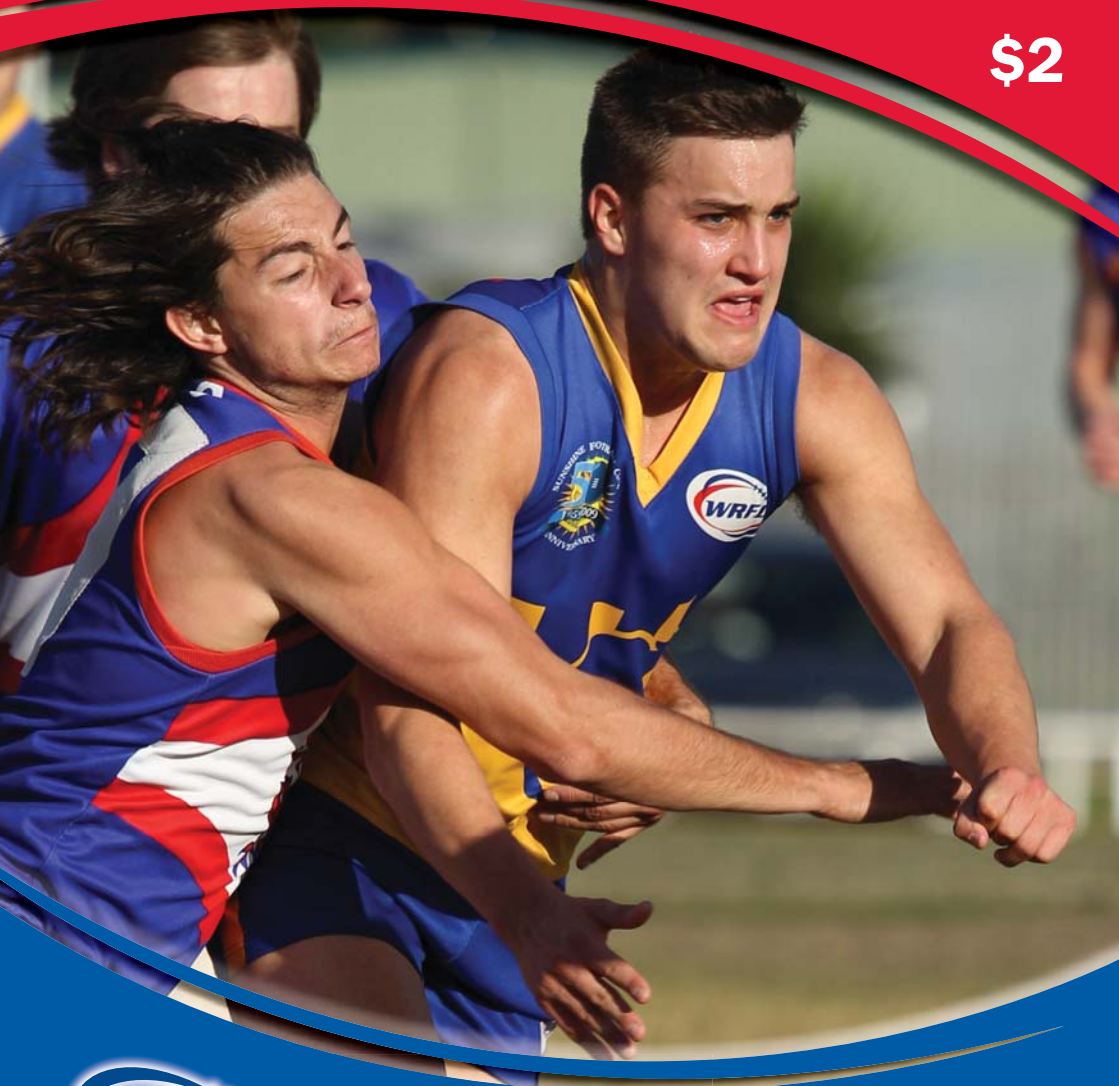

Taking over a reigning premiership side was always going to be a challenge but the playing group hasn't lost any of the hunger that is required to defend a title and that has been the biggest bonus so far this season.

We had lost 6-7 players that played in last year's grand final so the initial challenge was to work hard to replace them and we feel that we have achieved this so far.

To be sitting second on the ladder with seven wins proves the resilience of the playing group and we're pleased that the new players to our club have fitted in really well to achieve this result.

