From The Editor

We're already well past the halfway mark of Season 2011, and while Deer Park's James Condos is regularly in the headlines for his big hauls in front of goal, there are plenty of other players who are having a significant impact up forward for their respective teams.

In **Division One** it's Albion's Shaydon Bloomfield leading the way, with the little blonde maestro already reaching the fifty goal milestone. Averaging just under six goals a game, Bloomfield leads Jason Butty of Hoppers Crossing (40 goals) & Romain Grenville (33 goals).

In **Division Two** it's the James Condos show, with Deer Park's new playing-coach the first senior player nationwide to reach the 100 goal milestone. Condos has 104 goals from just 10 games, and is well ahead of Mohammed Khartabil of Parkside (54 goals) & Dean Cachia of Wyndhamvale (47 goals).

In **Division One (U18)** young Thomas Jehle of Hoppers Crossing is well ahead of the pack, and en-route to a fifty-plus goal season having kicked 43 goals to date. Trailing him is Corey Irving of Altona (27 goals) & Mahmoud El-Hawli (23 goals).

In **Division Two (U18)** Point Cook's Zac Foley has already passed that fifty-goal milestone, with the dominant forward kicking 56 majors so far this

season. Foley is joined at the top of the leaderboard by Daniel Bartolo of Albanvale (50 goals), with the two more than twenty goals ahead of Dane Thomas of Point Cook (29 goals).

In the **16A** competition, Mitchell Parkinson of Williamstown Juniors leads the division's goal-kicking by a solitary major, having amassed 18 goals to date. In the **15A** competition Michael Sauro of St Bernards also tops the division's leaderboard by the same small margin, his 28 goals including a six-goal haul against Yarraville back in Round Five.

The **14A** competition has Lochlan McDonald of Hoppers Crossing at the top of the leaderboard, his 23 goals also including a six-goal haul against St Bernards back in Round Four. While in the **13A** competition Kyle Blake of Yarraville-Seddon has no doubt been the competition's prolific forward, leading the competition with 32 goals to his name.

Full leaderboards for each division are available on the WRFL website, and with only four rounds remaining in the junior competition the race is on to see which youngster will claim their respective division's goal-kicking crown at season's end.

MOLAN RETURNS HOME

Spotswood Lose Prolific Forward

Shotswood has started to get used to mounting a finals campaign without star player Luke Molan.

The prolific goalkicker returned to hometown club Camperdown last week and will play the rest of the season in the Hampden League.

Spotswood coach Chris O'Keefe said Molan returned to the south-east for "personal reasons".

"We knew about it a couple of weeks ago," O'Keefe said.

"He was going to try and stick out the year but just decided that he'll play down there for the rest of the year.

"It's disappointing because he's a terrific guy and he's a very valuable team member, but in saying that we understand he's got to do what's best for him."

Young up-and-comer Matt Taylor, who kicked three goals in Spotswood's 36-point win against Port Melbourne last weekend and could be the one to step up and try to cover the void left by Molan, who kicked 32 goals in ten games for the Woodmen this year.

"Matt Taylor in last month or so has been a bit of an understudy... so it's an opportunity for him to step up now," O'Keefe said.

"He's been progressing really well. It's been good to get plenty of senior games into him this year and his confidence is just growing each week.

"It's really pleasing to see a kid come out of the juniors and continue to impress, and he's going to be a real player of the future."

The loss of Molan is no doubt a disappointment to the Woodmen, and adds another chapter in the intriguing career of a player who's path in football has been far from conventional.

The 192-centimetre big man went number nine in the 'Super Draft' of 2001, and while his peers have gone on to win Premierships, Brownlow medals and still to this day play for big pay cheques, Molan has ended up copping a battering and bruising at all levels of footy and has found himself playing out his dwindling football career in the suburban leagues.

After being drafted by Melbourne at number nine in the 2001 draft, Molan's career has been anything but straight-forward.

- He moved to Melbourne in 2002 and was billeted with 'an amazing family', the father of which had cancer, and was in remission. The disease returned, and he died a few months later.
- He broke his leg so badly playing VFL for Sandringham that he finished up kneeling despite the sole of



his foot being flat on the ground – and did not play again in the 2002 season.

- He missed five weeks in early 2003 with a cartilage tear then, mid-season, dived to spoil a mark at North Ballarat. In one lunge, he broke his collarbone, was concussed, and ruptured his anterior cruciate ligament upon hitting the ground. Season over, he was delisted.
- He was drafted back to Melbourne as a rookie in 2004, and came back through the Sandringham reserves, eventually returning to the seniors, but was cut at the end of the season.
- He attended Troy and Trisha Broadbridge's wedding, and was the last Melbourne player to farewell his teammate at night's end. Eight days later, Broadbridge was killed in the Boxing Day tsunami while on his honeymoon.
- He was recruited to Frankston in the VFL and broke his leg again in a practice match. Was plagued by hamstring injuries upon his return, and could manage no more than four or five games in a row in two seasons.

Molan used to wonder if he was cursed.

"For a while I thought I'd done something wrong somewhere," he once told reporters.

