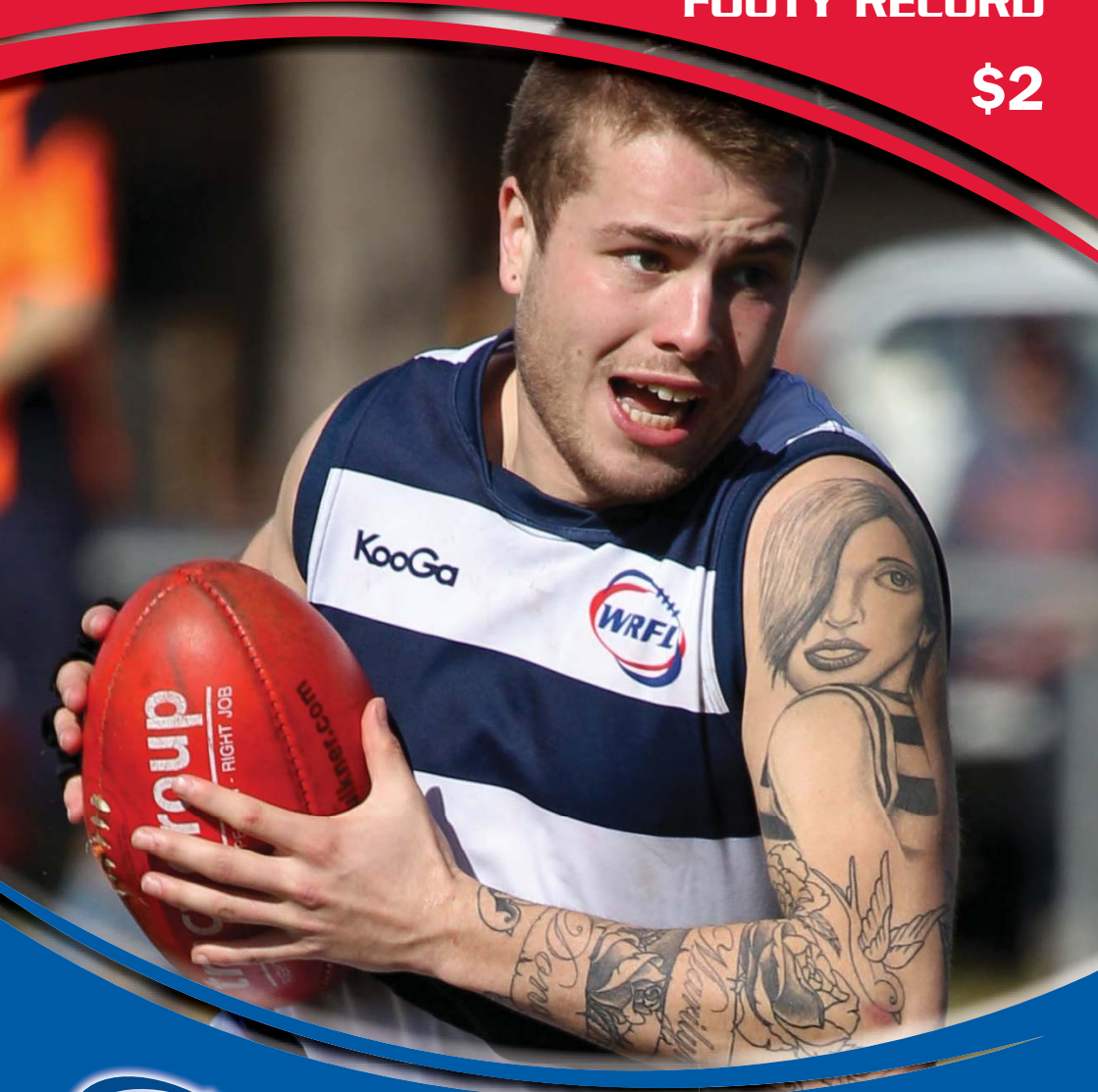

IT'S OUR GAME

Umpiring Is Everyone's Business

“What responsibility do we all have toward generating a positive match-day environment for all our participants; that is, players, coaches, team officials, umpires, parents and spectators?”

It is the coach who sets the tone for the environment on game day, whether positive or negative. The coach needs to be aware of his or her attitude and approach, especially in junior football. They must set an example that is required as part of their accreditation and code of conduct, regardless of circumstances.