COACH ON THE MEND

Stephen Kelly Survives Mid-Game Heart Attack

As assistant coach of the Werribee Districts Under-Nine football team, 36-year-old Steven Kelly thought the most stressful part of his day would be standing in as a field umpire at the last minute for his side's clash against Old Westbourne. Little did he know that soon he would be fighting for his life.

Minutes into the first quarter, Kelly suffered a cardiac arrest while his wife Natalie & children Ashleigh & Dylan watched on. As the teams were ushered from the field, two other football fathers rushed to Kelly's aid. Country Fire Association firefighter Paul Turner and former Footscray & North Melbourne great Keenan Reynolds kept Kelly alive, administering CPR until paramedics arrived.

After having a pacemaker fitted, Mr Kelly has now been transferred to Sunshine Hospital where he will resume his rehabilitation. He will not be able to resume his casual employment as a storeman for at least three months, and will not be able to drive a vehicle for at least six months. Due to the casual nature of his employment, this means that the company he works for will not be able to hold his job for him. Nevertheless, he looks forward to getting back to coaching and spending time with his family, as well as watching his mighty Magpies continue to dominate in the AFL.

The Kelly family are incredibly thankful for everyone who has supported them through this tumultuous time, particularly to Turner and Reynolds, as without their initiative, Mr Kelly may not be with us today.

While it was a tragic incident, Kelly's heart attack did highlight the unpredictable



nature of suffering cardiac arrest. Werribee Districts President Rob Harrington has decided to act and learn from the experience, and the club has since purchased two life-saving, portable defibrillators, one for each ground they play at, at a cost of \$3,400. The Western Region Football League has praised the club's handling of the issue, with CEO Bob Tregear stating that the league would push for funding so that all clubs can have the portable life-saving devices.

Although a defibrillator is an invaluable life-saving device, the cost is still an extravagant one for a small suburban club. Therefore Werribee Districts are calling for donations and sponsorship to help offset the price of these machines. On the 1st July the club will be holding a fundraising Trivia Night at Soldiers Reserve. The night will be emceed by Tony Schibeci, with raffles & auctions to help raise funds. The club are also asking anyone who is interested in making a donation to the Kelly family to contact President, Rob Harrington.

UMPIRES CORNER

News From The Umpires' Association

It wasn't that long ago that the AFL introduced the Match Review Panel. Since its inception several years ago it has had more than a few controversial moments. The points system currently being used at the top level is another very interesting program and it has its supporters and its critics.

Before these recent innovative ideas were aired and then put into place, players and officials under scrutiny were made to appear before the tribunal. It was there that most things seemed to be pretty much straight forward and without needless red tape getting in the way. Of course, no system is perfect and even the VFL/AFL tribunal made a few decisions that had football supporters or media personalities crying foul.

At the WRFL, it's the old fashioned tribunal that hears cases against players and officials who are alleged to have crossed the boundaries of sportsmanship and committed an offence in breach of the rules necessitating a report being made by an umpire.

It is interesting to note that only a small percentage of players ever get to visit the tribunal and nearly half of them are there merely because they are a witness who is required to attend to give evidence. Many players go through an entire career and are never reported once.

It is part of an umpire's job, as listed in the Laws of Australian Football 2011, that he or she reports any player or official that is seen to commit a reportable offence. Unfortunately, not all offences are seen by umpires and occasionally a club will raise a matter with the WRFL and it may require an investigation.

Not many umpires enjoy reporting players for a number of reasons. Firstly, there is the paperwork to attend to which must be filled out properly. All umpires involved in the game are required to read and check the report

form to ensure that it is totally correct. Secondly, it's a night out down at Whitten Oval beginning at 6pm. If there are a few cases to be heard, the people involved may have to wait several hours before their case comes up. Thirdly, there are no 'brownie' points for reporting.

