PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

Delivering An Even Competition

Welcome to the third week of the Senior Finals Series. With only a handful of teams left in the mix in 2011, we are getting ever closer to crowning our premiership teams.

Off the field the Western Region Football League continues to plan for the 2012 season, as we aim to set the strategic direction of the League for the immediate future. Prior to last season a number of workshops were run aimed at identifying the issues perceived as most important to club representatives. Those addressed as the most important were:

- Home of WRFL – accessibility, storage, cost, exposure and degree of independence.
- Reputation and image – how the WRFL and its member clubs are perceived in the Community.
- Umpire recruitment – retention, education and support.
- Retention and growth – junior and senior club/player numbers.
- Club Development – a strong push for WRFL to invest in club development through the employment of a club development officer and via the new CEO role.
- Evenness of Competition – for both juniors and seniors.

Throughout the course of 2010, a detailed strategic plan was developed to address each of the key issues. Significant progress has since been made in completion of the deliverables for all issues with the notable exception of the last – Evenness of Competition, especially at senior and Under 18 levels.

A detailed market review has indicated that, short of amalgamation with another League, it is highly unlikely that four or more additional senior clubs can be secured by the WRFL in the immediate term. This is due to new junior clubs initiated in outer growth corridors taking at least 6-8 years to reach the stage where a demand for senior teams becomes an issue; pressure on the league to maintain the current number of senior clubs due to aggressive 'poaching' from neighbouring leagues; and the lack of potential clubs interested in joining the league with the required standards of financial security and administrative competence that are required for admission.

Ongoing concerns for the competitive imbalance across both senior divisions expressed by club officials, Executive Board members and local media articles led to the recent formation of an Executive Board Working Party to re-visit the issues and propose possible remedies. The Working Party is now in the process of consulting clubs, and canvassing a number of alternatives for Season 2012.

A questionnaire has been prepared to canvass the opinions of clubs in relation to the competition structure issues considered by the Working Party. All clubs are requested to discuss the issues at Committee level and provide response to the survey questions. Depending on the responses received, one or more meetings of member clubs will be convened in the coming weeks to consider any changes proposed for season 2012.

A GRAND FINAL REMATCH

Finals Preview (3-4 September)

It is crunch time across the Western Region Football League, and while several Grand Finalists have already been decided, the rest will continue to extend their seasons on a week to week basis as we close in on the big deciders. For those who win this weekend, they edge closer to the ultimate prize, and will be just one or two wins away from a goal that has been nine months in the making. For others it will be the start of a long off-season, as they dissect what went wrong and how they can make amends in twelve months time.

In Division One, a big opening to the finals series last weekend has both games this weekend on a knife's edge. The all important Second Semi Final between Albion and a rampaging Spotswood has the whole league's focus this week with a Grand Final berth on offer. No-one can question the Cats' validity as minor premiers, it's justifiably deserved, but all of a sudden the Woodsmen's demolition of Altona last Saturday has given the green and gold a momentum that may overcome all, even the well rested champions. Spotswood were favourites against the Vikings, but to lead by triple figures at the last break would have had the attending Albion hierarchy a little nervous no doubt. A bumper WRFL classic ensues.

Meanwhile the other Semi Final has the Vikings looking to bounce back against Port Colts after their savage beating last weekend. The Colts mustered a

spectacular final stanza comeback to prevail after an impressive St Albans did all the hard work early and will no doubt go in confident they can bundle the Vikings out in straight sets.

In Division Two it's the penultimate weekend of football, with Deer Park already preparing for the big game in seven days time. Their comprehensive destruction of Albanvale was clinical & resounding, and despite only leading by a goal at the first change the Lions banged on 19 goals to four over the next two quarters to put the game, and probably the flag, beyond doubt.

That destruction means the Cobras now face up against the continuing fairytale taking place down at Wyndhamvale. Given little hope against the seasoned Parkside, the Falcons made the early running and by three-quarter time were up by 35 points. It was enough for them to withhold a Magpies fight-back in the final term and this weekend the Falcons will give themselves every chance to knock off the highly regarded Cobras.

The Reserves competitions are also nearing a climax and Division One has some intense Semi Finals in store. Sunshine's unexpected win came in extra-time against Spotswood last weekend as the Kangaroos fought back to level the score at the final siren before running over the top of the Woodsmen in the extra period. There was much confusion at the final siren as the scores were checked, and

checked again, and now the Kangaroos have earned the first crack at Hoppers Crossing while Spotswood face Albion. The Kangaroos will fancy themselves against the Warriors, and a Grand Final spot is at stake for two clubs who will be looking for some joy amidst the disappointment of their seniors not fulfilling pre-season expectations.

A division down we're at Preliminary Final weekend, with Deer Park taking on Coburg Districts. Parkside is the first side into the 2011 Grand Final after eclipsing Deer Park last weekend, and now they wait to see which Lions will be their opponent. The Districts overcame Albanvale to qualify for another weekend of football, and will be looking to catch the blue and gold on the hop and make it one weekend more.

