On a cold autumn day at Victoria Park 20 years ago, St.Kilda player Nicky Winmar made the ultimate statement of aboriginal pride when he raised his gurnsey and pointed to the colour of his skin.

Fast forward two decades and the evolution of aboriginal culture and awareness in the greater football community have come tenfold, with the AFL's annual Indigenous Round held this weekend.

From May 24-26, football communities across the country will take time to recognise and pay tribute to our country's Indigenous culture and players that have shaped our great game.

With over 11 per cent of current AFL players coming from an indigenous background, there are more than 90,000 indigenous participants in Australian Football programs including AFL Victoria's new U15 High performance camp, and Kick Start Indigenous program for kids.

Despite its dominance at an AFL level, Indigenous Round also has an importance to people at a grassroots level.

In this week's WRFL Football Record, we too celebrate Indigenous Round with a special feature on Deer Park's Indigenous celebrations held last weekend at John McLeod Oval.

The day was filled with numerous activities including didgeridoo workshops and performances

DEER PARK INDIGENOUS ROUND CELEBRATIONS

The Deer Park Football Club has celebrated Indigenous culture in football by hosting a special 'Indigenous Round' last weekend.

In what the club hopes to be an annual event, Deer Park's Indigenous Round was inspired by the AFL's 'Dreamtime at the G', recognizing indigenous culture at a local level.

Event organiser, Justine Curatolo, had the support of the board of management and Robbie Lynch, the indigenous family violence coordinator for the Northwest region.

"This event was run in partnership with the metro-west family violence regional action group and the point was to create a partnership of benefit both organisations," Justine said.

"The purpose of the event was to bring indigenous culture to the local people."

It is not everyday that you'd hear didgeridoos being played at a local football game, with the spectators fortunate to view a didgeridoo performance on the field during half time.

"We even ran didgeridoo workshops for the kids, and for some of them that was the first time they'd heard one," Justine said.

Justine explained that whilst they wanted this event to be independent of the AFL's indigenous round, they also wanted to complement it.

"We made a conscious decision to celebrate our indigenous round a week ahead of the AFL Dreamtime Round so we wouldn't lose focus or significance."

The event brought together these cultures through football and was well received by all involved at the

club as well as locals, who enjoyed celebrating the indigenous culture in the community.

Deer Park hopes that this will become an annual event and are set to raise the bench mark for next year by having dancers.

Brett Goodes

Draft History: Goodes was selected by the Western Bulldogs with their first round selection in the 2012 AFL Rookie Draft (pick no. 2 overall).

Western Bulldogs Player Bio:

It's probably not accurate to call Brett Goodes a young gun, but if his form in the pre-season is anything to go by, his left of field selection was well justified.

At the ripe old age of 29, Goodes' story is better than good, it's inspiring. While his older brother Adam received the plaudits and the recognition as the game's elite player, Brett just went about his business in the state leagues, forging a terrific career in his own right. He was overlooked time and again, yet giving up was not an option.

Recruited for his hardness, leadership abilities and his rocket left foot, Goodes, at every opportunity over the pre-season, made people stand up and take notice of his actions.

During his first fitness test, he ran alongside Daniel Cross, the fittest player at the club and when he had his kick in the opening NAB Cup game, he executed an impossible kick, splitting three opposition players and finding the chest of a teammate.

Establishing a reputation in the VFL for being an uncompromising, running defender with over 100 games experience in the state league, he brings high level of competitiveness and physical maturity to the Bulldogs' developing group. His tackling



pressure and attack on the contest will be a valuable asset in the back six, after averaging 6.3 clearances and 5.8 tackles this season lining up for Bulldogs VFL affiliate Williamstown.

This year Goodes consolidated his place amongst the state's elite, being named on the half-back flank in the VFL team of the year, representing the indigenous All Stars, as well as playing an influential role in the Seagulls second consecutive finals campaign.

Goodes' value to the team and to his younger teammates is profound-and whether he plays one game or 22 this season, you can bet his professionalism will rub off on the pups coming through.

