

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE

From The Chief Executive Officer

Given the events of the past week as covered extensively in media reports, it is timely to issue a reminder to all club officials of the limited provisions for non-playing personnel to enter the field of play.

WRFL Regulations 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 specify the limited circumstances where persons other than players and officiating umpires are permitted to enter the field of play:

Regulation 10: There is no provision for coaches to enter the field (except in Under 9 & Under 10 games – refer to Regulation 14, Modified Rules). Clearly, coaches must not enter the field except at quarter breaks. Attention is also drawn to Regulation 50.2, Coaches Box – White Line, which requires coaches to remain behind a white line drawn one metre outside the boundary line immediately in front of the coaches box. Indeed, all personnel permitted to occupy the coaches box must remain behind that line.

Regulation 11: Permits approved trainers to enter the playing field for the sole purposes of attending to injured players, officials or umpires; or delivering drinks to players or umpires.

Regulation 12: Permits official water persons to enter the playing field for the sole purpose of delivering drinks.

Regulation 13: Permits official runners to enter the playing field for the sole purpose of performing duties specified for runners and subject to the direction of all umpires.

Regulation 14: Permits coaches on the playing field in Under 9 and Under 10 games, subject to conditions.

WRFL official umpires are subject to instruction from the Umpires' Manager that games are to be abandoned where the presence of unauthorised persons on the playing field is seen to represent a safety risk to players, officials or the public.

Only official trainers are permitted to attend to injured players on the field of play. Obviously, umpires will exercise discretion in the event of emergency/serious injury. In any event, any person attending to an injured player must not interact in any way with other players, team officials or umpires.

LOCAL LEGENDS

A Western Region Football League Regular Feature

TEDDY BELAYNEH is a local legend. He migrated to Australia from Sudan five years ago and at the time knew nothing about Australian Rules football. In fact at the time, the then 18 year-old couldn't even speak a word of English.

Fast forward to now and the 23-year-old is a competent Western Region Football League senior umpire and an ambassador of the Western Bulldogs Football Leadership and AMES football programs.

Mr Belayneh was born and grew up in Sudan after his family was forced to leave Ethiopia due to political tensions.

When he came to Australia, Ms Belayneh immediately enrolled in an AMES English course and the following year, a support worker from the Footscray Youth Housing Group suggested he try out for a youth AFL Umpiring Project.

The project aims to get youths from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds in the West into umpiring.

Mr Belayneh was one of seven youths to show up to that first training session and now umpires Under 18 and Division One games every Saturday, and Under 14's & 16's every Sunday.

"At the moment I am the only person among the trained umpires who continued to umpire and as far as I know, I am the only umpire of Ethiopian origin in Victoria, if not in Australia," said Belayneh.

"I enjoy being an umpire. I think this is due to the support and encouragement I receive from the umpiring group."

"I am happy to say that since I started working as an umpire, many youths have been motivated to join different footy clubs."

However one thing that he won't be doing anytime soon is playing the game himself.

"When I play, I kick the ball like it's a soccer ball and I'm not used to the tackles," said Belayneh.

DES BARNARD is a local legend. He is the type of person who makes sporting clubs great. His passion for the St Albans Football Club is undeniable, as is his love of the area. Barnard has been a St Albans resident since 1950 and wouldn't have it any other way.

"I have a lot of pride in this area," the sporting icon said. "A lot of people put it down, that's why I have always worked so hard to improve the facilities we have. So our kids have something to be proud of."

From 1984 to 1996, Barnard was the president of the successful football club and for the past decade has been the general manager. His many honours include life-membership of the St Albans Football Club & St Albans Sports Club, Recognition of Service Medallion by the Victorian Metropolitan Football League and he was inducted into the St Albans Football Club Hall of Fame last year. So revered is he, that there is even a room named after him at the sports club.

His hard work and perseverance has made the club one of the most thriving sporting facilities in the area, as it boasts amenities that many other local clubs could only dream of.

"I was determined to have a successful club for the kids. It's especially important in an area like this. Kids aren't participating in sport enough, we need to encourage it and get them off the street."

