

JUNIOR INTERLEAGUE CARNIVAL & METROPOLITAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Whilst many of us enjoyed the mid-season break from the regular home and away season, over 200 of the league's best junior players from U12-U16 including the Youth Girls, competed in the 2013 Junior Interleague competition and AFL Victoria Metropolitan Championships.

Commencing on May 29 to June 19, the Junior Interleague competition saw our U16, U13 and U12 squads compete against the likes of Riddell District Football League and the Essendon District Football League.

Having gone down by 22-points in their first game against RDFL, our U16 squad will look to improve on their results when they play the EDFL on June 11 at Avalon Airport Oval.

James Beilby, William Baird and Isaac Covo were amongst our best U16 players, with majors from Jaye Aburrow and Hamza Abdo handy against the RDFL outfit.

In two nail biting matches, our U13 squad went down by less than a kick in their first two matches of the interleague tournament.

In a low scoring affair against the EDFL, our U13 squad showed some flair in game one, with accuracy in front of goal keeping the team in the match. Despite their efforts, our U13's went down

by two-points at the final siren-the margin 6.3.39 to the EDFL's 5.11.41.

Game two against Riddell also saw a close scoring match, with the scores neck and neck all day, before our U13's suffered another heartbreaking loss, going down by three points- 6.5.41 to the 6.8.44.

The U13's will play their final match against the EDFL next week, at 6:30pm at Dempster Park on June 19.

Our U12 squad had much more success in their first two matches of the competition, first winning by a convincing 40-point margin against the EDFL. The final score 10.10.70 to the EDFL's 5.0.30.

The U12's dominance continued in their second game belting RDFL to the tune of 91 points, winning the perpetual shield on offer for competition between the three leagues.

Archi Manton and Joshua Kellet had best on field performances for the U12 squad, with multiple goals from Jake Moretti, Karan Bharathi, Oliver Libertore and Cooper Craig-Peters.

The U12's are set to play their final match against the EDFL on Wednesday June 12 at 6:30pm at Dempster Park.

During late May and early June our U14, U15 and combined WRFL/EDFL Youth Girl squad have

been competing in the AFL Victoria Metropolitan Championships, with the majority of their matches over the Queen's Birthday weekend.

Improving from their early loss to the EFL in game one, our U15A squad came home with the chocolates running away 37-point winners against the RDFL. Harrison Rocke was named best afield for the side, with Matthew Knezevic and Joel Ives handy contributors for the team.

In what can only be described as a white wash, our U15B side stamped their dominance on the competition early, with a 115-point win over Riddell Football League.

With a 62-point lead at half time, our U15's powered home with Jackson Fullerton kicking five goals and Christopher Dal Sasso's three goals, topping off an extravagant win.

Our U14 Division One and U14 Division Two squads also finished with one win and two losses apiece.

Despite going down to the EFL in their first match, the U14A side came back all guns blazing with a 62-point win over Riddell. Lachlan Fogarty, Joshua Mould and Jayme Gilmore were amongst the team's best.

The U14B side started the competition on fire, comprehensively beating Riddell 14.14.98 to 5.2.32 before losing the next two matches against the Eastern Football League and Yarra Junior Football League.

Stephan Syme was dominant in the U14's game one win, with two majors, whilst Will Markovski, Jacob Smith, Ben Croft and Toby Kopa also booted multiple goals.

Our combined WRFL/EDFL Youth Girls squad, after experiencing some teething problems early in their training program, competed hard in all matches.

The team's only win came in match two against the Northern Football League 8.9.57 to 6.3.39. Brooke Eley and Caitlyn Balshaw were named in the squad's best, with Kacie Cook displaying stellar form, kicking four goals in the 18-point victory.

WRFL Football Operations and Club Development Officer, Tim Shellcot was pleased with how all our teams handled themselves throughout the course of the competitions.

“It was great to see all players across all squads represent the League with distinction, and the level of talent in the younger age groups is particularly pleasing.

“Thanks to the coaches, support staff and parents who gave up their time over the past few weeks to provide our best junior players with the opportunity to play representative football. Thanks also go to the WRFL clubs who provided facilities for training and who hosted matches.”

