

# A POSITIVE APPROACH TO LOSING

Sometimes you watch AFL football and you can't help but think one side has no chance of beating another and the interest is how the team not expected to win approaches the game from a tactical and psychological aspect.

Publicly there is never a suggestion of not being able to win. There is always a slightly positive spin put out by the least favoured team based around such statements as 'if we play at our best and their below their best' or 'football is a funny game and anything can happen'. In many ways this is true and one of the beauties of sport is the upset victory.

This leads me onto another interesting topic to do with junior football and that is what happens when matches of football at junior level become lop-sided?

In professional sport winning is all that matters and winning by a lot helps when percentage is important. But in junior sport you have to argue do you press home the advantage or do you take advantage of the situation and make it fairer to both teams?

Whether grading is the sole answer is debatable, but whatever else we can do to create competitions which allow all teams to experience some success is, in my view, incredibly important.

If you are playing in a team which is thrashed every week then it becomes a disincentive for those footballers to either stay at that Club, or worse still, stay in the game. It tests coaches to make those children on the end of heavy defeats to have an involvement which is enjoyable.

They need to ensure training is enjoyable and the players are improving their skills and team play.

Everyone should be able to experience some success, even if it is at training.

It's impossible for a losing coach to do much. He could flood back and try and clog the opposition's forward line, but that isn't what we should be teaching them. So we need action from the coach of a dominant team.

Do they or their team really want to win easily? Maybe the coach could start by asking their players what they think. They may be surprised by their players' response.

A coach could change player's playing positions, so those who normally don't get on the forward line or in the midfield can. Those young players who tend to dominate can be tried elsewhere to learn a different role.

The coach can get the team to try new things, such as rotating players to new positions, setting purely defensive objectives, substituting their strongest players or playing numerically short. They state it is important to exercise compassion for the other team.

People will tell me losing is a part of life, but football isn't life. It is sport and a chance to have fun. Losing is a part of the game, but being thrashed does not serve any purpose for the winners or losers.

We need to remember that long term involvement is the key and playing sport no matter how competitive needs to be enjoyable, particularly for children who are coming into the game for the first few years, which are the most critical in determining whether they will continue in the sport.

# OUR JUNIOR ELITE

## *Two Local Umpires Selected For National Championships*

Training sessions, team selection, and match-day preparations are all run-of-the-mill circumstances in virtually any corner of the footy world. However they are all commonly associated with players, coaches and even medical staff, but rarely umpires. Even in the WRFL umpires are subject to rigorous training sessions and tough selection panels just to make it out onto the field - which therefore makes the success of two of our junior umpires, Stefan Bjelsovic and Melanie Thompson-Allen, even more remarkable. Both Bjelsovic and Thompson-Allen have been selected to represent Victoria at the 2011 Australian Schools Championships, becoming two of only six umpires from across the state to be selected for this nationwide event.

At sixteen years of age, Stefan Bjelosevic is a veteran in the field of umpiring. This is his fifth year in the job, having started when he was twelve, and it will be his second year representing Victoria at the National Championships. Although he has never been a serious footballer himself, he was a long-time volunteer umpire at his brother's Auskick clinic.

"The coach in charge suggested that I take it (umpiring) up as a pastime," says Bjelosevic.

"I was a bit hesitant at first, but when he provided me the number of the WRFL Umpiring Association manager the following week, I decided to give it a go, and haven't looked back since!"

Melanie Thompson-Allen, also sixteen, comes from a polar opposite sporting background to AFL. Having been a ballerina for ten years, Thompson-Allen decided to give umpiring a go when her friend's dad talked her into going into umpire training because they were short on females (when she started there were only three female boundary umpires in the WRFL).

Thompson-Allen, a boundary umpire, and Bjelosevic, a field umpire, train two nights a week at Scovell Reserve with the WRFL Umpires' Association, which include skill and theory sessions. Additionally they conduct their own cardio sessions, even during the off-season



between September and February, meaning that between official and unofficial training sessions as well as weekend match days, it's practically a seven-day job. In the lead up to the Championships their training load will increase, to include extra strength and fitness programs, as well as technical training, to ensure that they can handle almost any potential circumstance of play.

