STILL AIMING HIGH

Caroline Springs Look To The Future

Although new side Caroline Springs may not reach the goal set by coach Gary Turner this season, the original plan to play finals footy by 2013 has not changed.

Perhaps it was rather ambitious for Turner to expect five wins in the Lakers' first year in senior footy, but after the side defeated Braybrook in the opening round of the Division Two competition, this looked like a real possibility.

But the Lakers were dealt wake-up calls from Laverton and the all-conquering Deer Park in the following two rounds. Then injuries took their toll.

Ben Ingram, one of the side's leaders, did the ligaments in his ankle in round three and was forced to have surgery, while captain David Cavanagh broke his wrist in the same game and then fractured his leg in round nine.

He has since returned to the park, albeit prematurely.

"He's played on one leg the last couple of weeks just to get us through," Turner said.

All teams have injuries, so using it as an excuse can seem tiresome, but for a first-year team that has yet to establish depth, a handful of injuries can be devastating.

"We've turned over 47 players. Normally clubs turn over 30 to 31, that's if you have a good run with injuries, so to turn over two sides, that's been the main concern," Turner said.

"That's one area we need to pick up on, our depth, so we can cover those blokes if it happens next year. But that's what happens when you've got a new side."

Getting a new team to gel is challenging enough, but to do so with a constant turnover of players is a gradual process to say the least.

"In the second half of the year on Tuesday nights, all we've been doing is having practice matches. We've taken the risk that if someone gets injured then so be it. We've had to do it. I think our results, apart from the weekend before (against Deer Park) have shown that we've started to gel."

Turner said he will target a centre-half back and a key forward for next season.

"We get our hands on the ball, it's just hitting the target up forward. If we get a couple of those (key forwards) we'll be more than competitive next year."

The five-year plan mapped out before the season had set a goal of seven or eight wins next year. Turner is confident that can happen.

"The core senior group, hopefully we get all them signed up by the end of this year, and then we just work on our deficiencies," he said.



"If we can top up with a few players we can really build some momentum for next year. I've got a few numbers to ring already."

The key phrase there is "top up". Turner knows he needs to keep the bulk of his players if the club is to improve.

Players integral to Caroline Springs' future include Dean Borg and Scott Hepburn, who came to the club from Glenorden, and 20-year-old Daniel Ingram, brother of Ben (both came to the club from EDFL side Keilor), who Turner said has far exceeded expectations.

"His work rate and commitment, it's like a 26-27 year-old. He'll probably end up winning our best-and-fairest."

Turner has been buoyed by community support for the club. Several home games have attracted about 500 people, and the club's horror run with injuries has in fact helped boost crowd numbers, as families and team-mates to the under-18 and under-16 players who have been bloodied have come to show their support.

Caroline Springs - Ten Years On

On May the 15th, 2002, Mark Penaluna (General Manager WRFL), Peter McDougall (Club Development Manager Football Victoria & WRFL) and John Batty (Development Manager Football Victoria, Western Region), met with Gabrielle Leigh (Principle of The Brookside School), Peter Forbes (Principle of Mowbray College) and Chris Kent (Christ the Priest Catholic Primary School) to discuss developing the game of football in the area.

From this meeting it was decided to hold a public interest meeting on the 19th of June 2002. This meeting was to determine the level of interest of creating a local football club in the area. This meeting was promoted throughout the community ensuring the best possible turnout. With an attendance of approx 80 people, including representatives from the AFL, Football Victoria, The Western Bulldogs F.C, Williamstown & Collingwood F.C, Western Jets F.C, Melton Council, Local Councillor Gary Stock, all schools in the area and developers of the area, Delfin. With such a great turnout, it was obvious that the people wanted a club in Caroline Springs. From this meeting a steering committee was formed to investigate all options in starting up a club in the area.

This committee consisted of Peter McDougall – Chairman (Club Development Manager AFL & Football Victoria, Western Region) John Hyett (Football Victoria Board Member & Former Shire of Melton Commissioner), Cr Gary Stock (Shire of Melton Councillor), Ashley Pittard (Shire of Melton Recreation Development Officer), Rob Dagnall (Delfin), Brent Deale (Caroline Springs Auskick Coordinator), Charles Branciforte (The Brookside School), Chris Kent (Christ the Priest Catholic Primary School), Jane Lockwood, Sean O’Leary, Glenn Sowter, Mark Tenaglia and Paul Walker (all representing the community of Caroline Springs).