GLENORDEN UNITE TO FIGHT CANCER

Cancer. A word which pulls at the heartstrings of many Australians as it can and does, affect many people of all ages.

Despite a 30 percent improvement in survival rates over the last two decades, one in three men and one in four women, will directly be affected by cancer before the age of 75.

With more than 108,000 new cases of cancer being diagnosed in 2013 alone, the Glenorden Football Club has decided to get behind the Cancer Council and support it's Call to Arms campaign this weekend.

Swapping their traditional brown and yellow stripes for a daffodil inspired yellow and white jumper in their Round Nine clash against Caroline Springs, Glenorden is the first local football club to have changed their guernsey during a home and away season to support the Cancer Council.

“The idea began as something small we could try to do and the more we talked, the bigger the ideas got and we started designing jumpers and researched into ways we could make a difference,” Club Vice-President Louis Elevato said.

Originally planning the idea late last year, Elevato and Vice Captain, Tristan Angelini wanted to use their resources as a club to help support the Cancer Council’s ‘Call to Arms’ cause.

“As a club, a few of us had spoken about being able to do something to support a cause that meant a lot to our club and community,” Elevato said.

“We all had reasons for wanting to support the Cancer Council and as it was something close to our hearts personally for many of us.”

Touched by the disease in 2012 with former club president Graeme Davis passing away from cancer late last year, the club was again affected by the disease with the news of current President Ken Parker’s son also being treated for cancer.

“Kenny does so much for the club so it was our turn to do something in return to show our support for him and his family,” Elevato said.

Whilst the disease has affected many at the club, one good story to come out of it was to see the return of a reserves player who was diagnosed with cancer a few years ago. Having overcome the disease and currently in remission, he has played every game in the reserves side in season 2013 and is going from strength to strength.

“It’s great to see him back fit and healthy and playing football again,” Elevato said.

With a handful of people knowing about his illness, the reserves player will stand up in front of his club on Thursday night after training and explain to the team of

his battle, in the lead up to the Call to Arms day.

The Call to Arms event will see every Glenorden player wear the new daffodil strip, with players from both teams wearing yellow arm bands in support of the cause.

“Everyone’s

really gotten behind the initiative, with every Glenorden player buying their own jumper out of their own pockets, with the money raised from each sale going to the Cancer Council,” Elevato said.

“Caroline Springs have also been fantastic, as they have kindly decided to wear their black home guernsey on the day, so our new jumpers won’t clash.”

With the aim of raising \$2,500 for the cause, players will be walking around with rattle tins from 9am during the Under 18s match, until the half-time break of the senior’s game, with a match day raffle and auction also contributing to help reach their goal.

A donation station will be set up at the club for those wishing to make larger contributions, as well as a jumping castle for the kids which will cost a gold coin donation.

Cancer survivor and club sponsor, Anthony Taylor will have the honour of flipping the coin on the day, with the hope that his story will give inspire others.

“We have been asking anyone in the community who has been affected by cancer or who knows someone who has been, to come down on the day and wear something yellow to support the cause.

“We’re not asking people to support the club or football for that matter, but to support us and what we are standing for.”






"It was a really great night to be able to relax over a nice dinner and wine with your friends and I'd recommend it to everyone," McLeod said.

Last weekend when the local football community had a break from the usual home and away fixture, there were still games being played across the western region. Whilst many players and umpires took time out over the long weekend to see an AFL match or just do something different on a Saturday afternoon, the U14 and U15 Metropolitan Championship was held on Saturday June 8 and Monday June 10.

Added to this round robin tournament was a series of interleague games for the Under 12, Under 13, Under 16 and Youth Girls divisions. Seen as a step up from the normal home and away fixture, the majority of these games were played over the long weekend and on certain evenings throughout June. They are joined by Anthony Laughton, Jake Bokhove and Jackson Carroll. The majority of these umpires are aged between 15 to 17 years old and although there is one that is the old man of the group being 21-years of age, it is great to see the passion for umpiring develop at a young age.

This is a tremendous opportunity for these young field umpires to umpire at a new level and have the chance to experience the excitement and prestige of officiating