Finally the Under 18's competition is at the pointy end with St Albans aiming for their second upset in as many weeks against the highly fancied Hoppers Crossing. The minor premiers haven't lost since the opening round of the season, and will back themselves against a side that produced the biggest upset around the grounds last weekend. In the Second Semi Final Altona meets Spotswood, their vastly differing records at the end of the home & away season enough to suggest the Vikings should live to fight another day.

In Division Two the Point Cook juggernaut continued with the Bulldogs booking a week off,

Albion need to be congratulated on being the minor premiers for the 2011 Home and Away season, but they will be aware that it now means very little as their campaign to win back to back premierships begins against Spotswood in today's second Semi Final.

The Woodsmen, who had a win last week, will be extremely keen to book themselves the first spot in this year's Grand Final. To do this, the talented Cats forward line must be contained. Bloomfield and Grenville and the exciting young Finco are game winners. The match ups that the Spotswood coaching staff have in line for these Albion forwards will be important. Ayton and Phillips may get first go, but do not be surprised if a different Woodsmen player like Fowler gets a job on the key Cats forwards. Albion may then rotate the strong Stephens brothers or the now very versatile Butina deep into attack. They have a variety of options.

Spotswood's forward structure is also on fire. Cloke was great last week with 7 goals; the mobile Hucker kicked 5 and the hard attack of Sharp can create headaches for the Albion

defenders. The Woodsmen also have on-ballers who can play forward and kick goals. This includes Chris O'Keefe, who has had a great last month around the goal square.

The Albion defenders are big and strong. Haldane, Richards, Davis and Manton have a wealth of experience between them and will no doubt be prepared for any match ups. It will be interesting if the Woodsmen go in with an extra small forward line.

Mid-field pressure is required to be full on by both sides. If Spotswood allow Marcus Smith and McPherson or Shylo Smith easy possession of the football then entry inside their 50m will be plenty.

On the other side Albion must be very wary of the class in O'Keefe, Couch, Baker and Morgan that the Woodsmen have in their on-ball brigade. Throw in the tough nut Audley and they could be hard to contain. Both these teams are very good. Both have talent and very exciting youth in their line ups. This will be a ripper of a game.

It was a result that no one saw coming. Altona were meant to be a class above St Albans, and all the statistics suggested as much. They were 2-0 against the Saints this year, were on a six game winning streak, and until the final round of the season were sitting atop the Division One ladder. On the other hand St Albans were three wins behind the Vikings at the end of the home & away season, but more significantly hadn't won a game for all of August.

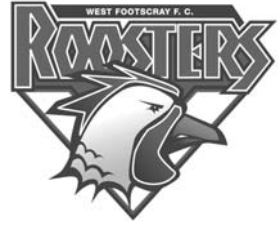

Falcons Continue To Impress

It seemed very unlikely midway through the year, but Wyndhamvale is among the last three standing in the Division Two competition after defeating Parkside by 20 points in the first semi-final last Sunday. It was the Falcons' eighth win in a row since being belted by 108 point by Deer Park back in Round Eleven.

At that stage many had them penciled in as an outside chance of making the five, however a brilliant run of form in the final half of the season has seen Luke Dennerley's side charge into the finals and progress all the way to the penultimate weekend of football.

Dennerley praised the efforts of his younger players, who came to the fore in the latter stages of the game. He was particularly chuffed with Aaron Fleming, who broke his leg at the start of the year but rebounded superbly and played his best game of the season on Sunday. Power forward Dean Cachia had a nasty stomach bug but soldiered on and kicked three goals.



"We need to play our way for longer periods in the game again. Certainly if we're allowed to do that we can be damaging.

"We used the wings pretty well on the weekend but Albanvale is a terrific team, their run and spread is pretty good and their forward half's excellent as well, so we've got to be on our toes."

"We talked about the lack of importance winning eight on the trot has on gameday. It can be really daunting the number, and guys can start to get really bogged down in that and think it's just going to happen," Dennerley said.

Wyndhamvale now face Albanvale at Crofts Reserve this Sunday with a spot in the Grand Final against Deer Park on the line.

Albanvale vs Wyndhamvale (Preliminary Final)

With a Grand Final berth the prize, the Division Two Preliminary Final draws together Albanvale and the Wyndham Vale Falcons and they have come to this point after a tumultuous semi final weekend last week. Albanvale started brightly against the juggernaut of Deer Park before submitting in catastrophic fashion to its local rival by 129 points. The Falcons, on the other hand, had one of the great wins of their history to reach this moment, when they outplayed an experienced Parkside, leading all day and claiming a 20-point victory. How Albanvale reacts to the adversity of a drubbing and how a young Wyndhamvale outfit copes with the pressure of such an important game are the significant psychological questions and the testing material for the respective coaches, Dave Connell and Luke Dennerley.

