NEVER TOO OLD TO PLAY

There's no such thing as retirement for a wave of footballers who are continuing to take to the field well into their 40s.

There's a few more grey hairs than they used to be.

Those silky smooth handballs are slightly off target.

The kicks are not as long, or as penetrating.

But don't be fooled. This is Masters Football, and it's just as competitive as any junior grade of the game.

The concept is a simple one: to provide players over the age of 35, an opportunity to keep taking to the field.

It's expanded from humble beginnings in Victoria in 1980, to become a nationally overseen game.

Of the more 119 teams playing throughout Australia, it's here in the western suburbs where the game is particularly strong.

Just ask Mark Batten, who is the current playing coach at Williamstown Superules.

"I have been involved for 11 years, I am currently the coach and player for Williamstown Superules Reserves and also coach and play for the Over 45's Victorian Superules Side," he said.

But it doesn't end there.

Williamstown is in the Premier League fielding four sides – Over 35's, reserves, Over 47's & Over 52's, while Werribee have three Sides in Division Two – Over 35's, Reserves & Over 47's.

"I believe the Sunshine Kangaroos have an over 35's side in Division Two," said Batten.

For those who are not familiar with Masters Football, there are four levels including:

- SUPERULES: Aussie Rules Footy for Over-35s
- MASTERS: Aussie Rules Footy for Over 40s (Except in certain circumstances)
- LEGENDS: Aussie Rules Footy for Over 47s
- VETERANS: Aussie Rules Footy for Over 52s

Across the Victorian Metropolitan area, there are 37 teams that lace up the boots and run out to play every fortnight, with most playing in the Over 35s category.

And it seems this ever growing sport has expanded interstate, with the very best teams set to travel to Darwin later this month, for the National Carnival,

held between September 29 and October 5.

It all comes under a new national body, AFL Masters, which administers a set of standardized rules throughout the country, to reduce the risk of injury to the players' ageing bodies.

Not that the threat of injury concerns the participants.

"The main reason people who love the game can still play with people in their own age group in a safe and friendly environment," Batten said.

"(It) also allows a person to maintain a healthy life style."

The WRFL's Glen Orden Football Club is also involved in Masters Football, with the league's only Over 47s team.

Coach Ago Guradiano has been involved with the club for 15 years, and loves nothing more than getting down and playing footy with the boys.

"I am the oldest at 58 years young," Guradiano said with a smile.

The Hawks' team started seven years ago and currently has 24 players on the list.

Not only a coach, but also a player, Ago sees plenty of positives to come out of the game for older men.

"I love footy and it keeps you active. Socially you get to make a lot of new friends and it keeps you in touch with old mates."

AFFILIATE REPORT-WESTERN JETS CHARGE INTO THE FINALS

The Western Jets are set to tackle the Calder Cannons this Sunday in Week two of the Under 18s TAC Cup finals series after defeating the Murray Bushrangers by nine points in a cut throat Elimination Final last weekend.

Whilst trailing the Bushrangers for most of the day, the Jets hard work and persistence shone through in the last term, kicking two goals in the last five minutes of play to seal the win.

“Overall the year’s been a great success and it’s not finished yet as we still have more finals to play,” said Western Jets Under 18 TAC Cup squad coach, Torin Baker.

“We’ve won more games than we’ve lost this year and we’ve had a season where in every game bar one, we’ve been within a winning chance.”

Finals preparations is well underway with Baker ensuring that his team is in the best possible shape they can be both on and off the field, devising plans against each potential opponent to help secure a win.

Before entering the world of coaching, Baker played a number of games for the Spotswood Football Club including one game this year and was a vital member in the club’s past two Grand Finals appearances.

“I’m 34 years old now, and whilst I loved playing football, I started to really enjoy the other side of football coaching on the sidelines after dipping my toe in the role as an assistant coach at the Jets for two years before taking up the role of the under 18s head coach,” Baker said.

Whilst he still gets down to watch his old Spotswood teammates play a few games during the season, his affiliation with the club doesn’t affect his decisions when selecting his team each week.

