

ALL ON THE LINE

Warriors & Colts Fight For Final Spot

Hoppers Crossing and Port Melbourne clash this weekend in a crunch game for Division One, as both teams aim to secure that highly sought after fifth and final spot in the post season.

In the most important game of the season for both teams, the Warriors versus Colts clash has all the ingredients of a classic contest.


The fifth-placed Warriors potentially saved their season when they achieved a stunning come-from-behind win against the Colts in round six and Port Melbourne, just half a game behind Hoppers Crossing, will be desperate for revenge.

Both sides had wins on Saturday against lowly opposition, but face a testing final four weeks. The run home for both teams only makes top five predictions more difficult.

Port Melbourne's final three games are against Glenorden, St Albans and Altona, while Hoppers Crossing will take on Spotswood, St Albans and Sunshine.

The Colts are almost certain to defeat Glenorden, but will need to win at least one of their last two games if they fail against Hoppers Crossing. But if the Colts defeat the Warriors, and results fall to the favourites in the following round, Port Melbourne will be six points ahead of Hoppers Crossing and the Warriors will have to beat St Albans and Sunshine in the last two rounds, and hope Port Melbourne loses to Altona and St Albans.

If Hoppers Crossing prevails, the Warriors will open up a six-point gap to Port Melbourne on the ladder, and are likely to need only one more



win from its last three games to secure a spot in the five.

All this leads to one fact – this is a must-win game for both sides.

Hoppers Crossing had to battle to overcome ninth-placed Sunshine Heights on Saturday, but eventually won by 31 points, while Port Melbourne had a comfortable 202-point win against Glenorden.

SAINTS BIG REALITY CHECK

Albion Assert Dominance On Division One

If St Albans emerged as possible premierships contenders after upsetting Spotswood two weeks ago, then Albion handed the Saints a real reality check last weekend.

The Cats cemented top spot on the ladder with a masterful 96-point win against the third-placed Saints, effectively securing premierships favouritism.

St Albans got the jump on Albion and held a 20-point lead at quarter time, but Albion gradually pegged the deficit back in the second quarter and produced an incredible 18-goal second half to send the Saints crashing back to earth.

After kicking six goals in the first quarter, St Albans could only manage another four more. The Saints sorely missed big man Aaron Henneman, who has been the side's main target up forward this season.

Albion on the other hand was spoilt for choice up forward, and had 11 individual goal kickers.

Shaydon Bloomfield kicked six goals for the Cats, but livewire Todd Finco earned best on ground honours with a complete performance that yielded four goals and 10 tackles.

Albion coach Marcus Barclay said Finco, 19, was such a dangerous weapon because of his versatility and X-factor.

"He's so nonchalant in the way he approaches footy, he just cruises into training and his preparation before the game is very quiet," Barclay said.

"It's hard to match up on him because he's so quick and he's also tall. He's just constantly running blokes down from behind. It's just that perceived pressure that he puts on."

Barclay regarded Saturday's match as a danger game after the Saints' stunning win against Spotswood, and early on he had every reason to. St Albans attacked Albion in the same way it attacked Spotswood, but could only sustain its intensity for a half.



"I think it's really difficult to maintain it over four quarters," Barclay said. "They really did stop running after half time. It was more our pressure around the contest that's probably been the difference in the last month and a half for us."

Barclay played under St Albans coach Ian Denney when both were in the EDFL, and said knowing how Denney coached proved advantageous in dismantling the Saints.

The Cats coach was thrilled with his side's 10-goal final quarter, which showed their ability to run games out.

Co-coaches Barclay and backman Glenn Manton have kept Tuesday sessions light in the past month to ensure players were fresh for their several crunch games in a row.

"When we come up against the sides that are lower on the ladder, we'll ramp up the Tuesday nights leading into finals," Barclay said.

"To be running out the games like we have been, I think we can only get better in that respect."

Hogans Road definitely hosts the game of the round this weekend as the fifth-placed Hoppers Crossing entertains sixth-placed Port Colts in an full finals dress rehearsal.

The Warriors have gotten themselves into the five at the right time of the year but their opponents today are desperate to take that elusive spot off them.

Whilst we still have a month of Division One football to run before we kick off the post-season, the outcome of today's matchup has huge ramifications.

If the home side can get up and get a game and a half break on sixth then the finals looks all the more likely. However if the visitors succeed, they leapfrog into the five with Glenorden next week, while Hoppers have to travel to Spotswood.

The road ahead looks all the tougher for the loser today, so all the more motivation to get up in what's destined to be a tight contest between evenly matched teams.

Elsewhere Albion, after disposing of the high-flying St Albans last Saturday, host Sunshine en route to locking up the minor premiership. The Cats face the bottom four sides over the next four rounds.

Spotswood, who now look resigned to finishing in second spot on the ladder, head west to Glenorden, with the visitors now relying on an Albion slip-up to claim anything but second spot going into the finals.

Elsewhere St Albans and Altona will both be fighting for third spot on the ladder this afternoon as the sides visit North Footscray and Sunshine Heights respectively.

