# LOOKING FORWARD

Season 2011 reaches the high water mark this weekend with eight junior grand finals to be contested at Westbourne Grammar School and both senior divisions contesting finals on Saturday and Sunday at Avalon Airport Oval, Werribee. Six junior grand finals were contested last Sunday, with victories to Altona Juniors (16A), Hoppers Crossing (15A and 14A), Yarraville Seddon (13A) and Williamstown Juniors (12A and 12C). In all, eighteen of the twenty one clubs with junior teams were represented in the finals program. Of the total of 125 junior teams competing in season 2011, 64 had a taste of finals action. Another 50 teams at Under 9 and Under 10 level participated in the Junior Fun Day on the last Sunday in July.

Congratulations to all clubs that have qualified for a place in the finals series, and particularly to those who will and have already achieved the ultimate success.

As the 2011 season draws to an exciting conclusion, planning is already well under way for 2012.

A total review of WRFL Rules and Regulations has commenced, with a view to adoption of the revised documents before year end. The revised Rules and Regulations will correct many anomalies in the current documents and provide for more efficient processing of day-to-day issues and disciplinary matters.

As part of the planning process for the 2012 season, clubs will be surveyed over coming weeks for their views on some of the critical structural issues for both senior and junior competitions. Some of the issues to be canvassed will include:

- With the continuing competitive imbalance in both senior divisions, and little prospect of attracting new senior sides in the immediate future, should we revisit the prospect of splitting into 3 divisions (say, 8+7+6), or should we maintain the status quo (2 divisions, 10+11)?
- Is the current Under 18 ½ age group the best solution? Should it be either Under 17 ½ or Under 19?
- Should the Under 18 competition (or any variation thereof) be graded, or should Under 18 teams continue to be fixtured in line with their Senior and Reserves teams?
- Should the junior competition age groups remain unchanged (Under 9 to Under 16), or perhaps increase by a year to Under 10 to Under 17?

Clubs are asked to participate fully in the review and planning process, initially through careful and considered response to the survey that will be circulated in the next few days. The review process will be thorough to ensure that all views are considered and that any proposed changes are fully understood. Should any changes be warranted, they will need to be endorsed under the provisions of current Rules no later than early November.

# CATS FIRM AS FAVOURITES

## Division One: Season Review

Eighteen rounds are in the book and now we get into the nitty gritty. Division One has thrown up a season of twists and turns, certainties and surprises, and all the good (and occasionally bad) stories that make up a suburban football season.

Albion when it's all said and done have been crowned minor premiers, justification that they weren't just the team who set their task on the big game last year. The Cats focused in on the Woodsmen so intently that the underdogs got under the skin of the lay-down-misere favourites and the prize was caught.

Following last year's surprise success we were asking if Albion could back it up? Would they prove that they weren't just a good side who nailed their analysis on Spotswood last year? Could they return in 2011 as reigning premiers and continue to improve and dominate the competition?

Absolutely! Only one loss and one draw blighted an immaculate season for the blue and white hoops, and the week off is well and truly earned.

As for Spotswood, they couldn't quite back up their home & away dominance in 2011, their season almost a complete one bar a couple of slip ups to Albion & St Albans. But sometimes it is easier to be the hunter than the hunted, and Spotty are still definitely genuine contenders as we enter the business end of the season.

The roles have somewhat reversed. The pressure now resides on the shoulders of Albion, minor premiers & reigning premiers – and anything other than back to back flags will probably be tagged as a failure.

Over at Spotty, where the ultimate success is seen as a pass mark, they have an expectation, not an ambition. They have a yardstick to chase, and in a year where so many personnel changes have lowered external expectations, those on the inside are gunning to bring the Albion party to a very sudden conclusion.

The culmination of the five took up until the final rounds to take shape – an intriguing four-way duel pushing the sides to breaking point. Altona was arguably the most comfortable of the quartet, settling into third place as the home & away season wound down. A consistent year saw them finish on twelve wins, and at times the Vikings have looked to have the tools at their disposal that on their day they could take down an Albion or a Spotswood. And for all we know, that 'day' could very well be at the old Chirnside Park in just under a month's time.