For those who have attended the WRFL tribunal this year, Brian Wilson from Parkside is usually in charge making sure that everyone is in attendance. When a case is called, all those involved go before the tribunal and the chairperson explains the procedure. Briefly, the charged player is asked how they plead to the charge and then the umpire gives their evidence. The tribunal, the umpire's advocate and the player's advocate can ask questions of the umpire. Then the player gives their version of the incident and questions can be asked by the tribunal and the advocates. The witness is then brought before the tribunal to give his evidence. Before he speaks, the chairperson asks him to speak the truth and reminds the witness that he can be reprimanded or suspended if the tribunal is not satisfied with his evidence. The witness can then be questioned by the tribunal and the advocates. All parties leave the room while the tribunal makes decisions about finding the player guilty or not guilty and what suspension, if any, it will impose. The witness and the umpire are free to leave at this point. The charged player and his advocate are then ushered back into the room to hear the decisions.

It's good to know that some weeks that there is no need for a tribunal because there wasn't a single report from the weekend's games. Let's hope that is the case in the WRFL for the majority of the rest of the season.

The tribunal members, plus Brian, should be thanked for their generosity in giving up their time and performing the task of sitting on the tribunal.

Three Jets Selected In Vic Metro Squad

Three Western Jets have been selected in the Vic Metro squad for this year's AFL Under-18 National Championships and region manager Shane Sexton is hopeful the trio will be in contention for positions on AFL lists later in the year.

Will Hoskin-Elliott and Elliot Kavanagh, both members of the most recent AIS-AFL Academy intake, were picked in the 40-man squad, along with silky midfielder Adam Kennedy.

Vic Metro claimed a thumping 80-point win against the NSW/ACT side in Sydney in the first match of the National Championships, but the three Jets were absent from the line-up.

North Sunshine product Hoskin-Elliott, 17, is eligible for this year's draft and has been in sparkling form across half-back and on a wing in the TAC Cup.

"I think he's an outstanding talent. He's a good all-round player, he's athletic, got terrific skills and reads the game very well," Sexton said.

"He's got the ability to read a game of footy in front of an opponent and that's a unique ability."

Kavanagh, who is also part of the AIS-AFL squad, is making his way back from a hamstring injury.

"It was a really serious injury that's been well treated. People were really conservative with his rehabilitation," Sexton said.

"That was important in terms of making sure a kid who could potentially be drafted to an AFL club this year – and we would like to think that can happen for him – doesn't get into an AFL career where he's got a chronic injury that will cause him grief."



Meanwhile, 19-year-old Kennedy, will be hoping to again impress the recruiters after being overlooked in the AFL and rookie drafts last year.

"We thought he was really unlucky not to get an opportunity at an AFL club last year," Sexton said.

"He could have gone in the draft or as a rookie and I think, on the basis of his form this year, AFL clubs are certainly having another look at him. He's a terrific kid with a terrific attitude, has a great work ethic and gets the best out of himself."

Sexton said it was almost impossible for a TAC Cup club to set a goal for how many players it wants drafted each year, citing the different needs of AFL clubs.

"Most are trying to find the best players they can in the draft, but they also might be looking to draft specific players."

"It's really a unique sport in that you can play at the highest level at any size, shape and be successful."

"The AFL recruiters watch all these games, they've got people there all the time, and they know what's going on and they know who they want to draft and what they want."

RACIAL ABUSE UNACCEPTABLE

AFL Victoria Statement On Incident

AFL Victoria today has acted to ban a spectator from entering VFL games unless he undertakes racial vilification awareness education in a move that reaffirms that racial vilification at any football game is totally unacceptable.

AFL Victoria will offer the spectator racial and religious vilification education. The spectator will also be refused entry to any VFL game for the rest of the season and will not be welcome back unless he undertakes the required education process and provides a written apology to Majak Daw.

The AFL Victoria decision comes after discussions with both clubs involved – Port Melbourne and Werribee Tigers, Victoria Police and the North Melbourne Football Club where Majak is a rookie-listed player.

AFL Victoria general manager Grant Williams said that behaviour of this nature was totally unacceptable at any football game.

“The public condemnation of the racial abuse towards Majak shows that as a society, we are not willing to accept this sort of behaviour, whether it is at the football, or in the general public.

“We do not want people who behave in this manner at our games. We have worked hard to ensure that all players from all cultures are welcome in our game and we will do whatever is required to ensure that they are free from any sort of on or off-field vilification,” Williams said.

“In many respects the response at the time and reactions since the weekend’s events suggest that our education programs are having an impact” Williams added.



“While we can remove this spectator from VFL games, the focus needs to be on educating not only the offender, but anyone attending our matches who thinks that it is okay to racially vilify players. It is not, and never will be, acceptable.”