The Saints have an extra win on the Vikings, but a poorer percentage.

With both sides expected to win today, it adds extra emphasis on next week's game where both teams square off, the outcome of which will be of added importance to St Albans who arguably have a tougher final two rounds.

On one weekend his dad organised for him to play a game for Spotswood, and as Wood recalls it, the side lost by about 100 points.



UMPIRES CORNER

This week marks the last round of the junior competition. It means that for many of our young 'champion' players it will be the final game of the season. Of course, a small number of players will be competing in the finals but a single loss means not only possible heartache, disappointment and maybe tears but also the end of running out and playing in a competitive football environment.

It's a little bit different for umpires. The start of the junior finals heralds an extremely hectic time for the umpiring fraternity. Not only are there games on Saturday to be umpired but there are also a huge amount of junior finals that require field, boundary and goal umpires to officiate in.

Most umpires put up their hand to help out and make themselves available for the Sunday games as well as the usual Saturday matches. Unfortunately, some will groan when they are given the early morning games on the Sunday morning. Gone are the regular sleep in and it's off to the game bright and early. For finals, umpires are expected to arrive at least one hour before their games. An exception is made if they are 'lucky' enough to strike the 8:30 am fixture. Then, forty-five minutes beforehand is acceptable.

Some umpires are very competitive and are eager to be appointed to certain games that they see as a feather in their cap. It's always good to have a realistic goal in which to aspire towards. Of course, not everyone is successful with their hopes and their dreams but, as they say, there is always next year.

Umpires are indeed fortunate to be able to take part in a whole range of finals' games. Unlike the many players who miss out on finals, nearly every umpire will be a part of the WRFL's junior finals.

It was only a little over thirty years ago, when there were no official league boundary and goal umpires. Instead, representatives from the clubs ran the boundary and waved the flags during the season. The better performers, as judged by the field umpires, were rewarded with doing the finals while those judged to the best were given the grand final.

The system changed and the boundary and goal umpires were appointed for finals from the ranks of the leagues own umpires, all of who were field umpires. There was much laughter, taunts and teasing amongst the group as certain umpires, who were not appointed as a field umpire, were given the 'secondary' job of running the boundary or waving flags. Now, the WRFL have official field, boundary and goal umpires in every senior and junior final.

Just as the junior players take to the field next week in order to do their best, so too do the umpires. Seven or eight months of dedicated training, practising, regular feedback and listening to lectures all combine to prepare the umpires to be at peak of their powers. Whether they are in control in the middle or running the white lines or waving pieces of calico tied to sticks, we hope that they are able to put their best foot forward and do a great job. 

Seagulls Down Local Rivals

Williamstown's effort to resist a fast-finishing Werribee was evidence of a side playing as a true team, according to coach Peter German.

Creating a team environment among a side that mixes AFL-listed players with VFL players is a significant challenge, but German said his side was beginning to discover that unity so crucial for a successful team.

"You don't win those games if your blokes are thinking individual and thinking their own agendas," German said.

"The best part was the boys rallied as a group and not as individuals and that's what we've probably been doing in the last month."

German said it was always going to be a tough game against a team that had improved out of sight since the two sides met in the opening round, when the Seagulls did a number on the Tigers.

"In sloppy conditions, you could probably cut them some slack but there were three poor uses of the ball that really opened up the door for Werribee to get a goal," German said.

"But for the boys to be able to rally and kick some important goals was good."

Jason Johannisen played his first seniors home-and-away game (he has represented Williamstown in the Foxtel Cup) and held his own.



"We've been really lucky with injuries this year, both here and at the Bulldogs so that probably hasn't allowed us to bring some kids on in our seconds," German said.

"Our seconds had a really good win against Werribee, who have a good seconds side, and there's four or five blokes there who we've played in the Foxtel Cup. We'd love to get an opportunity to get them up in the next four or five games."

German was impressed with Jason Tutt's game, but said he needed to work on his goalkicking on the run.

"He's been able to use his run and his speed. I think certainly over the past month his played his best footy," he said.

There would be very few people who have seen Albion play over the past two seasons who don't know of Todd Finco.

He has been a shining light for the Cats both at under-18's and senior level, and is the sort of footballer that everyone loves to watch. His talent is undeniable and his silky skills never fail to excite not just the Albion faithful but all football followers.

"He's so nonchalant in the way he approaches footy, he just cruises into training and his preparation before the game is very quiet," says Barclay.

"It's hard to match up on him because he's so quick and he's also tall. He's just constantly running blokes down from behind. It's just that perceived pressure that he puts on."

Finco's career is already littered with accolades including an Under 18A Premiership in 2009, a Reserves Premiership in 2009 and Senior A Grade Premiership in 2010.

Add to that his spot as full-forward in last year's WRFL Under-18 Team Of The Year, after kicking 58 goals in 12 games, and you can start to see how much of an impact the versatile Finco is having on the league.

Still yet to turn twenty and with so much football ahead of him, Finco may well evolve into one of the best born & bred one-club footballers that the league has seen for quite some time.


