The 2011 WRFL season comes to a fitting climax today with the long-awaited rematch of last year's Grand Finalists and competition pacesetters, Albion and Spotswood. Albion dispelled any doubts as to their quality in last year's Grand Final, defeating the fast-finishing Spotswood favourites by seventeen points in a high-standard game. The rivalry has continued in 2011 with a score line of one close win each in the home and away season; and Albion recording a narrow win in the second semi-final just two weeks ago. The scene is set for another thriller today, following Spotswood's heart-stopping win over Altona by the narrowest possible margin in last week's preliminary.

In Division 2, Deer Park Football Club scored a big win over Albanvale in the Grand Final last Sunday. Deer Park will be promoted to Division 1 in 2012 and are sure to stamp themselves as worthy competitors in the top grade.

In the junior grades, a total of fourteen Grand Finals were decided in recent weeks, following a hectic program of lead-up finals involving sixty-four junior teams in fifty-six games. Another fifty teams of Under 9s and Under 10s participated in the Junior Fun Day program at the end of their season, hosted by Flemington Juniors, North Footscray and North Sunshine Football Clubs.

Congratulations to all clubs, teams, players and officials who have contributed to the success of the WRFL this year. With 30 clubs, 234 teams and more than 6,000 registered players, this League contributes significantly to both the economic activity and social fabric of Melbourne's fast-growing western region; and is well-placed to accommodate and nurture new clubs as the population grows.

Thanks to the Councils of the western region (Brimbank, Hobsons Bay, Maribyrnong, Melton and Wyndham) who provide the facilities essential to our success. Particular

thanks to Wyndham City Council and the Werribee Tigers Football Club for their support and assistance in making

Avalon Airport Oval available over the full five weeks of our senior finals program. With Williamstown's Burbank Oval closed for major works, Avalon Airport Oval was the only secure event venue available this year. We look forward to the prospect of sharing the finals load next year over two high-quality venues in Werribee and Williamstown.

Thanks also to Westbourne Grammar School and Old Westbourne Football Club for hosting a full, four-week program of junior finals at magnificent facilities in Truganina. Along with Crofts and Grant Reserves (Hobsons Bay Council), we will be keen to secure a long-term arrangement with Westbourne Grammar as the key venue for junior finals.

The WRFL Footy Record was re-born this year after an absence from home & away rounds for the past seven years. Editor Cam Nation has done a wonderful job of delivering news and statistics to the WRFL community through both this publication and www.wrfl.asn.au. Through more than 30,000 copies of the Record and 70,000 absolute unique visitors to the website during the season alone, we have been able to offer much improved service and exposure to our commercial and sponsoring partners. We thank all of those individuals and organisations who have supported the work of the WRFL this year and look forward to extending those relationships over many years to come.

Good luck to all teams competing on this final day of WRFL football for season 2012. May the better teams win and may all games be conducted in the spirit of sportsmanship.

Grand Final: Albion vs Spotswood

The Division One Grand Final finishes off the 2011 WRFL season and it is likely to finish it off in grand style. Albion and Spotswood meet again, just as they did last year, and it promises to be an equally good affair.

Albion, the reigning premier, has had a terrific season, but it has been a different season from them this year. Last year, they struggled early before successfully recalibrating with an injection of youth and some improved structures. This year, with an established game style and a finely tuned squad, the Cats have been at or near the peak of the ladder all year long.

Spotswood have been with them all the way, though - the Woodsman suffered the loss of key personnel in the offseason, but with the arrivals of Jason Cloke, Tom Langlands and Torin Baker and the continued development of its home-grown products, have once again been a force.

So the Cats and the Woodsmen meet again on the third Saturday in September. Albion got to this point with a semi-final win over Spotswood two weeks ago. They held sway for most of the day before Spotswood surged home and almost pinched it - Donny Bloomfield's two late goals earning Albion a week's break. And they can be thankful for that. Altona tested Spotswood in a brutal preliminary final, which stretched every sinew of the Woodsmen. It was a classic game and how Spotswood cope in the aftermath will be critical today. It was a searching examination and they now they must conquer a fresher Albion team.

Matchups will be pivotal. The Dylan Ayton & Shaydon Bloomfield contest will be worth the price of admission - Spotswood's entertaining Tasmanian defender likely to duel with the competition's most exciting player deep in Albion's forward fifty. At the other end of the ground, Jason Cloke is arguably the most important figure in the game and will find an opponent either in the shape of Jason Butina, who was quite good at full back two weeks ago, or John Haldane. Cameron Sharp has been a livewire at his feet and Matthew Davis may once again get a role on him.