Thompson-Allen thinks many people would be surprised at the level of fitness required of a boundary umpire. Although on the surface it appears their main job is to determine how the ball came to be over the thin white line, at her first training session she found that she was in for a lot more than she bargained for.

"When fitness coach Terry McGarity said we were doing 3 warm up laps, 20 x 70- metre sprints and 10 strides, I thought he was joking," laughs Thompson-Allen.

"But surely enough he wasn't and I could almost swear he was smiling when I had finished. I think he likes to surprise people with the amount of fitness required for boundary umpiring."

To be selected to umpire at the National Championships, hopeful candidates had to

nominate themselves to Schools Sport Victoria, the body that controls state school sporting competitions. Bjelosevic and Thompson-Allen were then required to umpire six practice matches over a two-day period, which coincided with the Victorian Metro State Team was being selected. During this period of player selection, umpiring officials also observed the performances of participating umpires, and the six umpires travelling with the team were then selected.

The Australian Schools Championships will be held in Canberra in late July and although umpires' game allocations aren't decided until all delegations arrive in Canberra, Bjelosevic believes they are in for a relatively busy schedule.

"Last year we umpired 2-3 games per day, making for a pretty exhausting week," explains Bjelosevic.

Depending on the performance review of all umpires participating in the Championships, they will then have the chance to be selected to preside over the finals matches. In the 2010 competition, in his first year of umpiring at a national level, Bjelosevic was selected to take part in the tournament's Grand Final.

Although they may be seen as the untouchable upholders of the rules on field, in reality umpiring for Bjelosevic and Thompson-Allen is an honour rather than a job. Their trip to Canberra will cost the full time students in excess of \$1,900 from their own pockets.

To ensure the Western Region Football League would be represented at the Championships, the League Board recently decided to assist with part of the travel costs of the event. At a recent WRFL Executive Board Meeting, the board noted this significant achievement and resolved to contribute \$250 to both umpires to assist with those costs associated with the event.

Both Bjelosevic and Thompson-Allen are also running some fundraising initiatives in order to financially assist them in getting to the carnival. For more information please contact the WRFL.

# CENTURION CONDOS

## Playing-Coach Reaches Milestone

Deer Park playing-coach James Condos has become the first WRFL player to reach the 100 goal milestone this season.

Condos had 97 goals going into the Round 11 clash against Wyndhamvale and brought up the ton in the ninth minute of the first quarter – a sign of the new recruit's dominance of the Division Two competition this year.

Condos went on to kick four more goals in Deer Park's 108-point win, which kept the Lions on top of the ladder with a perfect 40 points.

Condos is the now the highest goalkicker in Australia this season. He overtook former leader and Omeo and District Football League player Macy Hambrook who has bagged 101 goals this season. Hambrook plays for Omeo-Benambra's Under-16 side, which had a bye on Saturday.

The AFL has compiled a list of the country's highest goalkickers across all leagues, with the



most prolific scorer winning a training session at their club hosted by Geelong premiership captain Tom Harley.

Condos's biggest bag this season was 19 goals against North Sunshine in Round Nine, although the gun forward had sixteen at halftime before dragging himself halfway through the third quarter. His lowest return was five goals against Yarraville Seddon back in Round One.

# KEY RETURN FOR ALBION

## *Butina Boosts Cats' Premiership Prospects*

**J**ason Butina could be the ace Albion needs to defend its premiership. But he is not expecting to instantly rediscover the X-factor he possessed before the crushing right ankle injury he sustained mid-way through the 2009 season, despite an impressive display against Spotswood on Saturday.

“I was absolutely shattered (when I got injured) because I love playing my sport, I played for years, and when that happened it was really hard to deal with but I just worked hard and tried to work my way back,” said Butina.

The journey back was longer than expected. If Butina’s recovery went to plan, he would have a premiership medallion, but the estimated 12 months recovery period ballooned to almost two years after doctors discovered two bones had fused, and he had to undergo surgery a second time.