The Cobras are built around an experienced midfield and a vast array of running options. Ibrahim Atik is Albanvale's playmaker and will be someone the Falcons will look to close down to prevent his mercurial creativity being influential. Experienced pair Paul Docherty and Shane Barry are prolific ball winners and Andrew Portelli, Matthew Bligh and Michael Spatolisano provide run. Up forward, Micka Lindsay and Sherif Mohamed are the known goalkickers and are difficult to match up on, both being adept on the lead, in contested situations and also at ground level. Falcon backmen Chris Klein-Breteler and Aidan Boland are likely to have their hands full. Albanvale has a workmanlike backline,

led by Brendan Cassar, who is sure to be given an important job, the versatile John Sirrianni, Chris Lock and strong-bodied skipper Adam Borg.

The Falcons have a quality ruckman in Nathan Reschke, who will probably be the pivotal player on the ground, as the ruck is an area in which the Falcons may have the ascendancy. Dennerley is a terrific leader and player and will compete through the midfield at Reschke's feet in an effort to inspire his young running brigade to supply spearhead Dean Cachia, the lively Paul Manitta and crumbers Aaron Molivas and Jake Crabtree with goal-scoring opportunities in the Falcon forward arc. Looming on the horizon as well is Nathan Evans, likely to return from an unfortunate suspension to add some class up forward. James Damjanovski and Daniel Bunworth are excellent utilities and use the ball well, particularly if deployed from either half-back flank and if they can run amok, so likely will Wyndhamvale.

A terrific contest is likely. Albanvale will start the favourites to navigate to a Grand Final berth against Deer Park. They have the stronger bodies, they have beaten the Falcons comfortably in their only matchup this year and they have the experience. But don't count out the Wyndhamvale Falcons, who have inspirational leadership in their corner, the better form, youthful exuberance and a nothing-to-lose attitude. Should be a cracking game!

UMPIRES CORNER

Alan Pascoe is one of the well-known and likable characters of the WRFL. He has also been a popular member of the umpiring fraternity for more than a decade. Alan took some time out to jot down a brief profile of his life in sport.

He was born a few days after Christmas Day in 1940 and lived in Ascot Vale until he was five years old and then moved to Sunshine. Alan attended Sunshine State School and Sunshine Technical School and also had one year at the Powell Street State School. He played football at Sunshine Tech and in 1956 played in the football side that were Metro champions. When he left school, he did an apprenticeship as a motor mechanic. Alan married his lovely wife Lyn in 1966 and they have four wonderful children in Julie, Nicole, Jodie and Scott who have produced eleven grandchildren.

He played his junior football at Braybrook but also was a promising junior athlete. Alan once ran four minutes and eight seconds for the mile and a fantastic ten seconds flat for the 100 yards at the age of sixteen. Unfortunately, at the age of nineteen he was involved in a nasty car accident. This curtailed his athletic abilities and meant that he was not allowed to participate in any contact sport. This did not stop Alan and a little while later he tried to play senior football with Sunshine in the Metropolitan League and then with Albion in the Footscray Football District League. He is the first to admit that he was just honest but average footballer.

In 1968 Lyn and Alan moved to Hoppers Crossing where they still reside to-day. Over the years, Alan worked many jobs and achieved a degree in business management and went on to manage numerous service stations throughout the Western Suburbs. Eventually, he got involved in football again as a coach of the juniors at Kingsville YMCA. Alan stayed there for three years before coaching for one season at Crossroads which is now known as North Sunshine. A further stint of coaching for four years at Deer Park then followed. As a junior coach, Alan met with some success but was unable to secure a flag before he retired from football in general.

Some years later, he received a phone call from his brother-in-law that Deer Park needed someone to umpire a game for them. Alan was a little stunned when he was told that he was the umpire that everyone was expecting to turn up. Being such a nice guy, and not wanting to disappoint the young footballers, Alan duly went along and officiated as a club field umpire. This eventually led to him joining the ranks of the WRFL umpires and he has never looked back.

Also, Alan has held a very responsible job working as an interchange steward for the last twenty-eight years for the AFL. During this time he has in three grand finals, namely in 1989, 1992 and 2003. These three games are held very high in Alan's list of achievements. Even so, in his eyes, they still fall short of his greatest achievement which is being appointed as a field umpire to his first Division One senior game at the age of sixty-one.

In 2005, Alan retired from umpiring to travel around Australia in his new caravan with his wife, Lyn, which took 7 months of great adventure. Prior to leaving, the lovely folk at Wyndhamvale Football Club gave him a wonderful send off which included a banner to run through and write-ups in the local newspapers.

Some probably thought that that was the end of Alan's involvement in terms of football umpiring but upon his return, the bug had bitten him again and umpiring was on again. At this stage, Alan really doesn't really know if and when he will retire but he sincerely appreciates the respect that he receives from all the clubs and the players when he turns up on game day. When Alan does retire he would like to be remembered as a good ordinary umpire.

People of the calibre of Alan Pascoe are worth their weight in gold, irrespective of whether they are members of the local football club or someone willing to pick up a whistle and take control of the game. The WRFL, and our community in general, need the likes of Alan who has made his mark on our association through his dedication to umpiring and through the respect and the positive communication he displays both on and off the field and his special brand of humour. Hopefully, he will still be involved in umpiring in 2012.