In the midfield, Albion's Marcus Smith has become one of the competition's premier running players with his speed and crisp ball use and may go head to head with Chase Morgan, the competition's best

stopper and an elite midfielder in his own right, working with his equally hard-working team-mate in Tom Langlands. As with any match, stoppages will be important and if the bullocking Jeremy Bond can outwit and out-angle James Philpot in the ruck, that will be significant in what will be an interesting battle featuring contrasting approaches to the dark science of tap ruckwork.

It is harder to pinpoint some of the other matchups with any certainty, but identifying key players isn't. Glenn Manton will be of enormous importance for the Cats, zoning off in defence and marshalling Albion's back six, as will hardworking centre-half-forward James Stephens.

Spotswood will be hoping Chris O'Keefe is back to his hard-running best on Grand Final Day and they will likely get a spiritual and muscular boost from the return of skipper Ray Jensen from suspension. Throw in Albion's exciting youngsters Todd Finco and Shylo Smith and the game is dripping with interesting matchups and players. It should be spectacular viewing, so sit back or stand upright and enjoy as WRFL season 2011 goes out with a bang.

Herb Pascarl Medal

The best on ground medal in the Division One Grand Final is named in honour of one the league's founders, Herb Pascarl. He was in part responsible for the league's formation in 1931 and was a league delegate for 20 years. He was also a member, President and administrator of the Parkside Football Club, has a pavilion named in his honour there and is considered one of the legends of the club.

Deer Park Claims Division Two Premiership

Deer Park completed a remarkable undefeated season with a 131-point annihilation of Albanvale in the WRFL Division Two grand final on Sunday. It was almost the same margin that separated the two in the qualifying final, indicating just how far ahead of the field Deer Park has been this season.

Few would have been surprised by the one-sided nature of the grand final, but while it was not an ideal result from a league perspective, it does raise hopes for a closer Division One and Division Two competition next season.

Albanvale did not help matters with its defensive mindset. The flooding tactics were somewhat effective in the first quarter, when the Cobras held Deer Park to four goals, but the problem was they were not getting any penetration themselves. The 37-12 inside fifty count at half-time told the tale.

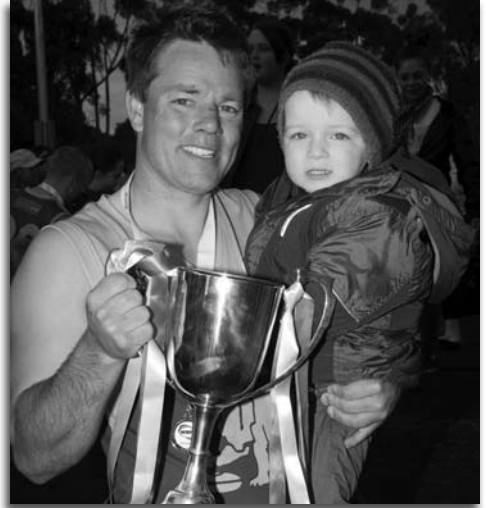
Once the Lions improved their delivery into the forward line, the juggernaut could not be stopped. Coach James Condos, the undisputed star of Division Two, bagged seven goals, while Christian Day won the Rex Swann medal for best on ground with his 40-possession performance.

Nick Condos, who co-coaches Deer Park with his son James, said promotion to Division One was the ultimate goal for the Lions.

"We worked very hard. We started way back in October. It's a long process and eventually we got the rewards that we worked hard for," he said.

"Promotion was our main goal but obviously we didn't want to get too far ahead of ourselves. But we're putting plans into process so we can go up there and not just be one of the numbers, we want to go up there and have a real input into the competition."

"I've been in this game for a long time and obviously James (Condos) has been around footy

for a while. The players that we went out to recruit were all quality people and we knew they would mix in and work in so it was really good."

"The culture's very good at the club. Mark McGoldrick, the president of the footy club has been around footy for a long time and he knows what it takes and he's targeted the right people, hopefully and we'll go forward from there."

While Deer Park has been the dominant team all season, Condos said his players did not go into the grand final with a sense of entitlement.

"When you're a coach if you start thinking like that it gets ahead of you," said Condos.

"You take the scoreboard out of it and you're still yelling and screaming in the last quarter like you were in the first quarter."

He certainly did not stop barking orders at his players until the final siren. The Lions wanted a demolition, and that's what they got.