So what is success? This is the important question. Your answer will influence your coaching, how you treat your players and how you conduct yourself. Winning and beating the opposition as the key to success is competitive thinking. By defining success as winning, you are placing your self-worth on the line each match.

Achievement thinkers hold that whilst winning is a desirable outcome, it is not the only measure of success. They are gracious in defeat and victory because their self-respect is not on the line. They control what they can and are not frustrated by factors outside their control. They are far less likely to blame umpires or other factors for a defeat.

In short, the junior coach's code of conduct requires familiarisation with and abiding by the Laws of Australian Football, teaching players that rules of the game are mutual agreements, which no player should break, and that the players involved play for fun and enjoyment. This pertains to umpires also, and that winning is only part of it. It emphasises the importance of the learning and development of skills and positive attitudes, the development of team respect for the ability of opponents and judgement of umpires and opposing coaches. When the coach's code of conduct is adhered to, the match-day environment is an enjoyable one. However, coaches will

often get caught between the importance of processes and fun, and the desire to win.

The player's code of conduct promotes never arguing with an official or umpire.

Regarding the parents and spectators of community football, if you disagree with an official or umpire, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning the umpire's judgment and honesty in public. The umpires give their time and effort for your involvement.

As the region grows, and participation rates in football increase, umpiring needs also grow. The difference between the number of umpires required and the number of umpires available is growing exponentially. Nationally, it is predicted to be 25,000 within five years. This is not umpiring's problem. If you don't have them or they are not up to it, then you do not appoint. This is a football problem. This is a challenge that football needs to embrace.

The WRFL has established three umpiring academies within our region – at Mackillop College, Maribyrnong Sports College & at Caroline Springs. With the combination of academies and other recruiting and retention strategies the WRFL has increased our numbers by 100 umpires which has led to more games being officially appointed on a weekly basis.

The WRFL appreciates the role of the club umpire to fill the gaps. Unfortunately over recent years they have been relied upon all too often. It is a goal of the WRFL to rid them of this duty. This will occur through hard work and respect shown by the Western region community towards our developing and existing umpires. Umpiring needs to grow with football. Hence umpiring is everyone's business.

DEER PARK'S DOMINATION

Division Two: Season Review

The smell of cut grass prolongs on the nose, the hours of the light in the day are back extending, we started with eleven teams and after eighteen gripping weeks we find ourselves at the foot of the finals mountain left with five.

Deer Park was by far the outstanding side in 2011, stiff not to make the big dance last year and generously improved in the off-season. The Lions appeared to have one hand on the premiership before the season's first bounce and that assumption still rings true. Perhaps more than we could have imagined. The Lions are sixteen from sixteen, with a percentage over 350. In their closest game they still had a six goal buffer over the Eagles at Yarraville Oval.

The numbers on the Lions 2011 continue to stagger the deeper you crunch them: their average winning margin was 129 points; more impressive was that when they played the eventual four fellow finalists, their average was still an extraordinary 77 points.

Albanvale, their cross-suburb rivals & their closest challenger, finished a very competitive second on the ladder only registering three losses for year. However the closest the Cobras managed to get to the ladder-leaders was an eight goal defeat and trying to topple the minor premiers will remain a very tough task at the least.

Third-placed Parkside and fourth-placed Wyndhamvale provided good stories below the top two all year for very different reasons. A third of the year through, last year's grand finalists were seemingly struggling in seventh. Whilst hardly out of the finals race that early into the campaign, giving six or seven good teams a head start two months into the season doesn't bode well for a team looking to make up for last year's disappointment. They believed they were



good enough to be champions in 2010 and all of a sudden a tough year to make an imprint on 2011 lay ahead.

The Magpies justified their stature however and went on a run to win ten of the next twelve games to climb into third, earning the double chance and having a realistic shot at snatching the first crack at the all-conquering Deer Park in a second-semi final in a week's time.

Many kilometres west a real bolter from last year was emerging, as Wyndhamvale started hot winning three of the first four games of the season. They then plateaued slightly to square the ledger at five and five after ten games of football. Yet six straight wins in the backend of the season saw the Falcons not only solidify an appearance in this year's final series, but after defeating fifth-placed Coburg Districts by a point last week, they may progress past week one as they meet the Lions again for the second week running. Impressive to say the least, the chance to experience a semi final at Albanvale or Parkside in a fortnight's time will be invaluable for this young side who are no doubt a team to watch in years to come.

