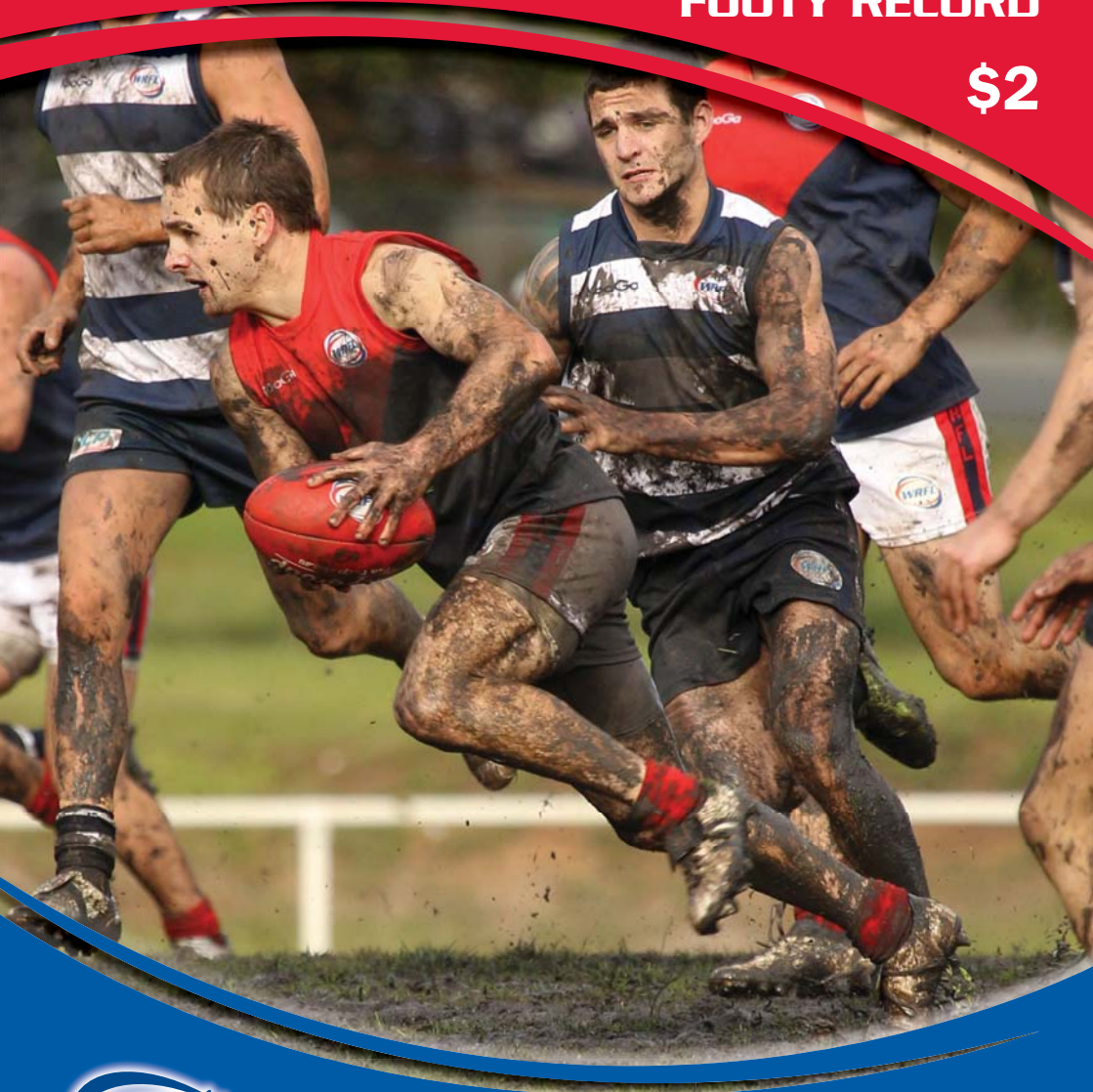

Similarly spectators should be encouraging players to play according to the rules, and to demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or officials.

