# CELEBRATING MULTICULTURALISM

**F**ootball continues to evolve at the speed of a Gary Ablett-like explosive burst from a contested situation. Forward presses, defensive lock downs and player substitutions, all unheard of several seasons ago, are now staples of the game. So too, the multicultural expansion of those now playing the game, from country and suburban level through to the TAC Cup and AFL. As our country welcomes more and more migrants from a raft of countries and our communities continue to diversify, so, too, the interest in Australian Rules continues to spike.

AFL Development has seven core national objectives, one of which is engagement - to develop community engagement initiatives that add social value and support access to the broader pathways and inclusive environments, particularly in the Indigenous and multicultural communities. It is incumbent on our football fraternity to engage, recruit and retain not only players from a multicultural background, but also volunteers, umpires and fans from culturally diverse backgrounds.

It's worth noting that 20 per cent of Australians were born in another country and half the number of migrants come from non English speaking nations. Combine that with their Australian born children they constitute 43 per cent of the population. By 2025 overseas born families will out-number locally born families. Australia's population, currently 22 million, is projected to grow to 35 million by

2049 with the majority of that increase coming from migrants.

There is no greater example of how the traditions and awareness of our game has evolved than the NAB AFL Under 16 Championships currently underway at Blacktown, Sydney where a World XVIII and a South Pacific team - comprising players from Fiji, Nauru, Samoa, Tonga and New Zealand - are competing.

The World XVIII includes players from Scotland, Ireland, USA, Canada, East Timor and South Africa with the rest of the squad comprising of Australian based players from Sudan, Lebanon, Turkey, to name but a few nationalities, who are currently involved in the TAC Cup system.

Unquestionably, Australian Rules popularity has never been greater. Its interest and appeal now spreads past its once traditional base, the world is starting to play the game. And, it's great to hear that players post training are feasting not only on a meat pie, but a lavish Lebanese meal, prepared by the families of proud and passionate parents who've fallen in love with our game.

Small steps, yes, but it is part of a bigger picture of how and where we'd like to expand the game so it truly is a game of the people.

# WRFL FINALS SERIES

## *Mid-Strength Alcohol Policy Announced*

The Western Region Football League continues to promote the health & wellbeing of local communities, with the announcement that this season's WRFL Finals Series will have mid-strength alcoholic options being served at all games.

As part of AFL Victoria's 'Alcohol Reduction Policy & Evaluation Partnership', all venues will serve beverages with an alcoholic content no greater than 3.5%, to ensure all games remain an entertaining and safe place to bring children, family & friends to enjoy local football.

Bob Tregear, Chief Executive Officer of the WRFL, said that maintaining a safe environment for players, officials & spectators was of paramount importance to the league.

"By serving only mid-strength alcohol at all venues will ensure we can moderate consumption of alcohol at all finals matches," said Tregear.

"It will also ensure that we cater for all spectators including non-beer drinkers, with a better range of products & options."

"This is an initiative that is supported by VicHealth and AFL Victoria, and strengthens the WRFL's position as leaders in the promotion the health & wellbeing of local communities."

The mid-strength policy for senior finals will run in conjunction with the existing policy for junior finals which remains a full ban of both the serving & consumption of alcohol at any junior games.

David Newton, Football Operations Manager of the WRFL said the alcohol ban for all junior finals was essential to ensure a safe playing environment for all junior players.

"The ban on serving or consuming alcohol at all junior venues ensures the WRFL remains a community leader in the promotion of a safe, friendly & family-orientated environment for our juniors to enjoy the sport of football," said Newton.

The WRFL Senior Finals Series runs for five weeks at Avalon Airport Oval, commencing on Saturday 20th August and culminating with the Division Two Grand Final on Sunday 11th September and the Division One Grand Final on Saturday 17th September.

The WRFL Junior Finals Series runs for four weeks across a number of venues in the western suburbs culminating with Junior Grand Finals on Sunday 21st August & Sunday 28th August.