This steering committee met every two weeks from then onwards to create the Caroline Springs F.C. The Club became incorporated and also incorporated the Caroline Springs Sporting Club for the future.

During this period a relationship was developed with the Williamstown & Collingwood F.C’s to help develop football in the area. This partnership had been signed off, creating a life long financial and resources agreement. This partnership was worked through with the General Manager of the Williamstown F.C, Brendan Curry. The steering committee agreed that the club colours will be those of the two clubs being Black, White, Royal Blue & Gold. It was here that they were given the name of “The Lakers”.



Developers of the Caroline Springs community, Delfin, also agreed to assist financially to help the club with their start up costs. With both these partnerships, the club was given a flying start.

The Inaugural Annual General Meeting was held on Tuesday the 15th of October 2002 at the Brookside School, Federation Drive, Caroline Springs. This historical meeting saw the election of office bearers for the very first time.

The inaugural office bearers were Brett Deale (President), Glen Sowter (Vice-President), Sean O’Leary (Secretary) & Mark Tengalia (Treasurer).

The rest, as they say, is history!



Local Juniors Impress At National Championships

Three local boys have just returned from Canberra after representing their state at the School Sport Australia 'National Football Championships'. Bailey Siwek, Harry Jennings & Lachlan Fogarty will all return to their local sides this weekend as they back up their state representative duties during week one of the Western Region Football League finals series.

The three were selected from over six-thousand juniors from across country & metropolitan Victoria, with the honour for Bailey Siwek another accolade in his short but already impressive career. A member of Werribee District's Under 12A side, Siwek first joined the club back in 2008 and in just his third season had already earned both club and league Best & Fairest honours.

Less than four years after first taking to the field, Bailey had already found his way onto the state team, with his Victorian Under-12 side finishing runners-up at the National Championships last month. Bailey was prolific for the side, kicking half a dozen goals for the state & consistently named amongst the best players.

In Victoria's opening game of the Championships the speedy on-baller was third best on ground, his two goals easily helping the side run out winners over Western Australia. Bailey explains that is it was a huge thrill to be playing at such an elite level and that the opening game of the Championships was one of the highlights of his short career.

"Wearing the Big V was a huge honour, and the standard was very high," says Bailey.

"I was confident that when I passed or received the ball, it would always be used effectively."

After also featuring on the scoresheet in Victoria's second match against the ACT, Bailey again found the sticks against the Northern Territory and New South Wales. However it was in the game against the eventual champions South Australia that Bailey truly made his mark on the national stage. Against the best footballers in the country Bailey was named best afield, a memory & experience that the youngster will no doubt build on for years to come.

"Anticipation was high in both teams having reached this final game undefeated and the game was played with the intensity of a Grand Final," Bailey explains.

"As a team, we all had the desire to perform well and contribute to the best of our ability."

"South Australia matched us in ability and size but seemed to outnumber us to the ball. Although it was

disappointing that we lost, it was an honour to be named best on ground for this final game especially amongst a group of such talented footballers selected from the whole of Victoria".

Fellow WRFL representative Harry Jennings was also in the best against South Australia, the Williamstown Junior boasting the rare combination of both height and speed. Also lining up in week one of the WRFL Junior Finals, Harry plays his club football at Williamstown and started back at the club in 2007.

Like most gifted footballers he has also achieved significant success at a state level in other sports, namely the Victorian Junior Life Saving Championships where he won the Under 12 Beach Sprint title. He was also a member of the Williamstown Primary Schools Zone Premiers in 2010.

To cap off a remarkable week for not only the boys but junior football in the west, Lachlan Fogarty matched his league counterparts with a best on ground performance against Western Australia. Making an instant impact on the Championships, the Spotswood footballer also slotted one goal in the sides' rout of Western Australia and had the Championships abuzz with his pace & skill.