However the 2006 Brimbank Citizen of the Year is reticent to receive accolades, but has vowed to continue to keep fighting for his beloved club.

"Sometimes you get to the stage when you think you can't do this anymore, but someone has to do it and it's a terrific feeling when you're successful."

His fervour for the area has never waned in 28 years.

"Everything is what you make of it. It's unfair that we get bad publicity, when so many good things happen here."

TOUGH BREAK FOR TALENTED YOUNGSTER

St Bernards Junior Upbeat Despite Freak Accident

Young Tom Comerford has had his fair share of knocks on the footy field. The gutsy 12 year-old is often referred to as the serial pest as despite his size he is always first to a contest. He is an everywhere player, putting himself in every contest, and racking up contested possession after contested possession.

However last month this in-and-under style of play took its toll on the diminutive footballer. Playing for the St Bernards Under-14's, Comerford was involved in what is best described as a freak accident. The youngster got his legs tangled with an opponent while trying to gain possession, and as he fell in the contest his femur snapped in two pieces.

It was a horrific accident, and Comerford was rushed straight to hospital to be operated on immediately. A rod with two screws was inserted into his femur, and the soon to be teenager now faces the stark reality of learning to walk again.

Leading Physiotherapist & Western Region Football League sponsor, Justin McEvoy of Physio Health, said Comerford's recovery will be a long process but is hopeful the talented junior will return to his playing best.

"Tom will have to gradually start bending his knee, learn to fully weight bear and gradually walk again," said McEvoy.

"After he achieves this he will need to perform strengthening exercises for his quadriceps, hamstrings, gluteals and calf muscles. As he gains strength and the bone begins to knit he will be able to start running in straight lines, and gradually start running drills and changing direction."

"At this stage he will have the 'intermedullary rod' and two large screws removed from his femur (after six months). This will set him back a couple of weeks before he continues to further strengthen his leg. During this phase he will be performing proprioceptive exercise to improve coordination and balance. The femur will reach 98% of full strength within 1 year and 100% in 2 years."

A talented junior, Comerford grew up in Strathmore and played his first four years of competitive football with the local Strathmore Football Club. Achieving great success in his early days, Comerford was



part of an EDFL premiership winning side in 2008 and won two best-and-fairests in his time at the club, before transferring over to St Benards at the beginning of the 2010 season.

Many former & current teammates have been quick to wish Comerford a speedy recovery, and Western Region Football League CEO, Bob Tregear, was one of many to lend support to the talented junior.

"From all accounts Tom is a very gifted footballer, and we look forward to seeing him back playing in the WRFL in 2012," said Tregear.

"All the staff at the ground should be commended on following the structures & procedures the league has in place to deal with these types of incidents – and everyone at the WRFL wishes Tom a speedy recovery."

Despite the injury Comerford is upbeat about his recovery and was quick to thank those who helped him on the day.

"I am grateful for all the people who have given me the support and help when I was in need," he said.

"I am now counting down the minutes until I can run out onto that field again."

Clubs Voice Thoughts On TV Rights Deal

Key football figures have rejected suggestions the AFL's \$1.253 billion TV rights deal will hurt crowd numbers at suburban games, but local clubs are singing a different tune.

From 2012, Foxtel will show all nine games live each week, while Channel 7 will broadcast three games live and one on delay.

With so much AFL on TV, there is potential for the casual local observer to opt for an afternoon on the couch. This would be bad news for suburban clubs, who generate a significant portion of their revenue on match days.

But Western Region Football League CEO Bob Tregeary said there is no reason why fans can't still get their local and AFL footy fix.

"I don't think it's going to have any impact on community football attendances," Tregeary said.

"Everybody was worried when they started televising Saturday and Sunday games that it was going to upset community football, but what's actually happened is they've spread it over Friday night, Saturday afternoon, Saturday night, Sunday and Monday.

"It's actually been the best thing that's ever happened to us. You don't have to make a choice between AFL and community football anymore."