Coburg Districts were once again professional enough to qualify for the post-season, a dangerous team to anyone who confronts them, while those stiff to miss the five, particularly Yarraville-Seddon, will rue another year short

of the season's primary goal. The Eagles most definitely blew their chances towards the end of the year, winning only one of their last four, and they will be looking to bounce back next year. The side is certainly good enough, it was just a case of seven or eight competitive teams not fitting into a tight final five.

West Footscray on their first year down will be disappointed with missing the finals altogether and Laverton similarly will hold mixed emotions, probably not good enough over a full year but early on they looked to exceed expectations occupying a spot in the five for the first couple of months of the season.

The league's bottom three won seven games between them, Caroline Springs winning four in their debut year, a foundation for better years to come for the Lakers, Braybrook salvaging three opportunities to sing the song in another lean year, and North Sunshine holding up the ladder once again in last.

Another successful season for Division Two, many great stories, many great climbs up the ladder, and many teams falling short when the pressure got too much. But the real question now begs to be answered – can anyone stop the Lions from maintaining their perfect season?

ALL ON THE LINE

Division Two: Finals Preview

In performing arts, the idea of a dress rehearsal is to make sure your lines are embedded in your memory, your movements are all sorted and picture-perfect, your performance come the real thing will come across natural yet well-prepared. The director would be after something so special that a present audience would be on their feet, yet one hopes that it's still got something to give for the real thing on opening night.

Seven days ago Wyndhamvale and Coburg Districts put together a performance that would have thrilled the director, yet would have them nervous. Cole Reserve played host to a classic, the home side up by 14 at quarter time, 18 at the half, the Falcons storming to a 16 point lead at the final change. The Lions mustered a final quarter retaliation, but 3.5 to 1.2 saw them fall agonisingly short, the barest of margins separating the sides at the final siren – the visitors victorious.

The home side will blame their missed opportunities in the final frame, eight scoring shots to three should have seen them home happy winners. But that's football, and now both teams return for a complete take-two in the Elimination Final in a game that truly matters.

Jake Crabtree kicked three for the Falcons last Saturday, Aaron Molivas likewise. David Gamble, Nathan Reschke and captain-coach Luke Dennerley were also solid in the win. All four will need to be at their best again this weekend. For Coburg the likes of the Bektash lads, Adem and Azem, will be important if they want to reverse last Saturday's results, Damien Piperno in the midfield will be important for the service to the forward line, and Joe Cali and Leigh Sporle's performances always a yardstick for how the side fares. Welcome to sudden death football.



Meanwhile much is at stake today at Bruce Reserve when Albanvale square off with Parkside in this weekend's Qualifying Final. The Cobras ambitiously hoped to be the thorn in the Lions' paw this year, bringing down their local rivals in similar fashion to how Albion put a fork in Spotswood's premiership campaign last year.

However, whilst the Cats were successful in their plans last year, the task to dismantle Deer Park proved too great and the Cobalt and White will need to be satisfied with second spot, a home final and the double chance. Only three losses on the year, two of which to the undefeated Deer Park, the only other blight came three weeks ago. The sting was that it was to today's opponent, Parkside.

The Magpies have got themselves in yet another dangerous position, cruising through the regular

season and primed for the time of the year they thrive in. They showed they have what it takes in Round 16 with their 23 point win at the Bruce Reserve. Darcy McMahon kicked a game high four goals that day and is in good form still with a lazy eight seven days back against West Footscray.

With the likes of Peter Kreuger, Chris Muratore and Jo Jamieson all there to support, the Magpies have the cattle to topple the Cobras at home and get that second-semi matchup at Deer Park next week. Matthew Bligh and Shane Barry were amongst the resistance back in Round 16, and will be super important should the home side hold ambitions to succeed. Both Sirianni boys will also be integral, John and Jamie, who were influential in last year's final series and will need to be again today.

And so much will also depend on the Sherif's impact – Mohamed has had a stellar year up forward but needs to keep it up now the competition ramps up. But you'd expect Trent Tyrell might have a say in his performance. Both teams are evenly matched, and both teams can lay claims to favouritism.

North Footscray Kicks Goals With FIDA Team

Aussie Rules is a game which is accepting of everyone, no matter where you are from, or how good you may be at it.

People from all over Australia as far as the Tiwi Islands to Tasmania, men, women and children of all ages and even those who travel from overseas are welcome to play our game.