If spectators adhere to the points above, they will be doing their part in ensuring the kids running around in our junior competitions are enjoying their time spent playing football on a Sunday, and most importantly for the league, will continue playing week-in, week-out, for years to come.

Off-Field Development Key To Laverton's Success

Sometimes we underestimate the role of a coach, and the impact they can have on each individual outside of the football environment. At Laverton, Senior Coach Justin Moran is quick to acknowledge the responsibility he has in his role, to not just lead the Magpies on the field but to help the team develop as well rounded individuals. Several initiatives throughout this season were established for exactly this purpose, and one of those was to engage the services of a Life Coach who did a number of sessions with the Senior Team and who has come on board to sponsor a couple of the players.

Moran said the involvement of Stuart Harrison, of Corporate Healers, has been invaluable to the club both on and off the field.

"It was fantastic to have Stuart come on board as a club partner and sponsor and offer his services," said Moran.

"What we are trying to build as a club is an environment where all of our players are exposed to skills/seminars/education and experiences that will help build them as better people and equip them with opportunities to develop as individuals away from footy."

The initial session was offered to Laverton players, partners, supporters & officials after training back in February, and anyone in attendance had the opportunity to become one of the sponsored individuals for one-on-one life coaching sessions for twelve months.

"The topic was on what life coaching was all about and gave anyone that attended some valuable information on ways to look outside the square on where they were heading and wanted to head with their work, career, life, relationships, etc," said Moran.

"It was very well received and a great success with more than forty individuals in attendance."

There were a number of players that expressed interest in being selected, and then Moran, Harrison & the coaching staff worked from a well set-out criteria on who would be selected. Moran knows the initiative has plenty of positive benefits, and is quick to point out the benefits.

"Stuart has helped add to our club which is all about giving back to the players and helping them... he has been fantastic!"

Harrison said he was pleased to get involved with a football club and that the sponsored players were definitely benefiting from his services.

"Both players are progressing well and Both have established clear and concise coaching plans based around their personal areas for development," said Harrison.

"After 4 sessions both have showed strong growth in the development of both self awareness and functional life skills. It's a pleasure working with the boys as they are both committed and engaged to their self development. They are eager to learn and as such have responded well to the reflective nature of the coaching program"

The Life Coaching program is just another great initiative from Senior Coach Moran, and he has plenty more in the pipe works.

"We also have scheduled later in the season a financial planning seminar and a couple of other topics that we will roll out in the hope of player welfare and development," said Moran.

"The more that we can provide for our players, the more they feel valued and it is a win-win that will keep building our club culture and direction and our on-field results will continue to improve!"

LIONS ON TRACK FOR PROMOTION

Deer Park Firm As Premiership Favourites

Deer Park's mission to play Division One footy next year could not be going any better. Granted, it's early days, but with an average winning margin of 121 in its first six games, the Lions have announced themselves as the most damaging team in the Division Two competition, and the early favourites to take the flag.

Lions president Mark McGoldrick said the plan was for Deer Park to be in the top flight by 2013 at the latest, but next year was the ideal scenario.

"If we're not quite good enough we'll make sure over the summer months that we fix the weaknesses."

Deer Park had the opportunity to move up to Division One after winning the 2009 Grand Final, but opted to stay back. It meant West Footscray, which was on the receiving end of regular thumpings in the top division, was denied the opportunity to play in the more suitable Division Two competition. But McGoldrick said Deer Park was far from ready to step up. The Lions defeated Parkside by 21 points in the grand final, but were not the best team throughout the season.

"The important thing was that when we did win that premiership we didn't have Under 18's at the time, but we had a full group of Under 16's down, and our seconds were hardly competitive," said McGoldrick.

"Just because we were the best team for two hours on that Sunday afternoon didn't warrant us being an 'A' Grade club. Our five-year plan was based on our juniors coming through the grades."

This season the seconds are sitting on top and the under-18s have only lost one game. Undoubtedly a major part of Deer Park's early success this year has been a result of star recruit James Condos, who has bagged 58 goals in six games.