Butina made his comeback via Albion’s reserves on 21 May and played his first senior game since 2009 on 18 June, enjoying a 118-point win against North Footscray.

Coach Marcus Barclay said a goal to Butina in the last quarter against the Red Devils was a significant moment.

“Every player on the ground congratulated him. I think North Footscray were thinking, ‘wait a minute, you’re 100 points up and you’re celebrating’. I think it was more just for him,” he said.

Barclay lauded Butina’s determination to make his way back into an Albion side jam-packed with talent.

“His training has been unbelievable. He would have to have run 1000 laps I reckon in the last four months. Fitness-wise, he’s fantastic. It’s almost like a new recruit for us.”



Butina won Albion’s best-and-fairest award in 2006, playing primarily as a midfielder, but he expects to play out the rest of this season up forward. A proven goalkicker, Butina will add another dangerous dimension to what is already a formidable forward line featuring Shaydon Bloomfield and Romain Grenville. But the man himself is just happy to be out on the park.

“I don’t mind pushing up forward around the wing, I’m just happy to be playing again, where ever they see a good fit for me I’ll be happy to play there.”

# UMPIRES CORNER

## *News From The Umpires' Association*

Each Wednesday night, the WRFL's umpires have a short meeting. It is held at Scovell Reserve and is usually attended by more than eighty of the league's running umpires. It starts at about 7:20 pm and goes for about thirty minutes.

Prior to the meeting certain activities have been held at the ground. At about 5 pm the cars begin to arrive and a slow trickle of umpires begins to walk towards the change rooms. At quarter past five Terry McGarity wanders out onto the ground with his arms full of brightly coloured witches hats. Strategically, he places them across the oval taking up the majority of the cricket playing field. These are set up for the field and boundary umpires who, after hitting the track at 5:45 pm, do a variety of stretches and then run, run and run over the next hour or more under the watchful eye of Terry McGarity with assistance at times from Dean Portelli and Paul Dimartino.

The goalies tend to stick to the confines of the soccer pitch although there have been times when they have been brave enough to venture a little further a field. At the same time as Terry McGarity is plotting a path for the speedsters and the plodders, another figure walks to the soccer pitch and distributes blue cones, skipping ropes, pink bouncy balls and a handful of flags. Graeme Hodgart, coach of the goalies, gives his charges a variety of exercises, running, walking, stretching and activities to help their fitness and sharpen up their skills.

The group of goalies begins their training on Wednesdays at 5:30 pm, although some have been out walking for ten or fifteen minutes beforehand, and finish at about 6:20 pm. At least once or twice the field and boundary umpires, much to the frustration of the flag wavers, make sure that they accidentally invade at least one section of the soccer pitch ignoring the sanctity marked out by the blue cones. (For those who have not been to Scovell, the field and boundaries use yellow, orange and white cones which are distinctly different to the dark blue variety.) After leaving the track and showering, the goalies' group has their own meeting in which they are lectured about aspects of goal umpiring. Questions are posed and answered in the twenty minutes that they meet

together. Then it's time to grab some food from the canteen and a drink and relax while the other umpires begin to come from the track and the showers and into the room and do much the same.

In the main 7:20 pm meeting, it's usually Shane Carland in charge, explaining various aspects of field umpiring and highlighting good and poor positioning and decision making. Shane usually finishes his talk by reading out the Division One appointments for the coming weekend.

Then there's the opportunity for Henry McFerran and Terry O'Donnell to pass on important information to the umpiring group. It may be in relation to tribunal matters or issues about rules or regulations that need to be addressed by the WRFL Umpires' Association. It's not always good news that they share but highlights, promotions and outstanding performances are often brought to the attention of all.

Then John Manikis, who is social secretary, conducts Powerball where one Gold Member of the WRFLUA is lucky enough to have his or her name drawn out to win a small cash prize. Social announcements are made and the drawing of the small raffle is a focal point of the night. The first prize is always a generous meat tray from Eddy The Butcher from Mason Street, Newport. This and many of the three or four prizes on the night are regularly won by goal umpires because they tend to buy the most tickets.