“Our players play on their merits, it doesn’t matter what club they come from. We just want the best quality football to come through the door.”



Although the players who represent the Western Jets are standouts in their own right, many players have their roots at a number of WRFL clubs. Baker praised the efforts of Mitch Norton, the team’s leading goal kicker (29 goals for the season), who hails from Hoppers Crossing and Connor Menadue from Spotswood.

“As a coach one of the most important things is building positive relationships with your players.”

After six years of coaching, Baker reveals that the two most important parts of the role is getting to know the players on a personal level and assisting them with their football so that they can grow and improve throughout the season.

Baker’s main goals for the season were for the team to be competitive, as well as players enjoying individual success through performing well in national championships.

Finishing the home and away season in fifth position, it appears the Jets’ next match against the Cannons will continue to be an arm wrestle, with the Cannons finishing the season in fourth place.

Despite beating the Cannons by two points in Round Three earlier in the home and away season, their last encounter saw the Cannons get over the line by a single one point, which makes way for a close Semi Final this weekend.

They recruit well, but they also reward their juniors who are blooded into a team environment second to none in suburban football. Spotswood again showed the class, poise and determination last Saturday that wins big games. In the heat they never relented even when they were behind on the scoreboard. Chris Stewart is a major factor and if he can win the ruck and swing forward for a few goals, he will have done more than his fair share to get the Lions home.

I always look for the X factor from a player or players that can do something to give their side the advantage and get them over the line.

For Sunshine for me, it is Macauley Goring and Patrick Wiggins. If they are on top early it seems to lift the entire side. You expect Hahn and Douglas to lead the way but Goring and Wiggins are the icing on the cake.

Deer Park are a good side who seem to be saving their worst performances for the business end of the season. Their X factors for me are not players, but their hunger, desire and commitment to the cause.

There is no tomorrow for one team and for me that team is: Sunshine.



UMPIRES CORNER

By Graeme Hodgart

During the finals at Avalon Oval, the elevated coaches' boxes on the grandstand side of the ground become the favourite haunt of the various WRFL umpiring coaches. A commanding view of the entire oval is on offer which can be readily complemented by a strong pair of binoculars.

Of course, there are those coaches who like being closer to the play and prefer to be somewhere on the fence rather than being perched five metres about the general crowd. Out on the sidelines, there is the opportunity to hear the verbal communications offered by some of the running umpires to their compatriots or to the bemused players. Most of the goal umpires' observers prefer to be close to one of the goals which means that they are able to see the exact positioning taken up for each shot on goal. The field umpiring observers and the boundary umpiring observers generally prefer the view from the coaches' boxes as it gives an overall view of the whole ground. The positioning of each umpire can be quickly assessed in relation to the set of the play but also in regards to the position of the other umpires.

Listening to the comments and views of the relevant coaches is quite an experience. And experience is something that the coaching panel has plenty of. Sitting in the small room viewing the various finals' games were Mark Westgarth, Brett Carter, Mark Mather and Rene Van Kuyk (field umpiring), Leigh Rowbottom (boundary) and Graeme Hodgart (goal umpiring). Altogether they boast over one hundred years of experience of field, boundary and goal umpiring in different football leagues throughout Victoria. Their remarks on this particular day covered fitness, uniforms, development of skills and abilities over the season, attitude, training, concentration, future prospects and many references to positioning and decision-making.

There was another person in the room with an even greater knowledge and experience in regards to field umpiring. It was Bill Torney who has been involved in umpiring since the 1960s. Some of the old timers will remember his name being printed in the VFA

Recorder way back in the early 1970s. It was on Saturday 27th June 1970 that field umpire W.Torney was in charge of the VFA Camberwell v Werribee game that was televised by Channel 0. Camberwell went on to win 11-9 to 9-16. These days, Bill Torney, spends his weekends in the football season travelling around metropolitan Melbourne and beyond, observing and providing feedback and advice to young aspiring field umpires who are interested in taking the next step into the ranks of the VFL.