He was bitter, and struggled to watch the other young men with the 'Super Draft' tag living their dreams, rather than waking, cold with sweat, in the middle of the night. However losing Broadbridge, with whom he had shared many long, frustrating days in the detached yet bonding world of footy rehab, made him realise there was much more to life.

"It woke me out of my stupor, I suppose," he said.

"For him to be taken away like that, it totally changes your life."

Molan is back home in Camperdown now, where his career started over a decade ago. As a sixteen year-old he would bus in from Warrnambool, with the likes of teammates Brent Moloney & Luke Hodge who also hailed from the western district.

In those days he wouldn't get home until 11pm, and it was a sacrifice that he and his family were willing to take to make it at the elite level. At that stage Geelong and Hawthorn were keen to get him, however Melbourne ended up taking him earlier than all expected. A week later he moved into a Murrumbeena house, and still marvels at the strength of those who lived there.

"The father was like the mum of the house. He was always home when I was home. For six months he was like my best mate," he said

Molan was 'almost fit' when he arrived at Melbourne, just getting over a medial ligament strain suffered the week before the TAC Cup finals. By Christmas he was into it 'full-on', and settling in well. Fellow new boys Aaron Rogers, Steven Armstrong, Brad Miller and Mark Jamar were his mates; the Demons did not draft a single player from metropolitan Melbourne that year.

"I was the closest, and I was three hours away," he said.

He played two Wizard Cup games and two practice games, without getting much of the ball, and then went back to Sandy, and found some rhythm. Then, seven or eight rounds in, he explains, 'it all started to happen'.

Playing against Murray Kangaroos, his leg broke horrifically.

"The ankle can only bend so far," he said as he returned from Albury on the team bus, leg in plaster.

Still he believed it was all ahead of him, and was ready to go again come the pre-season. A cartilage tear was a setback, but by round nine or ten the coaches were making positive noises, telling him he was pushing his name forward. At North Ballarat, playing full-forward and zoning to defend a kick-in, he made that fateful, three-in-one lunge. He's seen video footage, and it actually doesn't look too bad. Initially, a scan cleared him of knee damage, but the doctor sent him to a surgeon to make sure.

"He took one look and asked how bad it was," he said.

"I told him it was five to six weeks, and he said, 'It'll be a year. You're having a full knee reconstruction.' "

It was devastating, not least because Molan lived in an apartment on St Kilda Road, and from his balcony could see Melbourne training on the Junction Oval

below. A different teammate would wear his jumper every day.

"They tried to keep me involved, felt sorry for me after what I'd been through."

He says the club was fantastic, rookie-listing him for 2004 so he could start pre-season walking laps of Trevor Barker Oval, bouncing a football, while the fit and able ran 200's in the middle. He was told there could be no rookies the following year for financial reasons, and was further disappointed when the club took two on anyway.

However all he had been through paled into insignificance the following year when he saw firsthand what having a truly tough time was like.

"I was living in Ringwood with my sister and travelling to Frankston to play football," he said.

"Trish Broadbridge was living in Cheltenham and said I could move in there."

Only months had passed since an unthinkable tragedy, but her strength lifted Molan's spirits.

"She's an amazing woman. What she went through and to come out how she has, and do the things she does."

He went to Frankston hoping a change of scenery would change his luck, and maybe, just maybe, an AFL lifeline would be thrown his way. But his body betrayed him again, and the desire left him. He'd had enough.

By now he was living in Newport, and when Spotswood asked what it would take for him to play, he told them money wasn't important. He'd done a personal training course while at Frankston, but had scant experience of the world beyond football medical rooms, and occasionally grounds.

"I said, 'I don't care, just find me a job and I'll play.' "

And after over two successful seasons which included the 2009 Premiership, and another strong start to this year with 32 goals to his name, Molan has now returned home to the Hampden League.

It has come as a shock to many around the league that such a prolific and successful player could 'walk out' on a club that look poised for another successful tilt at a premiership in 2011.

But you only have to realize what this big man has been through in the past decade, and you have to concede that after ten years trying to make it in Melbourne, his return home is probably a little overdue.

A TRUE TEAM PLAYER

Will Martinello Leads 'Player Of The Year' Award

When Werribee coach Paul Satterley addresses his players during a match, he will invariably mention the tackle count and use it a barometer of how his side is performing.

This season, Will Martinello, more than any other player, has produced the type of relentless football Satterley has insisted on.

Martinello has become the master of the one-percenter in an era where the one-percenter has a far greater value, given the rise of the forward press.

The 21-year-old is leading Werribee Football Club's player-of-the-year award, which tallies players' individual tackles, spoils, smothers and shepherds.

He heads the award in front of vice-captain Robbie Castello and captain Dominic Gleeson.

Martinello said he has relished his more prominent role in the midfield this season.

"I had a talk to Satts at the start of the year. He wanted me to become one of those permanent midfielders in the team and at the moment I'm doing that so I'm pretty happy with that so far," he said.

"I always just try to do the team things. Satts is always pushing that side of the game, that workmanlike game style we have at times. I always like to get my tackles up."

With Satterley introducing a game plan that is based on AFL affiliate North Melbourne's, the application of perceived pressure has become even more important.