All the appointments for the weekend are then handed out to the umpires who begin to leave although there are those who like to stay and talk about umpiring, forthcoming games, social issues and the like. By 9 pm the last few officials are beginning to turn off the lights and head for the lonely cars parked spasmodically down Scovell Crescent. One of the last to leave is Paul Battaglia who is well-known throughout the WRFL for his goal umpiring but also his very friendly and helpful nature. Not everyone connected to the umpires actually knows that it will be Paul that drives to Scovell Reserve the next day and spend more than a few hours making all the rooms presentable for the guys and girls of umpiring when they arrive for the next training session on the following Monday.

When he then kept Sinclair, a former VFL team of the year member, goalless the week after, there was no doubt about it. Frost was starting to hit his straps.

But his momentum was interrupted when he was sidelined for three weeks with sinus issues. Last Saturday was his second game back and Frost is keen to make an impression.

Williamstown's development coach Justin Plapp said the 19 year old had the attributes of an AFL footballer.

"If you're talking about the modern AFL footballer, Jack's got all the makings to be heading in that direction," Plapp said.

"He's a tall, very agile, key position player that can play at both ends of the ground. Jack's development since he's come to the club has been on a bit of an increase since round one."

Frost is one of four players who have come out of the under-18s last year who have been identified as major talents at Williamstown. The other three are Dale Hoghton, Stephen Witkowski and Dylan Conway.

All four are in the Liam Picken Academy, which is designed to equip young players with AFL-ready skills but also to make its participants more well-rounded individuals.

"I've never heard of anything like it at a footy club," Frost said of the academy. If nothing works out with footy I think it's a good basis to have when you come out."

But Frost certainly has an AFL career still in his sights, which is one reason why he decided to sign with Williamstown

"Because of Williamstown's strong record in the last couple of years, I thought going to Williamstown was probably the best option for my development and under the guidance of



Peter German and Justin Plapp, I thought it was a good move," he said.

Frost said he struggled to meet performance targets set by the team early in the season, but has found his feet in the past few weeks.

The 195cm defender from the Sandringham Dragons has a deceptive burst of speed and has a touch of Dustin Fletcher about him with his wiry frame and athleticism.

He took part in the AFL state combine last year and was invited to train with the Western Bulldogs at the start of this year.


"He's going to be a kid that we're trying to develop as much as possible because I would have thought that AFL clubs would look at him and say he's a good size, he's a good shape, he's got all the natural abilities that you probably want from an AFL footballer," Plapp said.

"We've played him on players who have played a really high level and he's done really well on them.

Plapp coached Box Hill's reserves to a premiership last year, but said he wouldn't be judged on team success, but on moulding individuals, particularly those in their second or third year that have struggled to crack into the senior team.

"You're not really manufacturing a team to win you're actually just developing individual players," he said.

# DRAFT PROSPECTS RISE

## *Hoskin-Elliot Impresses At National Championships*

Western Jets footballer Will Hoskin-Elliot has done his draft hopes no harm after he played an outstanding game for Vic Metro in the AFL Under 18 Championships.

With outstanding overhead marking, a lethal kick and the versatility to play all over the ground, Kretiuk has likened his playing style to that of Fremantle Dockers' captain Matthew Pavlich. Hoskin-Elliot is sure to be on the radar of a number of AFL clubs come draft time.

"If he can reproduce a few of the efforts we have seen from him then he will be as good a chance as anyone. He just needs to finish off his year really strongly," Kretiuk said.

It could be a double celebration for the Jets as Adam Kennedy also begins to push his name as a draft chance.

After taking up football late Kennedy is starting to make up for lost time with some impressive performances in his last TAC Cup season.

The match against Western Australia was Kennedy's performance of the championships, and he will be looking to maintain a similar level of form for the rest of the season.

Kretiuk is hopeful Kennedy will be looked at by recruiters.

"He really deserves to get somewhere with his footy. He is a tireless worker and a great kid and has come such a long way from when he started. It's a great testament to him," Kretiuk said.