UMPIRES CORNER

Hall Of Fame

The WRFL Umpires held their mid-season Hall Of Fame Dinner Dance last month with Ian Stewart & Phil Snow inducted to the Umpires Association Hall Of Fame. Umpiring stalwart Terry O'Donnell was also elevated to Legend Status. The WRFL congratulates all three on these prestigious honours.

IAN STEWART first became associated with the Footscray District Football League in the late 1970's. He joined at a time when the field umpires boasted names such as Bob Madigan, Roy Hamilton, Bob Manton, Paul Saville, Peter Starford, Colin Edwards, Keith Marchioni and Glen Thompson. Running the boundary were the likes of Darren O'Flarity, Michael Saunders, Kelvin Manning, John Shadlow and Paul Claughton. Some of the goal umpires of that era were Graham Saville, Michael Daglish, Rod Davies, Peter Chettle, Noel Grant, Kim Bright, Daryl Honey and Neil Moorfoot. Others like Jim Rayner, Henry McFerran, John Booker and Eric Knight were umpiring in the lower grades. Ian Stewart umpired for over a decade in the FDFL and was rewarded with a series of grand finals during that time. He umpired the Under 17A grand final in 1981 and followed this with consecutive A1 senior grand finals in 1982, 1983, 1984 and 1985. This was when the local field umpires were extremely strong in talent and depth. He also umpired the 1988 and 1989 A2 Seniors grand finals. Ian was also a top professional runner in his time winning many distance races. After leaving the FDFL Ian continued his umpiring career for a few more years elsewhere. In 2011 he was inducted into the WRFL's Umpires Association's Hall of Fame

PHIL SNOW began umpiring at the North Footscray Football Club as a club boundary umpire in the late 1970's under the guidance of Bill Pride. One of his teachers at Willy Tech,

namely Harold Mason who had many connections with the local football fraternity, encouraged Phil to join the Footscray District Football League as a boundary umpire. So in 1979 at the age of fifteen, he became an official umpire running the boundary for a couple of years in mainly A1 and A1 reserves games. Phil then became a central umpire on Sundays doing junior games before making the step up into the Under 17 grade on Saturday mornings. He was often teamed up with Alan Clough, Henry McFerran and Jim Rayner and then began to umpire on Saturday afternoons in various senior games. Phil did umpire at the top level in the FDFL and also officiated in the Under 17B grand final in 1988, the Under 16 grand final in 1990 and the A2 reserves grand final in 1991. That was when he moved to Mulgrave mainly due to family and business reasons. He also served the umpires off the field as social secretary from 1984 until 1994. In 1989 Phil was made a life member of the Umpires Association and went on to complete approximately twenty years of umpiring in the FDFL. In 2011 he was fittingly inducted into the WRFL's Umpires Association's Hall of Fame.

TERRY O'DONNELL has been a familiar face around the local grounds since 1986 although his background into umpiring goes right back to 1961. He began in the VFL Reserves and served as a field umpire until 1966 when he was promoted to the VFL senior panel from 1966 until 1985. Terry umpired many country games week in and week out during this time. In 1976 he was awarded Life Membership of the VFL (now AFL) Umpires Association. In 1980 Terry was given a special award from the VFL Umpires Association and won the "Bishop Shield" (Umpire of year award) in 1981. Part of the award was a trip to Bali. In that year, Terry was also instrumental in developing the modified rules for Irish tours (in conjunction with Alan Schwab). He officiated

as the Australian umpire for the Australian tour for the first visit by the Irish side. These rules are the basis for those now used for all tours.

Terry is the secretary and also a life member of the AFL Umpires Golf Club. In 2008 he was an inaugural inductee into AFL Umpires Hall Of Fame. In 1986 Terry was appointed as Umpires Adviser for the FDFL/WRFL, a position he held until 2002. He was also heavily involved in the merger of the Western Suburban Football League with the Footscray District Football League for 1989. Since 2003 Terry has been secretary of the WRFL Umpires Association and has served it with distinction and true passion. It was only a matter of time before he was inducted into the WRFL Umpires Hall of Fame and it wasn't a great surprise (although it was to Terry!) when he was elevated to legend status during 2011. Another fitting tribute for Terry was when he was made a Life Member of the WRFL in 2000.

Earlier this month ten WRFL senior boundary umpires had the very rare opportunity to train with the VFL development & senior boundary umpire squads at Victoria Park. These local umpires were the only umpires outside of the SANFL & WAFL to have had the opportunity to train with the VFL squad. The umpires were, Luke Wilke, Adrian Terrill, Cameron Rycott, Dominic Hoskins, Monique Auciello, Justin Moloney, Patrick Galea, Matt Mather, Bianca Michetti & James Scholes.