Condos, a former Werribee footballer who was rookie listed by the Western Bulldogs in 2003, has come on as co-coach with his father Nick and has thrilled crowds with his complete dominance of the competition.

The full-forward said McGoldrick was relentless in his pursuit of his signature.

"Mark head-hunted me halfway through last year and I wasn't interested at the start but after a couple of calls and a couple of meetings I was happy to take the job on board with my father," Condos said.

"The main objective was to coach with my father and it was a good opportunity, they had a good list and obviously I could attract a few players which I have, and the recruiting side of things has been pretty good."

The decision to have a bench and playing coach looks to have been a good one.

"Come game day I pretty much worry about playing and forward structures, and they pretty much take care of the rest," Condos said.

The 28-year-old has drawn from his experiences playing at a higher level to instil a new level of professionalism into the players.

He has also used his VFL, EDFL and Bendigo league contacts to recruit like-minded players who won't take any short cuts in their quest for success. These players include Leigh Cook, Nigel Hill, Dean Stankovic, Robert Trajkovski and Christian Day.

"The boys who have jumped on board have all played a higher standard of footy and ... we haven't gone in with a Division 2 mentality," Condos said.

"From all the experience we've brought into the club we're trying to stamp that authority on the boys, which we have over pre-season, so as soon as the boys adapt to that I'm sure that it will be better long term for the football club, players development, juniors, throughout the whole club."

McGoldrick said the inclusion Condos, and the senior side's blistering form, had led to the surge in spectators this year.

FROM WRFL TO AFL

Brett Ritchie Earns Senior Debut

Like most juniors involved in the game, Brett Ritchie has always aspired to be involved at the highest level possible. Even back as a teenager running around on a Sunday afternoon in the Western Region Football League, Ritchie had dreams of one day taking to the field in an AFL fixture – and after a long involvement with the game, and progressing through the TAC Cup & VFL ranks, Ritchie finally made his AFL debut on Easter Sunday. It was a moment that Ritchie recounts as undoubtedly the most memorable of his career, and one that he hopes will inspire plenty more juniors involved in the game to follow his path.

However despite taking the conventional local football, TAC Cup, VFL to AFL pathway, Ritchie's story is a little more unique. Ritchie after all, is an umpire, and he hopes that his progression through the ranks will start to pave the way for junior umpires in the western suburbs of Melbourne to progress through to the highest level.

First introduced to the umpiring fraternity during an umpire skills session at school, Ritchie quickly took a liking to the officiating side of the sport and followed then WRFL Umpire Ian Grossman's suggestion to visit a local umpiring group to see if it was something he wanted to pursue.

"I really loved the environment, the people were very welcoming & they were able to put me and my family at ease with their comprehensive introduction into umpiring," said Ritchie.

Ritchie started out as a boundary umpire back as a 13 year-old, and ran the boundary for two seasons before making the switch to field umpiring. After another couple of years



officiating junior & senior fixtures, Ritchie received an invitation to trial at state level and then as a 17 year-old was accepted onto the VFL Development Panel to umpire TAC Cup & VFL Reserves games.

"As you can imagine at the age of 17 it made it rather hard to get to and from training & some of the various venues around Victoria," said Ritchie.

"Unfortunately, as a result of this, I was delisted from the VFL in the following and I came back to the WRFL to continue my development and to get my other commitments in order so that I could continue to further my umpiring career."

Like most players involved with the game, it was this delisting which gave Ritchie a reality check, and another year of hard work saw the then 19 year-old accepted back into VFL ranks and led to his selection for the TAC Cup Grand Final.

The following year Ritchie received another notable selection by joining the VFL Senior Umpiring Team, and throughout his

involvement at this level officiated over eighty VFL games, including the VFL Reserves Grand Final (2007), and VFL Grand Finals in 2009 & 2010. After excelling at this level Ritchie was offered an AFL Rookie Contract, and then in 2011, obtained a full contract as an AFL umpire. Then, on Easter Sunday this year, Ritchie fulfilled his lifelong ambition of umpiring an AFL fixture, as Richmond hosted North Melbourne at the MCG.