However, much to Spotswood's bemusement, a perennial finals player has re-emerged. Port Colts have

slithered into fourth, equal on wins with Altona, and have showed real promise throughout 2011. Whilst they didn't quite manage to land the big scalp they craved so badly, they delivered in a big way on rectifying an under-par 2010, and the Colts would definitely have a few teams hot under the collar knowing that when finals come around, this is a club to avoid.

St Albans though was quite possibly the story of the year. Tipped to rise, perhaps along with Sunshine, their sudden parabolic surge up the ladder took many by surprise, from Altona who temporarily lost their hold on third place during the season right up to Spotswood who lost their first game at home in an eternity to the Saints back in Round 13.

The good form came together really quickly, winning five of the first seven, then five of the next six. Sure they only managed to win only one more game on the home straight, but an impressive season amassed by the Saints no question. The next big thing is to see what it was all for, was it just a flash in the pan or can they show some of that spark in a big final and win one, maybe two?

As aforementioned, four participants, three chairs, and the unlucky entrant when the music stopped was Hoppers Crossing. Right on pace going into the final rounds, the Warriors dropped off towards the end finishing with nine and a half wins. Some encouraging performances along the way but when it came to the crunch against sides on their pegging, the results weren't there, and subsequently neither was a finals berth.

The grave disappointment was Sunshine. The Kangaroos were tipped to join some of the bigger sides and really give the top of the table a shake, but six wins

will be seen as a gross failure, a result that falls short of both internal and external expectations. To see them bounce back next year will attract many an eye. How will they respond from such a deflating year? Can they produce a year late or is the worst yet to come?

The final three spots weren't overly unimaginable pre-season, Sunshine Heights notching four wins for the year, North Footscray in their promoted year a win below, while Glenorden lost all their games plus their coach mid-season. As for next year the Dragons will be aiming to make ground on that into 2012, the Red Devils will be better for the run, and the Hawks have some big decisions to make.

All in all we find ourselves at the gate of the finals, with the favourites and underdogs in reversed roles from the season before. Add to that the ambitious Vikings, the seasoned Colts and the giant-killing Saints and we are no doubt in for a cracking finals series.

# FINALS HEAT UP

## *Finals Preview (27-28 August)*

**W**ith so much finals action across the board this weekend in the WRFL it's almost impossible to know where to focus your attention. It all starts in Division One on Saturday with Spotswood taking on Altona in the Qualifying Final at Avalon Airport Oval, while Sunday sees Port Colts clashing with St Albans in the Elimination Final at the same venue.

The Woodsmen find themselves in an unusual position, forced into playing the first week of the post-season, a weekend usually pencilled in for respite and recovery. That luxury this year goes to Albion, a deserved minor premier, and no doubt representatives of the Cats will be in attendance on Saturday to see who confronts them next week in the all important second semi.

Much is at stake, the winner has first crack at Albion, while the loser faces either the Colts or Saints and whichever it shall be will be buoyed by their triumph and excited by the possibility of stringing together consecutive finals wins. And make no mistake, whoever wins the Elimination Final on Sunday has a real shot at making the Preliminary Final in a fortnight's time.

Port Colts have made significant gains this season and do have the seasoned finals culture to lay the foundations for a solid four week campaign. St Albans on the other hand have offered plenty this year, surprising many, thrilling the rest, while putting opposition sides on notice. They will have the top two getting nervous the further they progress.

Division Two enters the second week and four teams remain in the mix. The big clash is in the Second Semi-Final on Sunday at Crofts Reserve, as Albanvale attempts to make it third time lucky against a rampant Deer Park. The winner earns a spot in the decider in a fortnight's time, while the other has to front up in next week's Preliminary Final against the victor of the First Semi-Final.

In that game Parkside will go in favourites, but those who write off Wyndhamvale do so at their own peril as the Falcons are the real wildcard in the pack. The Magpies are a very good side, and will be brimmed with confidence about making yet another Preliminary Final, but Wyndhamvale have shown glimpses of superb football and a big pre-season should mean they can still deliver this deep into the finals. Whilst both games have strong favourites, it'll be to the Pies' downfall should they look ahead to a predicted Albanvale matchup in a week as the Falcons are no easybeats and will give themselves every chance to bring down last year's grand finalists.