# SAINTS UPSET SPOTSWOOD

## Division One Competition Wide Open

The Division One competition has been thrown wide open after St Albans pulled off a shock upset of ladder leaders Spotswood last weekend. After a flawless start to the season the Woodsmen have now dropped two of their past four games and probably more significantly have relinquished top spot on the ladder to last year's premiers Albion. While the Cats now sit a game clear on top, their season has also had the occasional hiccup, with their Round 11 draw against the Warriors testament to the evenness of the competition this year.

At McLean Reserve St Albans were simply a class above, the margin at the final siren not doing justice to the ascendancy the Saints had for the afternoon. At the final change the margin was out to 38 points, and while Spotswood pilled on 11 scoring shots to 3 in the last quarter, the Saints had already done enough to secure a vital and unexpected four points.

The win will serve as a major psychological boost should St Albans and Spotswood meet again in the qualifying final, and will surely put doubts in the minds of those who believed the WRFL premiership was a two-horse race. Saints coach Ian Denny said his side's commitment to the contest was crucial in the victory.

"Our pressure at the footy was probably as good as it's been, so there was no easy footy for them.

Every time they got the footy they had to work hard. We tackled hard, we were very aggressive at the ball," he said.

St Albans is beginning to play the type of footy that wins games in crunch matches. Denny said the side was starting to gel after a patchy start to the year.

"I thought our performance against Sunshine the week before was probably the catalyst for that performance.

The week before, probably our best game for the year, and the blokes took the confidence out of that game and took it into yesterday's game."

The result was a phenomenal 106 point turnaround from when the sides met back in Round Four.

"We were still trying to put together a team at that early in the season and we didn't quite know what every person did. We've come a long way since then, blokes know their role and know their positions a little bit better," Denny said.

"It shows we can match it with the top two. There was a big gap between us and those two sides early on in the year.

We probably won't know until after next week if we can get close to these sides consistently."



## Condos Approaching Another Milestone

**A**n eighteen goal haul by Deer Park playing-coach James Condos last weekend was still not enough to reclaim his spot on top of the Swisse Vitamins National Goalkicking Leaderboard, with country junior Macy Hambrook still leading the ex-Bulldogs rookie by three goals.

While Condos is quite clearly the leading Senior footballer across the country, the battle between the local full-forward and his newfound country-based rival does make for interesting reading.

With three games left in the home & away season, Condos' tally is 122 from just eleven games, averaging an impressive eleven majors a game. His biggest haul this season was nineteen goals away at North Sunshine, a game where he had sixteen at halftime before dragging himself late in the third quarter.

Last weekend Condos was close to eclipsing his Round Nine tally, and with a potential five games remaining this season, is on track to kick in excess of 150 goals.

His country nemesis, young Macy Hambrook of Omeo-Benambra Football Club in the Omeo District Football League, sits three goals higher on the leaderboard averaging slightly more than eleven goals per game with his tally of 125 goals.

## *McKenzie Earns Rising Star Nomination*

Former Williamstown Junior Trent McKenzie has earned the NAB AFL Rising Star nomination for Round 17, for his efforts in the Suns' win over Richmond last weekend.

McKenzie had 21 touches in a polished display, and is now one of four Gold Coast players in the running for the award.

McKenzie is the second WRFL junior to be nominated for the NAB Rising Star award this year following former Flemington Juniors and now Port Adelaide player Jasper Pittard being awarded a nomination back in Round Four.

McKenzie played Under-16's & Under-18's at Williamstown Juniors before playing for the Western Jets and being drafted on to the Gold Coast Suns list as a 17-year-old.

In what has been a successful week for the Williamstown Juniors, another former protégé



in Ben Davies was last week awarded Life Membership at the Williamstown Football Club.

Playing his 119th game for the club last weekend, Davies also played 21 games for Werribee in 2008 while rookie listed with North Melbourne.