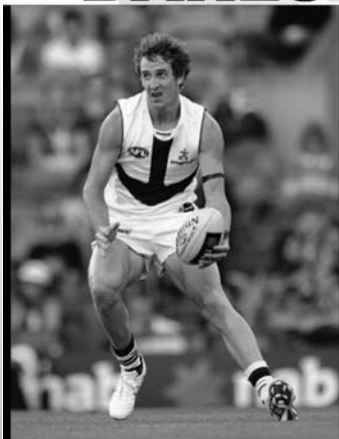

Umpiring Academies In Full Swing

In 2009 an AFL Umpiring Academy was established at MacKillop College in Werribee to support and develop junior umpires in all three disciplines of field, boundary and goal umpiring with the aim to support umpiring in the Western Region Football League. By the end of 2011, with the ongoing support of AFL Victoria, the Western Region Football League and the Western Region Football League Umpires Association, a further two new umpiring academies were established at Caroline Springs and Maribynong, resulting in over 100 junior umpires taking up the challenge of umpiring in the Western Region Football League.

Many junior clubs have experienced these young men and woman officiating in their games over the last three years. Through their great support, coupled with the support of mentor umpires, these junior umpires have been able to develop their skills in umpiring. From a junior perspective, in 2011 most of the junior games had official umpires appointed therefore taking the pressure off club officials and parents, so they could enjoy watching their own sons and daughters play. This program has resulted in the umpiring numbers being significantly increased and the overall quality of umpiring increased with

many umpires moving through the ranks with one officiating in Division One Seniors as a field umpire and several others as boundary umpires. This will support the Western Region Football League in continually developing the overall standard of football to the best in Victoria.

The academies aim at developing the skills required to umpire football. Just like football teams have coaches who develop young footballers, the coaches who develop the young umpires have a wealth of umpiring experience, such as Troy Pannell, a current AFL Umpire Field umpire, working with the Maribynong academy.

Everybody likes to win and with the development of the umpiring academies within the Western Region Football League, it will be football who will be the winner, because if we all work towards improving our skill base then all levels of football will improve. Remember, 'the man in white is always right'. Well, depending on which eye you are watching the game from. So, enjoy our great game and if you want a real challenge, why not try umpiring?

UMPIRES CORNER

Profile: Michael Westgarth

Several weeks ago, seventeen year-old Michael Westgarth was appointed to his first Division One Senior game as a field umpire. He is the first academy umpire to achieve this distinction. Michael has been part of the Werribee Academy that is based at Mackillop College for the last three years.

He began his umpiring career running the boundary at age the age of twelve in the Colac and District Football League. Michael then switched to the WRFL as a boundary umpire before undertaking umpiring field late in the 2010 season through the Werribee Academy. In eight rounds of football, he was in charge of Under 14, Under 16 and Under 18 games. Michael's confidence continued to grow and he learned quickly from his umpiring colleagues. He started the 2011 season in the Under 18 division and has now broken into the senior ranks. Michael's positive performances saw him progress through to the Division One Seniors for the last few rounds. He was also rewarded by officiating in several finals.

Michael's rapid rise in field umpiring can be put down to several reasons but it is obvious that having a solid background in football through his boundary umpiring assisted him greatly. Being exposed to a lot of football and umpiring for the last five seasons has allowed him to personally see what was needed to umpire. Michael shows excellent potential to become a very successful field umpire and should

be proud that he is the first field umpire from the Werribee Academy to officiate at the Division One senior level.

Michael's success certainly highlights the potential and the need for developing young umpires through the academies. It must be noted that three academy boundary umpires are also regularly patrolling the white lines in Division One games. There are another two field umpires from the academies who are currently in Division Two seniors and are showing the same determination, skill and ability that inevitably may lead them into the top grade some time next season.

Another reason why Michael has performed and developed in such a positive way has been the support that he has been given by his dad. Not only is Mark Westgarth the co-ordinator and coach of the Werribee Academy but he is also a former VFL/AFL field umpire. Mark was on the top panel from 1982 until 1996 and umpired 74 games at the highest level of Australian Rules. His experience, his umpiring skills and his wealth of knowledge has assisted not only Michael but all the umpires involved down at Mackillop College. Mark has also been umpiring in the WRFL but is quite happy to sit back and watch his youngest son continue to develop, improve and impress.
