touch base with management and was registered to start running the boundary by my first meeting.

My experiences have been very enjoyable on and off the field. When I started boundary umpiring I was introduced to a whole different area of football, mostly because I was surrounded by senior men who loved the game as much as I did. When I turned sixteen I started playing football with my local youth girls team. Unfortunately it meant that I could no longer run the boundary, but as I was very passionate about umpiring I was asked if I wanted to join the junior field umpiring ranks and run with a mentor. I definitely didn't hesitate.

I ran in my green shirt for a year, learning the ins and outs of umpiring on the field, and am now a qualified umpire who umpires high level junior games and last year got the Under 16A Grand Final.

The responsibilities I have as a junior umpire are very simple. Keep the game going, and make sure everyone participating is enjoying themselves. I think it's inspiring that so many children are coming up from Auskick to give the game a go, and I think it's thoroughly enjoyable to be running and umpiring some very skilled players.

Female involvement in the game is important as there needs to be pathways for everyone in our national sport whether you play or officiate, no matter what your gender. My experiences both playing and umpiring, and on and off the field, have shaped me to be who I am today and I think females involved in the WRFL will agree that the atmosphere around a football club is positive and enthusiastic, almost addictive.

All females should be given the chances to join in, and if they are then they should be supported to keep going, because having these opportunities can provide a positive attitude to all members. Being able to make our football community better and more enjoyable is what any league would strive for, and I think having a good representation of players and officials, girls and boys, women and men gives this a better chance.

## THE PLAYER: Aisling Utri

I first started playing football in the Western Region Football League in under-nines for St Bernards Football Club. I used to play at school during recess & lunchtime, and I really enjoyed it so mum said I could start playing. At the time all three of my older brothers played football at the club.

In under-nines I was the only girl in the team, however it wasn't too bad as I knew three of the boys from school. I can remember that for my first game I was nervous but excited to actually be playing my first real match. At the end of the season we had a 'finals fun day', as they don't play finals in that age-group, and I won the 'Best On Ground' medal which was probably the highlight of my season.

I played three more seasons in the WRFL with St Bernards, and was given the chance to play in most positions. For all four seasons I was the only girl in the team, however most of the boys just treated me like one of them. Occasionally when new boys came to the club it would take them a bit of time to get used to playing with a girl, but they eventually started to treat me like any other player. The highlight of my time with St Bernards was winning the under-eleven & under-twelve Grand Finals.

This year I wanted to pursue both my hockey and football, so I had to change clubs so I could play football on Saturday and hockey on Sunday. I moved the Youth Girls League and it has taken me a bit of time to get used to playing against girls instead of boys. It's a lot different as it is a lower standard than the WRFL competition, but at the same time it gives me the chance to play in better positions and get more of the ball. The league is also an under-eighteens competition so there's a lot of bigger girls to play against which meant it was a little scary at first, but I'm quicker than most of them so it's not too bad. Hopefully this league will also be a pathway to make representative & state teams when I'm a little older.

Football is something I love playing and it's also good for me. I think it is important that girls are given the chance to play, either in the WRFL or the Youth League as football is a sport that can be enjoyed by both girls & boys. It was great that St Bernards took me onboard as their only female player, and I hope more girls will follow my lead and play junior football in our league.

**T**here have been few better starts to the 2011 season than the goal-kicking display put on by Deer Park playing-coach James Condos. As for Condos it appears that his signing was in reality a much bigger coup than the likes of Cloke heading to Spotswood, or Henneman ending up at St Albans.

Off the field the younger players are already looking up their coach who has already experienced so much in the game, and on the field his individual performances are starting to rub off on the playing group with improved performances across the board.

With 43 goals from four games and twelve matches still remaining in the regular home & away season, the club is excited at what the coming months will hold, both for Condos in front of goal and for the side as they push for their second premiership in three years and promotion to the top flight.



# UMPIRES CORNER

## News From The Umpires' Association





“All the sponsors down there are getting behind us because there’s a lot of work happening on and off the field and to have the support of him and other sponsors it’s been really fantastic.”

Elso said the donation, plus the Werribee Football Club grant of \$23,000 it recently received as part of the Sports Assist Program, has given the Falcons a real boost.

“It’s just fantastic and it just inspires people as well to have faith in the way our club’s run and to send their kids down there. Life’s pretty tough and sport, doesn’t matter what sport, keeps kids from getting into mischief.”