AFL Victoria ensures that all players and officials take part in the AFL’s racial and religious vilification education program at the start of each year.

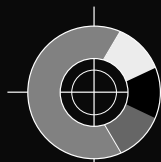
“We educate our clubs but in the future we need to work out ways to also educate the small minority of spectators who still don’t get the message that racial abuse is not part of our game.”

After speaking to Police and North Melbourne Football Club, AFL Victoria has confirmed that Majak will not be pursuing the matter any further.

AFL Victoria once again commends the Werribee and Port Melbourne Football Clubs for their quick response to the incident on the weekend.

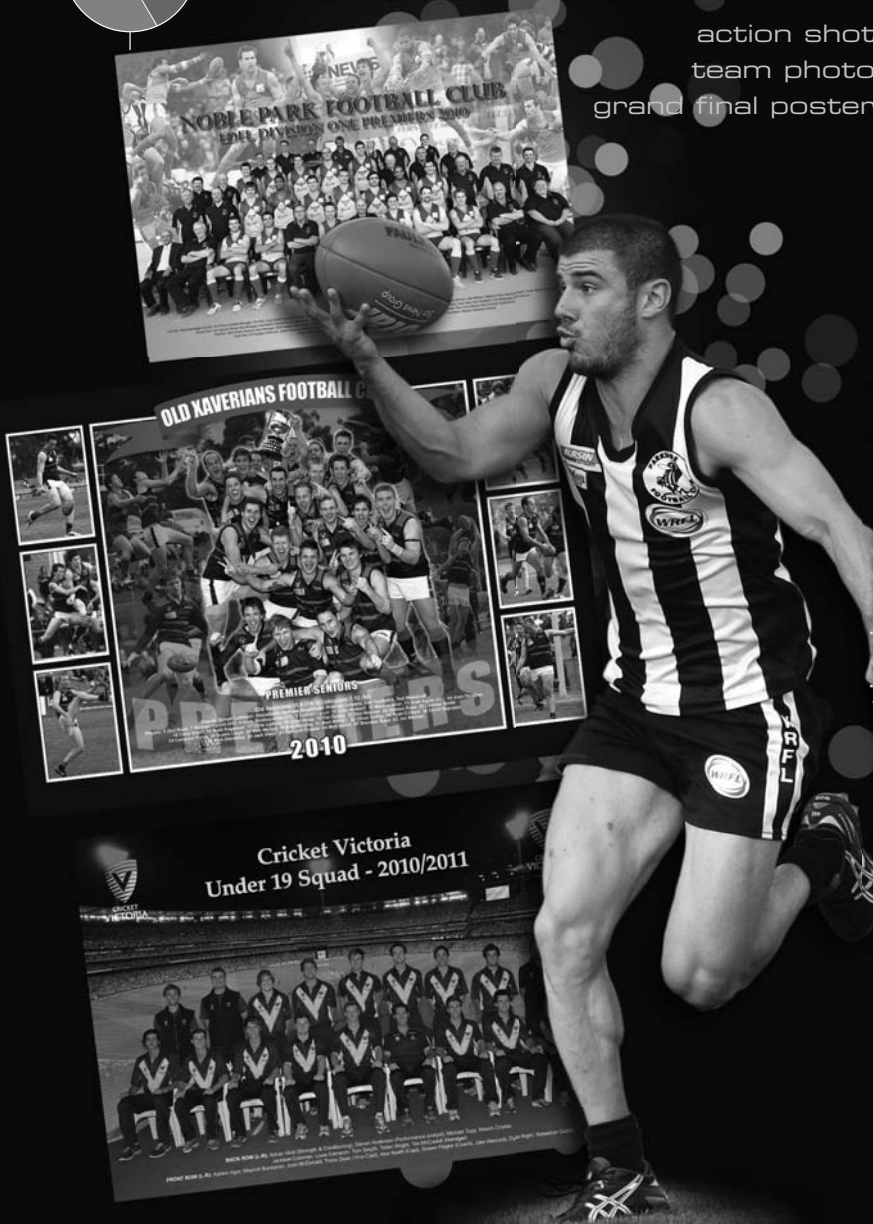
“Once both clubs were made aware of what occurred, they acted swiftly to ensure the offender was identified and approached straight away”.