You spend all that week making a banner, for it to be destroyed in seconds, but it becomes a part of your child's history and the photos and film you so excitedly take will be forever etched in your mind. Once past the 50 games, then it is on to 100 games and the excitement never seems to fail.

But as our sons and daughters grow, the milestones seem to loose priority in the big picture. They become more independent and usually take themselves off to training and games. This leaves Mum and Dad free to either go and watch, or pursue other interests.

Milestones seem to be forgotten now and it takes an inquisitive person to ask his club how many games they have played and also how many their mates have played. Recently the Altona Football Club discovered that some of its players were in the 400 career game range. This prompted a thorough check of how many games certain players had played.

Long time Vikings player, Kevin McDonald has reached an incredible milestone, having played 500 career games. We recently caught up with Kevin and had a quick chat about his thoughts on reaching such a great achievement.

How do you feel about playing 500 games for Altona?

It has been an honour and a privilege to play so many games with such great mates.

Have you always been at Altona FC or have you moved to other clubs throughout your career?

I originally played with Williamstown Juniors and came to Altona in 2001. I have been with Altona ever since and have been through many highs and lows with the Club.

Tell us a little bit about your first game? I first played football I was eight-years-old, playing in the Under 9s. I remember my first game quite well. We were playing against Werribee Juniors at Soldiers Reserve. I played in the Centre and kicked two goals. I was really rapped with my game, especially kicking the goals.

What has been the most memorable moment for you whilst playing football and why?

Being co-captain of our Reserves team last year and going through undefeated to ultimately win the Grand Final. This was so special because I remember well, the many big defeats that we had suffered during the tough times.

Why have you continued to play football into adulthood?

First of all I love the game. I now enjoy the opportunity

to help out the younger players coming into our team. I also enjoy being with my mates playing at the Club.

What has been the most valuable piece of advice your coach has given you over the journey?

“Keep my feet”.

As a junior I got the nickname of ‘Autumn Leaves’ because I fell down so much. This piece of advice has helped me throughout my career.

What are your expectations for the year ahead and for the future?

To keep the playing group focused on our individual and team targets. I would also like everyone to keep enjoying his footy.

What do you plan to do once (if ever) your career ends? Do you plan to keep playing for another 500 games in the future?

My career will end either this year or next. I will then have a break for a couple of years, and then I would like to help out with the coaching of the Reserves team with Freeza.

Do you have any pre-game rituals you do before every game? Or do you have any superstitions playing football?

Every Saturday morning I pick the Quadrella with my Dad.

I also like to get out early by myself to warm up. This helps me focus on the game.

Any other thoughts you would like to share with us?

I have had great support throughout my football career from my Mum and Dad. My Dad has only missed one game out of 500. I really appreciate and would like to thank them for their support.

A masterclass from Steven Pearce was the clear highlight of Round Seven. He kicked 11 goals from full forward in Braybrook's 48-point win over Laverton and was the clear difference-maker. It's been a shame that injuries have cruelled Pearce in recent years, but Saturday's performance served to reaffirm his status as one of the WRFL's premier forwards. His positioning, the timing of his leads, his body work and goalcraft were first class and despite the efforts of Laverton's defence, there was no controlling the veteran as he went on a match-winning scoring rampage. It was a faultless performance, one of the best I've seen whilst covering WRFL footy and he would have added significantly to the haul had he not pulled himself from the ground early in the last quarter to go into early recovery mode.

The 48-point final margin was a little unkind to Laverton, who were brave and certainly had outstanding moments. Little Richard Mulroy was very effective in his role as a crumbing forward, whilst Micka Lindsay won plenty of the ball and was a constructive and dangerous player all afternoon. Ryan Murphy, a tremendously athletic tall, is an exciting prospect and someone to build around. That Dallas Harvey's side is the lowest ranked team in the WRFL at the moment is testament to the strength of the competition and there is certainly some light at the end of the tunnel - and some wins in store for the Magpies in 2013.

The other notable results of the weekend were Sanctuary Lakes' upset win over Caroline Springs - with the Lakers finals aspirations now in serious jeopardy - and Parkside's comfortable victory over Sunshine Heights at Ainsworth Reserve. The top four sides on the ladder look to have roles in the 2013 finals series comfortably in their keeping. The Dragons hold the clear running for the last berth, as Albionvale, Braybrook and the Sharks cling to the top-five periphery.