The newly names Saltwater Reserve will border the new Saltwater Coast housing estate, and will provide the open space & facilities required for the area's young population.



"Unfortunately, he didn't meet his grandkids, it was a tragic accident."

Regan's other grandfather, Vern Ryan, is the St Albans Football Club president.

He credited his grandson with discovering the 'My Blood Oath' Facebook page, inviting some club members to join online and alerting his football club to the campaign.

"I thought it might be good for the club because of how to raise money," Regan said.

"It's important so people can socialise and make sure they don't drink and drive."

As a Grade 4 pupil at Sydenham-Hillside Primary School, the youngster is also a keen footballer and usually plays as rover or half-forward. Three older St Albans Football Club players, Travis Edwards, Craig Brown and Tim Jenkins, have joined the TAC campaign.

"It's important to spread the word among young fellows who play footy," Mr Edwards, 27, said.

Mr Brown said he supported the 'My Blood Oath' campaign "mainly to get message across to young kids because the less deaths on the road there is, the better".

"I think it is important to look after your mates and make sure you get home safe to your family; there's no point dying over a car," said 23-year-old Mr Jenkins.



# COMMITMENT THE KEY

## *Mather Impresses As Finals Approach*

**J**arrod Mather is a player you want in your side when the pressure is on. The tough in-and-under footballer, in his fourth year at Werribee, has overcome season-ending injuries and is playing the fearless and consistent footy he's always been capable of.

Mather, 23, broke his leg in his first season at Werribee and missed one-and-a-half seasons of footy.

Last year he played two senior games before tearing his medial ligament, and finished the season in the reserves after a 10-week lay-off.

Mather was still named Werribee's most committed reserves player in 2009 and 2010, despite playing less than half a season in both years – indicating how highly the club values him and how hard he's worked to overcome his devastating injuries.

This year, Mather hasn't missed a game and has featured in Werribee's best players in the senior side's past two games.

"I'm just relieved to finally get a few games consistently," he said.

"This is the first year I've played this many games in a row for years now and it's just awesome to keep my fitness up. A big pre-season had a lot to do with it.

"I knew that I could play at this level, it was just a matter of getting my body up to scratch so I could play consistently in the seniors. This year's been my most rewarding year."

Mather has played his role superbly, being a constant presence at half-forward and coming back into the midfield to add muscle in the clinches, and thriving on the game plan's insistence on relentless pressure.

His performance in Werribee's last game, against Frankston in wet and muddy conditions, showed why he could be one of the Tigers' most crucial players in the pressure cooker atmosphere of finals.

"The wet game suited me to a tee. The ball was always on the ground and I've got my tackle count up this year. It's something I always wanted to work on and because of my fitness being better I've been



able to work both ways, defensively and offensively a bit more.

"I always knew that I could be a regular senior player, it's just a matter of getting all the injuries under control. I knew a bit of consistency could come from that."


With Werribee looking like playing finals this year, Mather could be the player his team relies on to win the contested footy, negate the opposition's match winners and cause turnovers when pace is frenetic and the stakes high.

Unsurprisingly, Mather has tried to model his footy on the stalwarts of the senior side, particularly captain Dom Gleeson and vice-captain Robbie Castello.

"They're the benchmark of not only our team but the VFL because they do it so consistently, they're consistency in our best-and-fairest top three," he said.

Mather said Werribee's four-game winning streak suggests a side getting more comfortable with the game plan based on North Melbourne's – and the performances of Kangaroos such as Ben McKinley and Ben Warren in the forward line, and dominant ruckmen Hamish MacIntosh and Majak Daw, has helped the team believe in the style. "I think early days a few blokes were a bit up in the air about it, trying to get used to it all but I think by this stage all the boys are pretty gelled together and we've played with each other for long enough now," he said.

"I think we're just starting to hit our straps and clicking with the North Melbourne boys."