“As you can imagine it was a very proud and memorable moment for me in my umpiring career and words cannot describe how humble I am to be given the opportunity to officiate in what I believe is the world’s greatest game,” said Ritchie.

“Hopefully this is the first of many games for me!”

“My pathway through umpiring has been very enjoyable. I have met some amazing people

along the way and made friends that I will have for life. There are so many individuals that have assisted with my development as an umpire, and their professional guidance and support is why I am now running around at such an elite level.”

“My advice to those who want to make it to the elite level is simple - there are people out there who are willing to provide you with advice to help you succeed, so take on that advice & put it into practice.

“I have followed this philosophy throughout my umpiring career, and I am proof that listening to others will assist you, whatever level you reach! Listen, Learn & Enjoy!”

“I am a passionate supporter of umpiring as it is one of the best things I have done in my life and I encourage all those who have considered umpiring to give it a go!”

UMPIRES CORNER

News From The Umpires' Association

Every Wednesday night after training the umpires gather en masse in their rooms at Scovell Reserve. The canteen is kept fairly busy and then everyone finds a seat for the usual lecture. It generally goes for no more than thirty minutes and deals with various issues related to umpiring. Most of the time the information is for field umpires.

For those that attend it is just Shane Carland standing up out the front and giving a lecture about field umpiring while using the whiteboard to demonstrate positioning. Only a few people know that Shane actually puts in a fair amount of planning beforehand. He even types up his notes, which are quite detailed, and ones in which he follows closely.

One week the lecture was about umpires switching on at the right times in a match and not narrowing their vision by becoming too close to the play. It is important for umpires to be able to view the whole contest and not just the player who has possession of the ball or who is about to take possession of the ball.

Another week the lecture concentrated on trigger points which are necessary for field umpires to

understand and to put into practice during games. Trigger points allow the umpire to get into the correct position or to move quickly in order to take control.

Boundary umpires have had a few meetings at other times during the year in order to discuss various issues related to their discipline. They are coached out on the training track to improve their skills and understanding of their responsibilities during games.

The goal umpires have a weekly meeting, prior to Shane's talk, where they have a brief ten minute lecture on aspects of goal umpiring given by Graeme Hodgart. There is always an opportunity for the goalies to ask questions or to discuss issues that may have risen during the games of the previous weekend.

Not only are the WRFL umpires improving their fitness out on the training track but they are developing their understanding and knowledge of the rules and how to apply them correctly in games. Hopefully individual umpires in the WRFL will continue to learn and improve and develop their skills as they officiate in football games at the grass roots level.

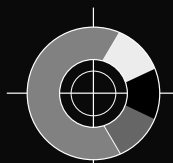

'MATES PROGRAM' ENTERS SIXTH YEAR

Local Umpires Forge Partnerships With AFL Elite

The AFL Victoria Umpire 'Mates Program' is now in its sixth year of operation, and continues to give up and coming local umpires the chance to develop their umpiring with the assistance of an AFL umpire.

The program pairs promising field umpires from the seven senior metropolitan umpiring groups, including the WRFL, with AFL listed umpires and creates opportunities for the exchange of knowledge and help with the personal development of these young umpires in their progression through the umpiring ranks towards the AFL.

Launched in April, the program this year features seven AFL umpires including Michael Jennings, Hayden Kennedy, Heath Ryan, Troy Pannell, Stephen McBurney, Shane McInerney and Rob Findlay. The AFL umpires will liaise with their selected local umpires during the year via phone and in person to help their development throughout the season.

The various AFL umpires have different aims for their particular umpires via the mates program. Troy Pannell believes the program is not all about skills the umpires need to learn on the field.

"One of the key lessons is the importance of enjoying umpiring to start with. If you don't really enjoy it, and your heart and mind are not really into it, it is better to pursue other areas or other goals.