To Round Eight's matches - and Wyndhamvale can relaunch a claim for a prized top-three position when

it hosts Manor Lakes in what should be a tremendous game of football. In another notable fixture, Braybrook can bolster its finals credentials when it travels to Caroline Springs in what looks to be an early virtual eight-pointer. CLUB LEGEND OF THE WEEK

Alan Tymms from Albion

Alan 'Skinny' Tymms' involvement with the Albion Football Club has spanned over 40 years, taking on a number of key roles.

A local Sunshine boy, 'Skinny' began his long career with the club in 1964, playing in the junior sides.

"I always wore a long sleeve jumper," said Tymms. "My nickname was Skinny, I weighed about 50 kilos and so to speak, I was only a little fella."

The 296-game veteran of the club was involved in a lot of success at Albion throughout his playing days, which concluded in 1986.

"I've played in eight premierships in different age groups and I was fortunate enough to play in five winning ones," said Tymms.


Tymms took on a number of behind the scene roles at the club, including coaching, administrator, secretary and a three year stint as president.

"Our club got relegated in 1993 and they asked me if I'd stand as president in 1994, and fortunately enough we were back up in first division the next year," said Tymms.

'Skinny' has seen a lot of change in his time at the club, including playing at a number of different grounds.

"When I first started it was the old nissen huts, and the old ground at Albion ran north south," said Tymms. "As time went on lights were introduced, I think that was about 1972 and we were one of the first clubs to get them."

"While the ground was being done we moved to Selwyn park, Barclay reserve, played a couple of games there, North Sunshine's old ground they were some of the places we played while the old ground was getting fixed up," said Tymms.

Tymms officially stood down from his roles at the club in 2006 after serving as a committee member and after living in the Sunshine area for over 60 years, made the move to Cairns in 2010.

Tymms was awarded a life membership at the club in 1984, recognising his longstanding commitment with Albion.

Committing yourself to a club for 40 years is a huge effort and for the success he has brought along to the club, Alan 'Skinny' Tymms, is a true club legend.

UMPIRES CORNER

Last Wednesday at Scovell Reserve, Director of Umpiring, Mark Westgarth addressed the umpires group and spoke about the opportunities that often present themselves. He urged all umpires, field, boundary and goal, to be ready to step up if the chance arose. Mark explained that a few of the younger umpires had been promoted in the previous weeks due to good performances on the field and dedication on the training track.

A classic example happened at the Yarraville Oval just last week. The goalies' coach appointed himself to the U18 game to mentor young Frank Tamani, who is a Year 7 student at Manor Lakes College. All trainee goalies develop their skills by umpiring at the same end as an experienced umpire and do more and more umpiring until their confidence and ability develops. The other goal umpire was to be a MacKillop College student in Dean D'Aloia but due to illness, Dean had to pull out of the game at the last minute. As such, Frank was willing to be thrown into the deep end and goal umpire all by himself.

The two field umpires in Terry O'Donnell and Jordan Irwin made sure that they gave Frank all the help that he needed. Luckily the goal umpire for the reserve game in Simon Kingswell arrived early and he stood behind Frank for the first half of the game, assisting Frank when he was a little unsure. As the game progressed, Frank grew in confidence and did the second half without any help whatsoever.

During the game, Frank was kept busy, signalling 16 goals and 7 behinds, whilst his umpire counterpart down the other end only had 6 goals and 8 behinds. Interestingly, no-one in the crowd would have been aware that the young goal umpire who was wearing a 1990 VFA goal umpires' jacket was doing his first game solo. Overall he did a very good job and has earned the right to umpire solo next week. Frank will continue to improve with more games under his belt.

A mention should also be made of the two boundary umpires who also performed at a high level. Luke Tabone and his twin brother, Nathan, ran very well and gave great assistance to the two goal umpires on many occasions. Both are in Year 9 at MacKillop College and are a part of the Werribee Umpiring Academy which is based at their school.