SEAGULLS FLY INTO PRELIM

Williamstown Firm As Foxtel Cup Favourites

Williamstown will meet East Perth in the first semi-final of the Foxtel Cup after a six-goal second quarter set up the Seagulls' 19-point win over West Adelaide at AAMI Stadium.

The Seagulls led by only four points at quarter-time but surged in the second quarter to lead by 35 points by the main break of the quarter-final.

Although the Bloods showed more spirit in the second half (booting six goals to three in the last quarter), the Seagulls were too strong and ran out 15.6 (96) winners to North Adelaide's 12.5 (77).

Williamstown's side was loaded with players with AFL experience – 11 of the 22 had played at least one AFL game - and it was a critical factor with many of them playing pivotal roles in the win.

Omitted Western Bulldogs ruckman Ben Hudson was a key contributor with 13 possessions and 26 hit-outs, while former Essendon midfielder Ben Jolley led the way in the midfield with 22 disposals.

Luke Dahlhaus also continued his push for a debut with the Bulldogs with 19 possessions and ex-Sydney Swans' forward Patrick Veszpremi kicked two goals.

Jonathon Beech was West Adelaide's only shining light as the Bloods got knocked out of the competition. He kicking five goals from 11 disposals and six marks. Fortunato Caruso's line-breaking run was also vital and he finished with 15 disposals and two goals.

The game didn't go Williamstown's way from the beginning with the first quarter a tight affair punctuated by two late goals

to Williamstown by exciting forward Zephaniah Skinner.

His goals kick-started the Seagulls and in the second term they were able to finally capitalise on their early stranglehold of the game.

Williamstown – thanks to Veszpremi and Jason Tutt – kicked two goals in the opening three minutes and broke out to a 16-point lead. A third goal, rammed home by impressive 18-year-old Dahlhaus, shot the VFL powerhouse side out to a 21-point break.

The Seagulls kicked another three goals for the quarter and, despite the Bloods breaking the run with a goal, had extended the lead to almost six goals by the break.

The value of such a lead is even more important in the Foxtel Cup, where quarters are shortened to 18 minutes plus time-on.

Jolley had 15 disposals in the first half, while Ben Davies collected 11. Tutt and Matthew Panos kicked two goals in the second term for the Seagulls.

Williamstown's commanding second term was reflected in the statistics at half-time. It led the possession count by 45 and had restricted West Adelaide to only 89 disposals for the half. Steven Morris, with nine touches, led the Bloods' ball-winners.

The Bloods returned after the break much more competitive, kicking nine goals to six for the half, but the Seagulls had the game under control and sealed their progression to the next round of the inaugural state-based competition.

"Dad has also been a big part by putting a football in my hands from the day I was born and taught me a lot about the game."

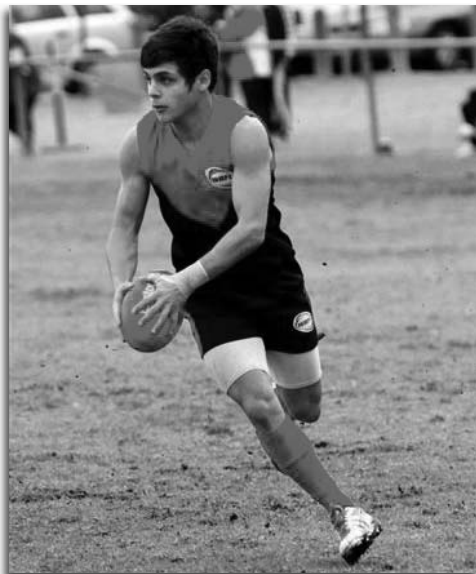
"The coaches at St Albans have also been a big influence, especially Gus Jimenez."

"Our biggest competitor this season is Altona and in our first game against them this season they were better on the day but I think we have all that it will take to match them on the field."

"We just got to stick to our style of play and believe in one another as a group and I think we can come away with the Holy Grail at the end of the season."

As for the future Panetas definitely has plenty of prospects, and there's no reason why he can't get onto a rookie list come 2013. If not, he's the sort of figure a club can base a senior list around – not just for his prowess on the ground, but for his work ethic at training, and leadership off the field.

A player who works as hard as Panetas surely deserves a shot at making it at an elite level, and if not, he'll be a WRFL player we'll be writing about for years to come.