Essendon District Football League (EDFL) general manager Marc Turri said the blockbuster AFL games do impact on crowds, citing the clash between traditional rivals Essendon and Carlton on 16 April as the most recent example.

"Other than that, attendances have been pretty good in the current AFL climate and I don't expect that to change significantly once the new rights deal begins, simply because there is more live football," Turri said.

"The impact will come more from who is scheduled to play in the Saturday afternoon timeslot, rather than the fact that there is a game.

"At present, Foxtel will be the only broadcaster showing live Saturday afternoon football

and only about 30 per cent of households have Foxtel."

Turri said local leagues will hope the AFL continues to schedule big-drawing matches on Friday and Saturday nights.

Spotswood president Chris Murphy conceded the rights deal will have "some impact" on crowds and called for a deal to be established allowing local clubs to have Foxtel installed in their clubrooms at a cheaper rate.

Wyndhamvale president John Willaton also claimed it will have an impact, while North Footscray president Warwick Lucas conceded times had simply changed.

"It's not like the old days where there was footy on a Saturday afternoon and if you didn't go to AFL, you went to local footy. These days, there is just too much on," Lucas said.

But Deer Park president Mark McGoldrick is confident crowds will continue to flock to suburban games.

"I don't think it will have an impact. The AFL is doing us a favour by charging \$10 for a beer and \$8 for a pie. We charge \$4 for a beer and \$3 for a pie," he said.

"Our revenue has certainly tripled in the last four years and we've grown as a club as well, but a lot of people are coming back to local footy."

Williamstown general manager Brendan Curry said the new agreement will not affect VFL crowd numbers, and that the Seagulls did not rely heavily on revenue from the gate.

AFL Victoria general manager Grant Williams said: "Despite all AFL matches being available live on TV, the trend of supporters venturing out and cheering on their local team should continue."

He added that the money gained from the TV rights was expected to be invested in Auskick, multicultural, schools, female, Indigenous and other programs.

CLUBS CALL FOR CASH

Locals Want AFL Money To Benefit Suburban Footy

Suburban football clubs in the West believe they deserve a slice of the AFL's \$1.253 billion TV rights deal.

Western Region Football League clubs have made it clear they need extra assistance in the highly competitive suburban sports environment. Countless volunteers work long hours to keep their clubs afloat and the call is simple – clubs, and their members, want more money to aid them in remaining viable.

Spotswood president Chris Murphy is adamant a portion of money delivered to AFL Victoria from the deal should be shoved in to the WRFL's coffers, not distributed to individual clubs, to ensure equality.

The cost of affiliation fees – on top of equipment and uniform costs and player payments – is a bugbear for suburban sides.

And clubs believe they are not receiving adequate funding from outside sources, with requests for grants often denied.

“If it (extra money) was utilised at the league level, it's a more even balance for all the clubs benefiting from it,” Murphy said.

“We struggle at times and I'm sure every club is in the same boat. We're probably fortunate we have some very good sponsors on board.”

While the focus for most clubs is building a strong senior team, a thriving junior program is equally important.

Deer Park president Mark McGoldrick said that while his club charges just a \$100 fee to junior players – which he believes is the cheapest in the area – it is also often forced to remunerate a member to head up the junior program.

According to McGoldrick, money gained from the TV rights deal should be used to deduct affiliation fees, which would help ease the burden on struggling clubs.

He said this was the most logical and fair solution. “I think to get those deducted across the board would obviously help the clubs,” McGoldrick said.

“I think the best way would be for the AFL to put in and finance a person to work for the WRFL through the AFL coffers. That would be the most common sense shortcut for the clubs to save money.”

Wyndhamvale president John Willaton said an upgrade of junior facilities and ice baths to assist the senior teams in their recovery are at the top of his wish-list.

“It's not easy to be competitive. It's more than difficult,” Willaton said.

“I think ice baths are something that clubs at our level haven't got. All clubs would be better off with them for recovery.

“There are a hell of a lot of areas where money would help, but every club has to operate to their budget I suppose and some clubs have got more of a budget than others.”