In the Reserves, Division One sees Spotswood and Sunshine in the Qualifying Final, Albion and St Albans in the eliminator, and for one the season comes to an end.

Division Two has Deer Park and Parkside playing off for a Grand Final spot, Albanvale and Coburg Districts in a sudden death matchup, with the winner looking to playoff in next week's Preliminary Final.

Interestingly enough, they were not players but, in fact, were the three boundary umpires who were appointed for the match. Obviously they were either

caught napping or the field umpire had forgotten to warn them that he was about to start the game.

Out at Westbourne, in one of the junior games, a defending player took a mark close to the opposition's behind line. As he went back through the behind area, the field umpire directed the player on the mark to come back five metres as per the rule book. # WYNDHAM HOME TO WRFL FOOTBALL

## *Grand Finals To Be Staged In Key Growth Area*

**T**he Western Region Football League has furthered its partnership with Wyndham City, announcing Avalon Airport Oval in Werribee & Westbourne Grammar in Truganina as their Grand Final venues.

All senior Grand Finals will be played at Avalon Airport Oval, also known as Chirnside Park, and will give locals the chance to see some of the best suburban football on offer in the west. The majority of senior finals in a lead-up to the Division One & Division Two deciders will also be played at the venue.

For the first time the WRFL has also decided to stage all junior Grand Finals in Wyndham City, with Westbourne Grammar announced as the host of all Grand Finals from Under-11's through to Under-16's.

Football Operations Manager, David Newton, said hosting the finals in Wyndham City was a perfect fit given the number of junior players in the area.

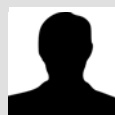

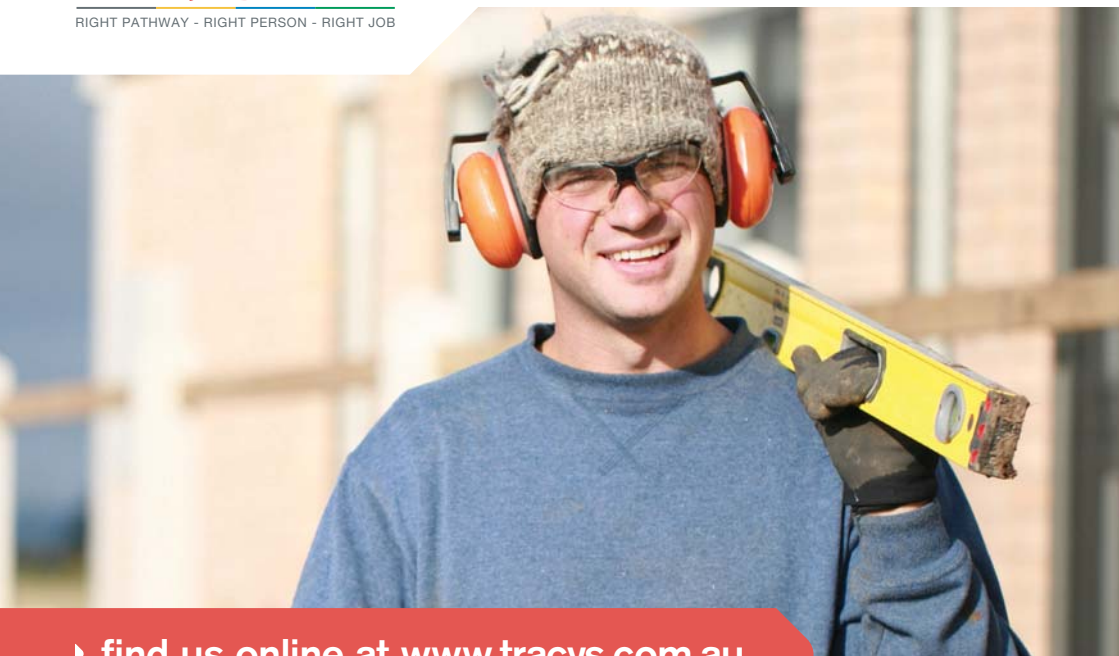