Yet football has also reached out to some other people who have a passion for the sport; those of the North Footscray Football Club's FIDA team.

The Football Integration Development Association (FIDA) was originally established in 1989 by the Boroondara City Council in conjunction with the Hawthorn Football Club to provide a skills clinic to those with an intellectual disability.

With growing interest in the clinics, the AFL Foundation provided a grant to the program and by 1991; FIDA was created and today is currently run by General Manager Peter Ryan.

Since its humble beginnings, FIDA now has over 400 players involved in the program across Victoria including teams from Gippsland, Broadmeadows, Templestowe, Cranbourne, Lara, North Ballarat, Albury/Wodonga, and Ringwood with Rupertswood planning to join in the near future.

FIDA's main aim is to provide access to football for anyone in Victoria with an intellectual

disability by providing a regular, competitive fixture of Australian Rules Football. The rules are quite similar to the traditional game; however FIDA has only 14 players on the field at one time as well as some other modifications to make it safer for the players.

The North Footscray Football Club has been involved with FIDA for the past three years after rescuing the Maryibrnong Bulldogs FIDA team who were without a home base and no one to care for them.

Administrator for the NFFC, Raeleene Eldridge said that she thought the club would be sceptical of hosting a FIDA team, but was taken aback by how supportive the club's members were.

"Everyone loves having them as part of our club and it has only been positive," says Eldridge.

The North Footscray Devils FIDA team is made up of 12 players and they train every Thursday night before the seniors. The matches are played every second Sunday, with the Grand Final held in August.

"It is a fantastic way for the community to see that football is for everyone. It doesn't matter what type of diversity or what challenges you may have, you can play the game that you love and enjoy it."

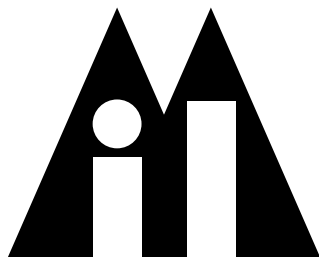

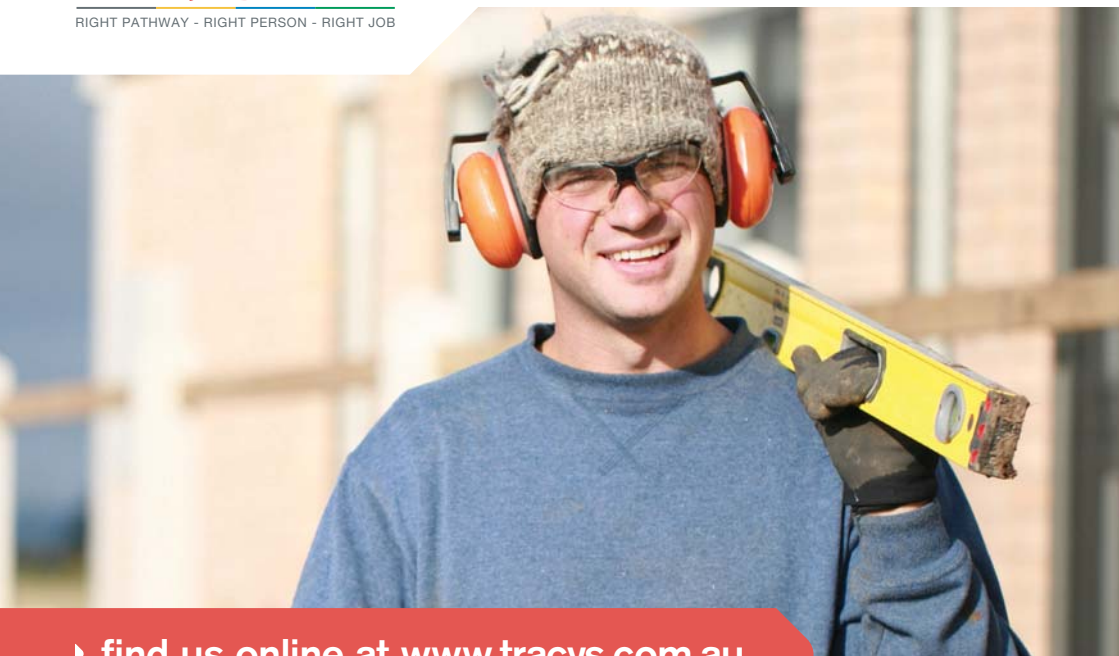