His ability to play to his best against the best in the country is something that will no doubt be recognised down the track as his name is thrown around in league & development squad selections. Used to playing up an age-group, Fogarty has dropped back down to his correct age group this year and is one of the front-runners to claim the league Best & Fairest medal.

Similarly to the other boys the 12 year-old is also achieving success away from the football field, having won MVP honours for his local basketball side the Altona Gators for the past two seasons. His basketball will also take him to his second Australian Championships of 2011, when he competes in Brisbane in late September.

For the Western Region Football League to not only produce three footballers on the state team, but three boys that had such an impact on the Championships is a huge coup for football in the west. Western Region Football League CEO, Mr Bob Tregear, said all three boys should be congratulated on representing both their club & state at the highest level possible.

“To be selected to participate at a National Championships truly puts these three in elite company, and we hope it is just the first of many representative opportunities that come their way,” said Tregear.

“Over the years the league has had players go on from this level, through to interleague programs, Western Jets squads and onto AFL lists, and based on their performances there is no reason why these boys can’t follow a similar pathway.”

Bailey explains he is keen on furthering his development as a footballer, and hopes his experiences in the Championships leads to other football opportunities down the track.


“My next goal is to represent Victoria in the Under-15 squad in a few years time, and then one day hopefully play football at the highest level possible,” says Siwek.



UMPIRES CORNER

Today one of the true gentlemen of local football passes an important milestone when he goes out to officiate in his 250th Division 1 senior game. Paul Battaglia is a very well-known person in and around the WRFL. And it's not just for his deeds as a very capable and professional goal umpire that makes him so popular. Before turning to umpiring in 1995, Paul was a solid supporter and worker for the Kingsville/Yarraville Football Club. He played a couple of games for the reserves team but mostly served the club as a runner, trainer, cleaner, boundary umpire and in a lot of other various roles. Paul even served one year as vice-president and another as secretary. Fittingly, he is a life member of that club.

Paul was born in Calabria, Italy and came to Australia in 1955. His family settled in Footscray and he attended Geelong Road Primary School and Footscray Tech. He tried a few different jobs and then found his niche in the building industry as a driver of cranes before being elevated into sales. Of course, some of the biggest highlights of his life have been his marriage to Rosa in 1966, the birth of their son, Dominic, and then the grandchildren, in little Paul and Luke.

Paul loves his game of golf and has played for many decades. Since retiring in 2003, he's out on one course or another at least once but usually two or even three times every week. Often he teams up with Terry O'Donnell and Glenn Thompson as they explore various courses in and around the Victorian countryside. Paul is a member at the Sunshine Golf Club, Mt Derrimut.

For many years, various umpires such as Alan Clough, Bob Madigan, Rod Davies and others would watch him running as a club boundary official at Kingsville and invite him down to join the umpires. But Paul never got around to it until 1995 when he thought he needed a change of scenery. He regrets not turning to umpiring sooner but looks back on his time at Kingsville/Yarraville with many fond memories. Since turning to umpiring, he has been a tremendous member and supporter of the WRFL Umpires' Association. On the



field he has officiated in six Division 1 senior grand finals and is hoping to add to that number this season. Paul has also waved flags in many other finals and grand finals. Off the field, he has been on the committee of the umpires' association for the last four years, buys supplies for the Scovell Reserve canteen and works solidly as the cleaner ensuring that the social rooms and change rooms are near spotless every week. Paul was awarded life membership of the umpires' association in 2009 in recognition of his contribution to umpiring and the association.

Another great attribute of Paul is his positive encouragement and support of other umpires especially those young ones who are new to the game. His idea is that they are the future and need to be given as much help as possible. An example of this was when Paul was one of two goalies that went to Werribee Central one Sunday in June and devoted his time, free of charge, as the WRFL's new and inexperienced goalies officiated in all five junior games that day. He stood behind them passing on his extensive knowledge of the game and goal umpiring to the young teenagers, both male and female, as they took their first steps in their umpiring career.

Well done, Paul! Congratulations on reaching the fantastic milestone of 250 Division 1 senior games and may there be many more goals and behinds for you to signal and wave not only this season but also in the years ahead as well.