"Skills will include developing relationships and a strong work ethic – which employers also look for coming through being a young person. More life based skills rather than just umpiring. If you take on board the life based skills the umpiring tends to follow a little bit as well," Pannell said.



Umpire Rob Findlay's focus to his umpires is the pathway he used to progress to the AFL.

"I want to give them an understanding of my pathway through umpiring from local levels right through the VFL to the AFL.

"To give them an understanding of what the expectations are of umpiring as you move up through those ranks and what they have to do to get through to AFL level if that is what they want to do."

Both umpires strongly believe in the mates program and the benefits it can have for the umpires involved. While they did not have a similar program back when they were making their way through the umpiring ranks, they did acknowledge the people that helped them on their journey.

For Pannell, a visit by AFL umpire Darren Goldspink stuck with him as he progressed through to the AFL, only for Pannell to one day umpire an AFL game with Goldspink once he had reached the highest level. He hopes to help his umpires in a similar way through the mates program.

"I have been doing it for the last two years, and obviously I had heard from the guys that had been there and done it prior to me taking it

on that they had got a lot out of it teaching the younger guys about footy and life.

“I thought it would be good to be a role model in umpiring and give something back and help them out with their pathway.”

Rob Findlay mentioned the coaches that invested time in him as a young umpire as a reason why he wanted to give something back via the mates program.

“I have had a lot of people put a lot of time into my umpiring development ... there have been a heap of coaches on the way up that have helped me to get to where I am in umpiring. I would not be where I am if not for them.

“I feel like I should put something back in to the careers of other people as well. Where I started in the DDJFL I had a great coach in Hughey Moore and the environment he created was one where you embrace umpiring and really taught me a lot.

By being part of the program, Findlay has started to think back over the skills he learnt when starting out.

“I keep on thinking about the level 1 and 2 fundamentals that we learnt - they give you a great grounding in umpiring but you don’t tend to focus on that much as you go up through the ranks,” Findlay said.

“You tend to focus on the big picture items like the decision making aspects rather than the skills to get yourself into the right position to make those decisions so it reminds me of the things I learnt when I grew up and gives you more perspective on the things you need to work on.”

Junior umpires Joel Page and Billy Mitchell are excited about their opportunity this year to be part of the Mates program.

“I was pretty happy as I knew I would learn a lot. I would like to learn more specific details such as fitness out of training, diet, sleeping patterns and that type of stuff, Page said.

Mitchell had similar aims from the program.

“I was pretty excited (to be selected), and I thought it would be a good experience and something I would remember and would hopefully help me on my journey to where I am going to go with my umpiring.

“I would like to learn from Troy the way you speak to players and the way you go about your game. We have spoken about a game plan which will be good to learn about how he (Troy) goes about his game each week,” Mitchell said.

Program which was an idea we derived from a similar successful incentive program ran by a sporting venue in Sale," said Shelton.

"As The Tigers Clubhouse is a community Club and the Social Venue of the Werribee Football Club we have always sponsored local sporting clubs for various sums of money over the previous years with the agreed understanding that these clubs would support us as their 'local' and preferred entertainment venue."

"By implementing The Tigers Sports Assist Program we are able to recognise & reward the local Clubs that have supported us. We have had an excellent relationship with the Wyndhamvale Falcons Football Club over the past two years with a sponsorship deal of \$4000 per year so we are absolutely delighted to award them a cheque this year for \$23,000."

"Similarly The Werribee Bears Rugby Club who had a sponsorship deal with us for \$2000 and now will receive \$15,000 from their participation in the Tigers Sports Assist Program which was as simple as coming to the Club for a beer after their home matches."

Western Region Football League CEO, Mr Bob Tregear, said the sponsorship scheme would contribute some vital funds to several WRFL clubs based in the Wyndham region.

"For many clubs securing sponsors every season can be a tough task, so to have a local business offering to share such a significant amount of sponsorship amongst local clubs is fantastic," said Tregear.

"Wyndhamvale has benefited greatly from the promotion, and there is no reason why other clubs in the region can't do the same."