North Footscray president Warwick Lucas said simply surviving was an ongoing challenge.

The Devils were promoted to the WRFL Division One competition this season, but Lucas said the club had only experienced a small rise in crowd numbers.

“Anywhere we could get money from would be good,” he said.

“It gets harder every year. Finding sponsors is harder, getting membership (fees) out of players and getting money into the club gets harder every year.

“It's not like the old days where you go up and ask someone if they can sponsor the club and they hand over money. You've got to build partnerships now rather than just sponsorships.”

Lucas said player payments also put a dent in any revenue gained.

“It just seems that the player payments get more extravagant every year and we just can't keep up with that.”

Hoskin-Elliott Impresses Abroad

Quietly spoken Will Hoskin-Elliott lets his football do the talking.

The Western Jet, who is eligible for this year's national draft, was a member of the 30-man AIS-AFL Academy squad that visited Europe recently.

The European side produced a brave effort against the Australian under-17s but were ultimately overwhelmed in the game on 23 April.



"I thought they were all right. They had heaps of spirit and played as a team, but we just had more experience and beat them easily," Hoskin-Elliott said.

"I'll be trying out for Vic Metro, then back to the Jets and hopefully draft camp later in the year."

Kavanagh Hand-Picked For Exclusive Academy

Elliot Kavanagh will always have fond memories of his trip to Europe as a member of the AIS-AFL Academy.

The 17-year-old Western Jets midfielder did not take to the field for Australia against European Legion – made up of the most talented under-21 players from Great Britain, France and Germany – in London on 23 April.

“I haven’t really been on that big of a trip before. Over to Milan, London and then Turkey, it was a massive trip,” Kavanagh said.

“We spent a lot of time over there and it was beneficial for all the boys I think. It got us to bond together as well.”

Kavanagh was runner for the game against the European team.

“It was pretty disappointing not being able to play, but at least I got involved in some way, which was good.”

that determination and passion to work as hard as he could to come back and play the game he loved,” Kavanagh said. “I found that really inspirational when he told that story.”


Lloyd, a former Western Jet who was drafted to Essendon in the 1995 pre-season draft, also spoke to the players about rebounding from injuries.

Kavanagh also sang the praises of Italy’s AIS training facility.

“It was like a home away from home. There were cyclists staying there at the same time and everyone was professional in what they did. Everyone was taking it all in and they had a gym, internet access, pool room and good training facilities.

“I’d go and stay over there again if I had to. It was a great experience and we had a meeting room there and that sort of stuff, which was pretty handy for all of us I think.”

The 12-month AIS-AFL program is now over and, after playing one game for Vic Metro last year, Kavanagh is again eyeing a spot in the team for this season’s under-18 National Championships, which kick off on Sunday. “Hopefully I get a game for Vic Metro and I’ll take it from there.”

INJURY ENDS STELLAR CAREER

Danny Jacobs Retires From Football

Former AFL footballer Danny Jacobs has signaled an end to his footballing career after suffering a season-ending hamstring injury while playing for the Sunshine Kangaroos.

Jacobs tore his hamstring off the bone against St Albans back in Round Three, and a month into his recovery the Kangaroos have confirmed the former Hawthorn player will not make it back this season and will bow out of the game after a decorated career at both an elite & suburban level.

Danny's brother and Kangaroos coach Brett Jacobs said Danny had no niggles going into the St Albans clash, despite missing the previous game against Altona because of soreness. Previous scans showed no tear in the muscle.

"He trained well week leading into the St Albans game, he felt good in the warm up. It just went in the first quarter," Jacobs said.

"He's retired from footy now."

Danny suffered a similar injury at the Hawks seven years ago.

Sunshine has only had two wins from seven games this year – an early fail mark given its premiership credentials.

But Jacobs has not blamed injuries for Sunshine's underwhelming start to the season.

"Injuries aren't a massive problem at the moment, in the first two weeks we had a few guys out with injuries but since then we've been OK," he said.

Jacobs has not hit the panic button yet, but acknowledged a review of its goals this season could be on the cards.