"The whole team took a while to adapt to it at the start of the year but I think we're all getting used to it," Martinello said.

"The backline is getting used to their game style and I think it works well, and personally I enjoy it too.



Especially when you go up forward you get to play a bit more up the ground."

Martinello said Satterley signing on as a full-time coach had been a significant factor in Werribee's new lease of life, after last season yielded just four wins.

Martinello has been one of Werribee's most consistent players since joining the club in 2009, to the point that he is often mentioned in the same breath as long-serving club men Gleeson and Castello, despite his relatively young career at Werribee.

"It feels like I've been here for longer than three years already I reckon," he said.

The boy from north-eastern Victoria came to the Tigers from TAC Cup side Murray Bushrangers and said moving from the country and leaving his family was a daunting experience. But the club helped him get a full-time job and Martinello is now sharing a house in Tarneit with three other teammates and fellow country boys Bradley Mangan, Farren Priest and Nathan Laracy.

A LIFETIME COMMITMENT

David Stretton Earns Williamstown Life Membership

Playing just three senior games in his first two years of VFL never deterred David Stretton.

In 2007, his single-minded ambition to become a permanent member of Williamstown's first team started to come to fruition, and he has since become one of a handful of players who can truly be regarded as the heart and soul of the Seagulls' playing list.

Stretton is the first player to benefit from Williamstown's new criteria for life-membership.

On 18 July against Frankston, Stretton played his 130th game for the club (83 senior and 46 reserves), automatically making him a life-member of the club.

"The footy club's been my life for the last seven years so to be recognised as a life member is massive for me and its massive honour. It means a lot to me," he said.

Stretton remembered how tough it was to break into the senior side, but never considered throwing it in and playing local footy, even though he probably could have earned more money doing so.

"I've always taken my footy pretty seriously and I thought I'm not going to leave without giving it a fair-dinkum crack, and at least see if I can play at that level. I wasn't going to leave without giving every little bit of energy towards it," he said. "I probably wasn't ready to play senior footy in my first year (2005) down there. In my second year I was probably doing enough to warrant selection but with the alignment with Collingwood it was pretty hard numbers-wise to get in. You've only got six or seven Williamstown players who were playing at the time. I had to bide my time and grit my teeth and know that eventually a spot was going to open up for me."

Stretton, a member of Williamstown's leadership group, again had to display immense perseverance and patience last year after breaking his collarbone in round 15, when the Seagulls were flying.

"It was pretty devastating at the time," he said. "I was thinking last year it could be our big chance of finally getting a premiership. Watching the boys play the last six or seven games was quite hard. It was a good mental challenge for me to stay involved and try and play my part."



History shows the premiership was not to be. Williamstown failed at the penultimate stage, continuing a recent history of under-performing in finals.

The Seagulls are again in the mix this season, sitting second with nine wins and two losses, but have lost to perhaps the two likeliest challengers, the undefeated Port Melbourne and premiers North Ballarat.

"I think we've definitely got what it takes but we've just got to stick to what we know and to our structures, otherwise in big games we can fall to pieces," Stretton said.

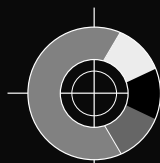
"When we get put under pressure that's when we've got to rely on those things to get us over the line. We've got the players on the park to beat any side on our day, but we need to put together in the important part of the year which we haven't been able to do yet."

Stretton listed close mate Ben Davies, Ben Jolley and captain Brett Johnson as long-serving players he felt privileged to have played with.

"Ben Jolley is one of the most courageous blokes I've ever played with, and you can't look further than the captain. He's an inspirational leader. Some of the stuff he brings to the table ... he's a bloke you just want to hang around and learn off, because he's been there and done it."

Stretton said representing Victoria against the SANFL in Adelaide in 2008 was one of his biggest highlights so far. But he said a VFL premiership would no doubt surpass that.

Bulldogs Host Annual AMES Football Carnival

We had one guy come through who was from Afghanistan and wanted to keep playing. We were able to direct him to a local club.”

This year has seen the program continue to grow with the Metropolitan Fire Brigade signing on as a major sponsor.

“It’s been great to have the MFB on board this year.”

The MFB have added to the education of players by providing a fire safety seminar as part of their work with the program. Together with the Western Bulldogs, they also sponsored the



provision of special Western Bulldogs jumpers for the players to wear.

A number of past participants are returning in coaching roles to help work with participants by giving them the benefit of their experiences in the program. Moses said it was a great aspect to have former students coming back in a coaching capacity.

“That is something that we set out to achieve when we were first setting it up,” Moses said.

The results of this year’s carnival were close in both men’s and women’s matches.

In the women’s, St Albans vs Footscray 2.3 (15) defeated Werribee vs Sunshine 0.3 (3), with Seenual Pongbannai named best on ground for the winners.

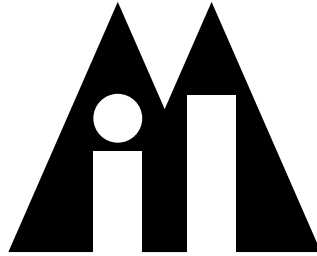
